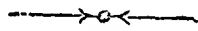
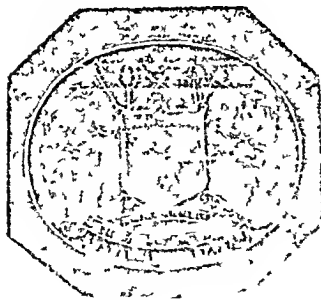

ADMINISTRATION REPORT OF THE

KUSHALGARH CHIEFSHIP FOR THE YEAR 1929--30.

CHAPTER I.

GENERAL AND POLITICAL.

1. Boundary—Kushalgarh Chiefship is situated in the Southern-most limits of Rajputana between 23 degrees 4 minutes and 23 degrees 20 minutes North Latitude, and 74 degrees 17 minutes and 74 degrees 74 minutes East Longitude. It is a hilly Chiefship bounded on the North by Banswara, Ratlam and Sailana States, on the East by Ratlam and Jhabua States, on the South by Jhabua and Indore States and on the West by the Panch Mahals District of the Bombay Presidency.

2 Area, Population and Revenue:—The area of the Chiefship approximately amounts to 340 square miles. Its population according to the Census of 1921 is 29162 and the gross revenue calculated on the average of last five years is Rs. 1,63,397.

3. The Chief and the Raj Family—Shriman Raoji Saheb Shree Ranjitsinghji is the present Chief, i. e., ruler of the Chiefship, who succeeded his father, Shriman Raoji Sahib Shree Udaisinghji on the 17th January 1916, and is in the 49th year of his age. The Chief's family belongs to Ramsingot Mertia branch of the Rathor Rajput clan of Jodhpur (Marwar) and has been in possession of the Chiefship for the last 12 generations, since Akherajji, the founder, who is said to have conquered the territory in Samwat year 1711 (A. D. 1654) and subsequently founded the town of Kushalgarh in memory of a Bhil Chieftain named Kushla, whom Akherajji is said to have killed. The family is connected by marriage ties to Bansi (Mewar), Kadana (Gujrat), Badisadri (Mewar), Kundla (Jhalawar) and Khajurgron (U. P.),

2. Rajkunwar Sahib Brijbiharisinghji, the heir apparent, is in his 26th year, who is learning administration work here.

3. The second Kunwar Sahib Bharatsinghji is in his 8th year, Bhamarlalji Sahib Harendrakumarsinghji alias Himmatsinghji is in his 7th year, third Kunwar Sahib Udainarayansinghji is in his 6th year and the fourth Kunwar Sahib Ramchandrasinghji is in his third year. The Shriman was blessed with the fifth Kunwar Sahib Dabicharansinghji during the year.

4. There are seven jagirdars in the Chiefship, viz., of Tambesra, Churabar, Mokampura, Chhotisarwa, Ruggarh, Gopalpura and Ranjitgarh, who are provided with Jagirs for their maintenance on conditions of feudal service, they all being descendants of the Chief's family.

5. **Principal Events**--Lt. Colonel D. M. Field, I. A. Political Agent, Southern Rajputana States, visited Kushalgarh in the month of December 1929, and Shriman Raoji Sahib paid visit to him at Udaipur in the month of March 1930.

CHAPTER II.

Revenue and Finance.

The Chiefship is divided into three Tehsils for revenue purposes viz.,

- I. Tehsil Maiyad or Sadar Tehsil.
- II. Tehsil Dungra comprising Parganas of Dungra and Himmatgarh.
- III. Tehsil Patan comprising Parganas of Patan and Ranga.

The total number of villages is 310 out of these 204 villages are in Khalsa and the rest are in Jagir and Muafi. The actual recovery of the land revenue of the Khalsa villages amounted to Rs. 31902/- against Rs. 34413/- in the previous year.

CHAPTER III.

Legislation--In all cases, Civil and Criminal, justice is administered according to laws in force in British India with such modifications as are necessary to meet local requirements, circular orders and notifications being issued from time to time to that effect. Appendix II shows the laws and regulations that remained in force in the Chiefship during the year.

Military Force--No military force is maintained in this Chiefship.

Police--The police strength stood at 95 and in addition to this a small force is stationed in and maintained at the expenses of the jagirdars of Tambesra Churabar, Mokampura and Chhotisarwa, the strength of which is about a dozen. Thus on the whole there is one police man for every three square miles and 273 inhabitants of the whole Chiefship. The actual cost of the Police establishment came to Rs. 10,791— against Rs. 10,741—of last year.

Criminal Justice--Criminal justice was administered by the following courts and by certain Jagirdars who exercise specially, limited powers of a Third Class Magistrate in only those cases in which the parties were the Ryots of their jagirs and the offences were of trivial nature.

- (1) The court of Mahekma Khas which tries sessions and such other cases that a First Class Magistrate is not competent to try and exercises appellate and revisional jurisdiction in cases dealt with by all other courts in the Chiefship.
- (2) The Court of the First Class Magistrate.
- (3) The Courts of the Tehsildars of Dungra and Patan who are invested with powers of a Third Class Magistrate.

Appendices VII, VIII and IX show the number of crimes committed and the sentences awarded by the various courts.

Civil Justice--The work was carried out by the following courts of the Chiefship besides certain jagirdars, who hear Civil suits up to the value of Rs. 100/-

- (1) Mahekma Khas which exercises appellate and revisional powers.
- (2) Civil Judge, who is also the 1st Class Magistrate, hear civil suits of all kinds and values of the Maiyad or Sadar Tehsil and such others, as the Tehsildars of Dungra and Patan are not competent to hear.
- (3) The Tehsils of Dungra and Patan which are invested with powers to hear civil suits of the value not exceeding Rs. 100/-

The details of work are given in appendices X, XI and XII.

Extradition--During this year the Chiefship surrendered ^{two} three accused to Jhabua, while the Chiefship received six accused from Jhabua.

Prison:—There is one Central Jail at Kushalgarh which is provided with suitable separate quarters for male and female prisoners. During the period under report 113 persons were confined in the Kushalgarh Central Jail and their daily average came to 23.

Registration:—In this year 20 documents were registered against 18 in last year and the value of property registered amounted to Rs. 8817/- against 5350/ in the last year.

Municipality:—The income is derived from import duties of customs and from miscellaneous taxes of easements, etc. The income for the year amounted to Rs. 2391/- against Rs. 2990/- in the last year. The conservancy and street lighting work was done satisfactorily.

CHAPTER IV.

Weather & Crop:—There was 53 inches and 37 cents of rainfall in this year. Kharif crops have been harvested eight annas in the rupee, while Rabi crops are expected more than cent per cent in the rupee.

The details of rainfall and prices of different commodities are given in appendices XVII and XVIII respectively.

Excise.—The excise work is carried on according to the Madras system. There were 34 shops during this year and the income amounted to Rs. 49078/- against Rs. 55217/- in the previous year.

The sale of opium, Ganja and Bhang is conducted under the state monopoly system, the proceeds of which amounted to Rs. 7438/-.

Agricultural Stock—The details of agricultural stock are given in appendix XX.

Forest—The income under this head came to Rs 8613/- against Rs. 9796/- of last year.

Customs—There are 10 Nakas and the income from this source amounted to Rs. 24480/- against Rs. 31153/- in last year.

Public Works—The total expenditure in this department came to Rs. 6860 against Rs. 10103 of last year. The work of construction of the Biscoe Tank could not be carried on this year owing to scarcity of water.

Foundation was laid for Hospital and Kushalgarh Udaigarh Road Bridge by Lt. Col. D. M. Field, I. A., Political Agent, Southern Rajputana States in the month of December 1929.

Post & Telegraph Office—The work of post and telegraph office was satisfactory. The Chiefship had to pay Rs. 368/- for working and maintenance of the telegraph line to and office at Kushalgarh for the year 1929--30.

Mint—No coins were minted in Kushalgarh.

CHAPTER V.

The receipts and expenditure including both ordinary and extra-ordinary amounted to Rs. 1, 76, 184/- and Rs. 1, 19, 184/- as compared with Rs. 1, 76, 313/- and Rs. 1, 24, 248/- of the last year.

CHAPTER VI.

Dispensary—8863 out-door and 10 in-door patients were treated in the Kushalgarh Dispensary in this year and the total expenditure under this head amounted to Rs. 4011/- against Rs. 3847/- of the previous year. Work of Dispensary during the year was satisfactory, due to the increase of expenses during last year for sufficient staff etc.

Vaccination—1036 Children ^{were} ~~work~~ vaccinated during this year.

Births & Deaths:—The figures of births and deaths are given in appendix XXIV.

CHAPTER VII.

The number of students on roll in the Colvin Middle School, Kushalgarh, at the end of the year, remained 196 against 200 in last year, while the average number of attendance has been 161. Its work was satisfactory during the year. Work of the girl school was also satisfactory and the roll number of girls was 43 and their daily average came to 30. There were four village schools with a total of 50 boys on roll and an attendance of 44. The total expenditure on education came to Rs. 4068/- against Rs. 3748/- of last year.

CHAPTER VIII.

Treasure Trove:—No treasure trove was found in this year.

Mines:—No lease was given for any minerals.

Shri Satya Narayan Bank.—The work of the bank, which is opened for the convenience of the public and cultivators, was satisfactory during the year.
