Organisation

In future Districts and Brigades will in the first place deal with all applications for vocational training direct.

Headquarters Districts and Brigades will continue to be responsible for the organisation and administration of vocational training for the units under their control and will wherever possible, place men for training locally

Districts and Brigades will forward those applications with which they are unable to deal to Command Headquarters giving full particulars with each application as under:—

- (a) Educational Qualifications.
- (b) Previous experience in trade if any giving name of firm and period of employment.
- (c) Training desired
- (d) Age and date of transfer to reserve.

These applications should reach Command Headquarters 3 months before the date upon which it is desired that training should commence.

The Vocational Training Officer will arrange training for those men who cannot be placed by Districts and Brigades, and will co-ordinate the work throughout the Command

Courses

In future Vocational Training courses will be arranged to commence on the first day of each month.

Courses of training should as far as possible be arranged to allow men to remain under training until within two or three weeks of embarkation.

Courses will be limited to six months but in exceptional cases men may be allowed to extend their course to a period of eight months.

Procedure

Districts and Brigades will forward to Command Headquarters on the 1st March, 1st June, 1st September and 1st December the following return —

- (1) Nominal roll of all N O Os and men being trained
 - (a) locally
 - (b) outside the area, giving name of firm and trade
- (2) Nominal roll of N O Os and men who have applied for training but have not been placed

The date of transfer to the reserve or discharge should be given in every case

Selection of candidates.

In making the selection of candidates for training the following will be considered as essential qualifications:—

- (1) The possession of a 1st or 2nd Class Certificate of Education except in the case of men who have had at least two years experience of the trade in which training is desired.
- (2) Certificate of good character from the applicant's Commanding Officer
- (3) Certificate from the candidate that he is willing to pay the training fees (and incidental expenses connected with the training) as laid down

Candidates will also certify that they are serious in their intention of taking up the trade in which they wish training.

Soldiers drawing tradesman's rate of pay will not be permitted to attend courses of Vocational Training in India

The proceedings of such courts must leave no room for doubt or ambiguity

3 In the case of individuals who are injured on duty details of the particular duty must be stated. Similarly in the case of injuries sustained in organised games particulars must be given as to what military authority organized the game in order to distinguish between voluntary and officially organized games.

4 Courts of Inquiry must be held at the earliest possible opportunity after injuries have been sustained.

3. The necessity for the greatest economy possible in the management of these services consistent with the health of the troops and standard of efficiency, cannot be too strongly emphasised. It is requested, therefore, that the General Officer Commanding in-Chief

and District Commanders in consultation with their Controllers of Military Accounts, give this matter their closest attention. All measures which may result in economies should be fully explored and exploited, while increases in expenditure must be completely justified.

- (b) If passed the Officer Commanding should then cause a Veterinary History Sheet to be prepared from the description given on the certificate and forward this to the Officer Commanding, Veterinary Hospital for an entry of mallein test and retention.
- (c) At the same time application will be made to D H Q for the publication of a District Order giving the name of the officer and full description of the charger in question which must tally with that given in the certificate and Veterinary History Sheet, as authority for registration.

On publication of the above the horse will immediately be placed on the register of chargers

- (d) In the case of Staff Departments and Station Staff the A, A & Q M. G., Senior Departmental Officer and O C., Station respectively will be regarded as Commanding Officer,

- (e) When it is desired to have a horse examined with a view to registration at outstations where there is no Veterinary Officer application will be made to the D A D V S who will arrange for an early veterinary examination. The question of speeding up Signal Messages in the Field has been under consideration. Army Headquarters intimate that instructions will shortly be issued whereby Moving Station Procedure will invariably be adopted for use in India in front of Brigade Headquarters.

2 Delay in transmission of Signal Messages often occurs through misuse of the Signal Register A F B-2604 issued under India Army Order No 107/II of 1927. This form supersedes I A F X 1871, vide Amendment to Regulations Books and Forms dated 1st March 1927.

3 Registration of Signal Messages is necessary for two purposes only —

- (a) To ensure that all Signal Messages handed in for despatch are duly dealt with
- (b) To afford a means whereby the General Staff or Unit Commanders requirements can be met in so far as the subsequent tracing of any message is concerned

Only such details as are essential for these two purposes should be entered in the Signal Register.

4 The form used for this register is a standard one to cover all requirements and it seems that in certain instances the use of this form has led to the belief that all the columns in the form must invariably be filled in full.

This has never been intended, and only essential information should be entered.

It should seldom be necessary for instance, in advance of Brigade Headquarters to complete the columns for 'Time of receipt.'

In the case of a message from a Company where urgency is of paramount importance, the columns in giving the call and system could normally be omitted at the Signal Office of a Battalion Headquarters till such time as the message has been acknowledged by the addressee.

In the case of a message from Brigade this same column could often be omitted.

By the above much time can be saved at the Battalion Office.

5 Signallers using the Signal Register must be trained in its use, and must be accustomed to use their intelligence and discretion in entering any details, so as to avoid, thereby, any unnecessary delay in dealing with actual messages.

Sufficient attention to the training of Signallers in this respect has not hitherto been paid by most units

6 It is furthermore pointed out that repeated queries regarding delays in Signal Messages are apt to defeat the object of such queries, since it induces in the Signal personnel a tendency to make unnecessary full entries in the register in order to ensure their ability to trace any message with ease and rapidity

7 Signal Officers of all arms will pay particular attention to this matter during the coming individual training season

General Notes.

4 When a Unit is not in a position to await the formal Inspection Report from the O. C. M. A. and requires advance replacements or repair of any item of Equipment, the countersignature of the Inspecting Officer (i. e. O. C. M. A., O. M. E., or I. O. O.) on the Indent, Disposal Order or Workshop Sheet is sufficient authority for advance action (Vide E. R. I. Part I, 1927 para 80).

5 Items of equipment (technical or otherwise) returned for repair and found in Arsenal to be beyond Arsenal repair are replaced immediately on an "Issue Order" prepared in the Arsenal *without indent* from the Unit.

6 If the O. C. M. A. in his inspection report merely recommends the replacement of a large number of rifles or Machine Guns for various reasons or complete rearmament, the orders of the Director of Artillery Army Headquarters should be awaited. Meanwhile all other action as noted in the foregoing should be put in hand.

Each application will be accompanied by the passage application (India Army Form T 1727 in duplicate) on which the date or approximate date by which the passage is required should be stated. In the case of men proceeding to Canada, the additional certificate required by paragraph 3 of India Army Order No. 623 of 1927 will also be attached.

(b) His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief's permission will be conveyed direct to the Brigade Commander and necessary instructions will be issued by Army Headquarters direct to the Embarkation Commandant concerned for the allotment of passages.

3 Applications will not be submitted by the Brigade Commanders to Army Headquarters earlier than three months before men are normally due for discharge or transfer to the Army Reserve. This decision does not affect the procedure to be followed in the case of men discharged or transferred to the Army Reserve in India with a view to taking up employment in India. In their cases, especially where employment cannot be held open it may be necessary to apply for His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief's permission more than six months before they are normally due for discharge or transfer to the Army Reserve—vide paragraph 362 (ii) (b) and 363 (ix) (b), King's Regulations 1923
