IMPORTANT INFORMATION.

Information Bureau.

The Information Bureau is on the ground floor of the Congress buildings, on the left hand side of the entrance.

The Bureau will be open on Saturday, December 3rd, and Sunday, December 4th, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. for the registration of members, the distribution of membership cards and badges and the selection of excursions.

During the Scientific Sessions, December 5th to 11th, the Bureau will be open daily from 9-30 a.m. to 4-30 p.m.

Post and Telegraph Offices are installed at the Bureau.

A representative of Thomas Cook & Son, Ltd., will also attend at the Bureau for the convenience of members.

Opening Ceremony.

The opening ceremony of the Congress will be held on Monday, December 5th, at 10 a.m. in the Senate House, Calcutta University.

Scientific Sessions.

The Scientific Sessions will be held in the Medical College buildings, near the University.

Expenses during sessions in Calcutta.

The Congress management will meet all the ordinary hotel expenses of the official Government delegates of foreign countries and their wives.

All other delegates and members will be asked to meet their own expenses, unless private hospitality is provided for them. It is hoped that all foreign members will be accommodated without expense to themselves during the sessions in Calcutta.

Transport in Calcutta.

A green flag with a white triangle and the letters F. E. A. T. M. will be found attached to cars set aside for the exclusive use of members. Members requiring transport to attend or return from the Congress meetings etc., should consult the Information Bureau regarding the arrangements made for this purpose.

Excursions in Calcutta.

Members desiring to join the excursions (see page 9) should give their names and requirements to the Information Bureau as soon as possible.

Dress.

At His Excellency the Governor's reception at Government House to the official Government delegates and members on the evening of December 5th, and at the Congress dinner on December 10th, at which His Excellency the Governor will preside, mess dress will be worn by all officers in India entitled to do so. Others will wear evening dress with decorations. Ordinary dress will be worn at all other functions.

Tours. December 11th to December 24th.

Members desirous of going on the tours after the Scientific Sessions should give their names into the Information Bureau as soon as possible. For details and arrangements in connection with the tours see page 13.

Members' arrangements after the tours. Bombay.

The Northern and Southern tours meet in Bombay on December 20th. Those members who desire to leave the tours at Bombay, either to embark for Europe or to undertake further tours in India, are requested to inform the General Organising Secretary at the Information Bureau as early as possible.

Little or no accommodation is available in Bombay after December 22nd. All members, with the exception of those who are sailing for Europe, for whom accommodation will be found, will therefore have to leave Bombay on that date.

Calcutta.

Members returning to Calcutta are requested to arrange for their own hotel accommodation until the departure of their steamers. They are advised that hotel accommodation in Calcutta is exceedingly difficult, if not impossible, to obtain during the Christmas vacation without previous arrangement. *The Manager, Grand Hotel, has kindly agreed to reserve accommodation for such members, if they intimate their wishes to him while the Congress is sitting in Calcutta.*

Return passages.

Foreign delegates and members who have not already booked their return passages from India should do so at the earliest possible date, as berths are most difficult to obtain at this time.

Those who join the Northern and Southern tours may find it more convenient to leave India from Colombo or Madras. There are many good steamer connections from Colombo and a fortnightly sailing by the British India line from Madras to Singapore via Penang.

Meeting of Scientific Sections.

A separate programme giving the details of the meetings of the Scientific Sections and the times of the discussions will be issued at the beginning of the Congress. Abstracts of the scientific papers to be read at the Congress will also be issued at the same time. Members are requested to obtain these from the Information Bureau.

Exhibitions.

An exhibition has been arranged in connection with the Congress. It consists of two sections, Scientific and Commercial.

The Scientific Section is situated in the School of Tropical Medicine and adjoining buildings (see plan of Congress buildings) and will be open to members from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

The Commercial Section is housed in the Anatomy Department (see plan of Congress buildings) and will be open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Catalogues of both exhibitions will be available at the door and at the Information Bureau on application.

Guide Books.

Guide books to India will be on sale at Messrs. Thacker Spink's stall in the Commercial Section. Messrs. Thacker, Spink & Co. also issue a weekly guide to Calcutta which contains much useful information. Members may obtain this free of charge on application.

Souvenir to the Seventh Congress.

A book entitled a "Souvenir to the Seventh Congress" dealing with various aspects of our Indian Empire has been specially compiled for the members of the Congress and will be available on application at the Information Bureau.

EXCURSIONS IN CALCUTTA.

The Scientific Sessions of the Congress will take up much of our visitors' time, and leisure for ordinary sightseeing will probably be small. As the commercial capital of India and the chief city in which the English administration in India was securely based, there are

in Calcutta many buildings and institutions and places full of historical and architectural interest. With these, however, we have not space to deal, but would refer our visitors to the guide books which give excellent descriptions.

CALCUTTA AS A CENTRE FOR THE STUDY OF TROPICAL MEDICINE.

To medical visitors Calcutta presents features of unusual interest. The moist places of Bengal teem with life from the highest form to the lowest. There is scarcely a tropical disease, with the exceptions of sleeping sickness and yellow fever, which cannot be amply demonstrated here. For the study and teaching of tropical diseases and tropical sanitation, it has advantages probably unrivalled anywhere. Calcutta has been the seat of medical teaching since medicine became a science. The *Calcutta Medical College* is one of the oldest of modern medical teaching institutions and it says much for the prescience and farsightedness of the East India Company's medical officers that it was the first college where all the three main branches of medicine—medicine, surgery and midwifery—were taught systematically and clinically under one roof. Originally intended as a training ground for the medical officers of the Company, it has developed into a first class teaching college, where students proceed to the M.B. degree. The Carmichael Medical College is a more modern institution administered and managed by Indians not in Government Service. It provides medical teaching of a high order. The *Campbell Medical School* is also an old one and caters for those who proceed to the lesser qualification of L. M. F. Other schools of a similar nature are springing up in Calcutta.

The *Presidency General Hospital* is probably one of the best examples in the East of a hospital designed for ease of administration, excellence of arrangement and up-to-dateness in the treatment of all forms of disease. It should be seen by all interested in hospital construction and administration in the tropics.

Sanitation and Drainage of Calcutta.

The sanitary problems in and around Calcutta have aspects of peculiar interest. The *water supply* of

Calcutta is taken from the Hooghly at Barrackpore, sixteen miles to the north of Calcutta. Settlement and slow sand filtration were determined on 50 years ago, and the extensions to the water works now in progress follow the same principle. The new settlement tanks when finished will be amongst the largest in the world. The works are well worth a visit. The turbidity of the Hooghly during the monsoon, the scarcity and the high price of land on its banks led a few years ago to the introduction of the rapid system of filtration and many excellent installations of this sort can be seen. Underneath the Bengal plains is an enormous reservoir of water and this is now being extensively drawn on by tube wells of which there are now hundreds in and around Calcutta.

Calcutta's *drainage system* was devised over a hundred years ago; four main sewers run from the Hooghly eastward and intercepting sewers carry the effluent further east, to be discharged into the Bidyadhari, once a large tidal river, now rapidly silting up. Those interested in the sewage disposal of large cities in flat country will find much of interest in the drainage problems of Calcutta. On both sides of the Hooghly the development of the Jute mill industry has raised many sanitary problems, the chief being how to dispose of large quantities of night-soil in congested areas. This problem was tackled by Fowler and Clemesha and the installation known as the Septic Tank Latrine was the successful outcome of their studies. Hundreds of these exist in mill areas up and down the Hooghly; the purified effluent is sterilised before discharge into river or tanks. An opportunity should be taken by visitors to see these installations.

Anti-malarial work.

Many of the environs of Calcutta are malarious and within a few miles of the city are groups of villages which are intensely malarious. The problem of tackling malaria in villages is extremely difficult. The development of Co-operative Anti-malarial Societies is due to the idea conceived by Rai Dr. Gopal Chandra Chatterjee Bahadur and has within a few years made considerable headway. These societies are village institutions, supported by local contributions and run on

co-operative lines. Anti-malarial work is carried out by the members and resident doctors, subsidised by local societies, are to be found in many places. These societies also tackle the problems of kala-azar and cholera from the same standpoint. Many of these societies are near Calcutta and a visit to them has been included in the Congress programme and should be made by all interested in the problem of village diseases in the tropics.

The Port.

The port of Calcutta is one of the largest in the East and extends for many miles on both sides of the river. It is administered by the Port Commissioners. The New King George's Docks now being constructed will add immensely to the trade facilities of the port.

River excursions.

The scenery of the Hooghly is unique; dense towns are interspersed with old-world temples, country houses and gardens coming down to the water edge, while here and there are bathing ghats of renowned holiness, where thousands bathe every day in the holy Ganges water. Every variety of boat and ship from the small dugout and the galley to the ocean-going liner can be seen. The best sights are obtainable from a river steamer, and a trip for our visitors has been kindly arranged by the Port Commissioners. There are few experiences more pleasant than an afternoon and evening cruise in the quiet of the upper reaches of the Hooghly. In the smoky dusk of a December afternoon the visitor coming down the river finishes his trip with a view of Howrah Bridge traversed by thousands of home-goers, the nearest approach to actuality of the vision of Mirza that one knows. The visitor may carry away with him reflections on the transitoriness of human life (or he may not).

Science and Art in Bengal.

Bengal has long been the home of science and culture. The Asiatic Society of Bengal was formed for the purpose of the mutual study and advancement by all classes and creeds of many branches of science and art, ethnological, historical, botanical, zoological, medical,

geological and philological. Of it was born the Indian Museum, the most popular resort of country people visiting Calcutta. The visitor must not miss seeing this wonderful collection, and to ensure its being seen under the best conditions the Curators have kindly arranged for a *conversazione* at the Museum during the Congress week. Sir J. C. Bose's work on plant life is known to all and he has kindly consented to demonstrate his work to Congress members. It is hoped further that visitors may have an opportunity of seeing a representation of Indian Drama, and some specimens of ancient and modern Indian art. The Tagore Schools are famous all over the world for literature, music and art.

Manufacture of Chemicals, etc.

Formerly the profession in India had to depend on outside sources for its supplies of chemicals, drugs, vaccines and anti-sera. Lately however, successful beginnings have been made and visitors may see what progress has been achieved in this direction by visits to the Bengal Chemical and Pharmaceutical Works Limited and the Bengal Immunity Company.

TOURS.

Plans.

Three tours have been arranged, one through Northern India, one through Southern India and a shorter one through Bihar and Orissa. Details of these will be found on page 15.

Arrangements at Bombay.

The Northern and Southern tours will meet in Bombay on December 20th, and after two days will return to Calcutta where the tour will end. No further sightseeing will take place after Bombay and as certain of Messrs. Cooks' tours are scheduled to start from there, certain members will find it more convenient to leave the tour at Bombay. Such members are requested to advise the General Organising Secretary as early as possible.

As little or no accommodation is available in Bombay after December 22nd, members who leave the tours will have to leave Bombay on that date. In the case of those embarking at Bombay for Europe, early

intimation should be given to the General Organising Secretary, so that accommodation can be arranged for them till the date of sailing.

EXPENSES.

(a) Official Government Delegates of Foreign Countries.

The Congress management will meet all the ordinary touring expenses of the *Foreign Official Government Delegates and their wives* as long as they keep to the scheme arranged by the management.

(b) All other Delegates and Members.

All other delegates and members will be asked to meet their own expenses. Generous concessions by the railways and offers of private hospitality have, however, materially reduced the cost of all the tours.

Applications to go on the Tours.

The tours have been organised primarily for the official Government delegates and members of the Association coming from foreign countries. The Congress management will be happy, however, to arrange to include official delegates and members from India up to the limit of the accommodation available. This accommodation will be allotted strictly in order of application.

In the event of their desiring to participate in the tours, all delegates and members, whether coming from foreign countries or India, are requested to inform the General Organising Secretary which of the three tours they prefer.

Every attempt will be made to comply with members' wishes, but no guarantee can be given that this can be done.

The Government of India desire that the foreign official Government delegates should see as much of India as possible. They hope, therefore, that where the representation of any country consists of more than one delegate, arrangements will be made for at least one delegate to go on *each tour*.

Purchase of tickets.

For the convenience of delegates and members, inclusive tickets for the tours will be sold by Thomas Cook & Son, Ltd., at the Information Bureau of the

Congress. Delegates who wish to join in the tours are advised to apply for these as early as possible. Tickets for the tours will *not* be purchasable at the railway station.

TOUR NO. 1.

*Through North India to Bombay and back to Calcutta.
December 11th to 24th.*

The tour will follow the Ganges valley to Delhi, whence two sub-tours branch off. All meet at Agra, and cross first the plateau of Central India, then the strange formations of the Western Ghats, to Bombay, and return to Calcutta.

1st Day.

- (a) Benares, a sacred city of the Hindus (bathing ghats on the Ganges), water works, sanitation of city.

2nd Day.

- (b) Lucknow: the Medical College, Public Health Institute, Anti-malarial works, and a specially prepared public health exhibition. Indian Architecture.

3rd, 4th, 5th Day.

- (c) Delhi: anti-malarial measures, the drainage system of New Delhi (a specially good example), large Women's Hospital, architecture etc., of the new capital of India, Moghul architecture, remains of ancient Indian dynasties.

5th, 6th Day.

- (d) Lahore (sub-tour (a) only). Here public buildings are built as far as possible in Hindu and Muhammadan styles. Medical Institutions, School of Arts, Central Museum, Shalimar Garden (Moghul).

6th Day.

- (e) Kasauli (sub-tour (b) only). A Himalayan hill station from which magnificent views of snows and plains are obtained. Central Research and Pasteur Institutes.

6th, 7th Day.

(f) Agra. the Taj Mahal, Moghul Fort, and remains of Fatehpur Sikri, the capital of Akbar, the Great Moghul.

8th Day.

Sanchi Tope. Ancient Buddhist remains.

9th, 10th Day.

(g) Bombay: Royal Institute of Science, Haffkine Laboratory at Parel, Elephanta Caves (old Buddhist and Hindu).

11th, 12th Day.

Train.

13th Day.

(h) Calcutta.

Note :—1st Class railway accommodation only will be available. The cost and all details about this tour can be obtained from Thomas Cook & Son, Ltd., at the Information Bureau.

TOUR NO. 2.

Through South India to Bombay and back to Calcutta.

December 11th to 24th.

The tour will travel by the East coast to Madras, the Nilgiri Hills, the Indian State of Mysore, Bombay and return to Calcutta.

(a) Madras: Medical Institutions, model Indian Factory, old Dutch Settlement of San Thome Aquarium, visits to Conjeeveram, a very old sacred city of the Hindus, and Seven Pagodas, one of the most remarkable places in India from the archæological point of view.

(b) Coonoor, in the Nilgiri Hills, a tea growing centre, Pasteur Institute, Deficiency Diseases Laboratory.

(c) Ootacamund, a beautiful hill station.

6th, 7th Day.

(d) Mysore, the capital of the State of Mysore, where His Highness the Maharajah's Government will entertain the delegates.

8th Day.

Train. The beautiful scenery of the Western Ghats.

9th, 10th Day.

(e) Bombay: Royal Institute of Science, Haffkine Laboratory at Parel, Elephanta Caves (old Buddhist and Hindu).

11th, 12th Day.

Train.

13th Day.

(f) Calcutta.

NOTES ON RAILWAY TRAVEL IN INDIA.

Trains.

Corridor trains are not common in India. Each first class compartment holds four sleeping berths. Separate accommodation is supplied for ladies and gentlemen. It is rarely possible, therefore, for ladies to travel in the same compartment as their husbands.

Meals and refreshments are provided in Refreshment Cars on all mail services or at Station Refreshment Rooms in the case of other trains.

Bedding.

Bedding is not supplied in trains and members travelling by these must be provided with such as is usually carried in a valise. In Northern India in winter (at the time of the Congress) the temperature at night is low and at least two blankets are necessary.

Bedding can be hired from Thomas Cook & Son, Ltd., but it is advisable for delegates who intend to do this to give warning beforehand.

Soap and towels should be included in the luggage.

Personal Clothing.

For North India warm clothing for the evenings and the early mornings is essential. This is especially so in the hills, visits to which are being paid in both the Northern and Southern tours. For the plains of Southern India cotton or silk should be provided.

Washing.

Washing can be done at short notice in the large towns only.

Luggage.

With the exception of bedding, small hand luggage and suit cases, passengers' luggage is weighed and large pieces are carried in the van.

The free allowance is as follows:—

1st Class passenger— $1\frac{1}{2}$ maunds (120 lbs.)

2nd Class passenger—30 seers (60 lbs.)

The common currency notes are for Rupees five, ten, fifty and one hundred. It is sometimes difficult to cash notes of Rs. 100 and over in Provinces other than those of their origin. Silver coins are the rupee, 8-anna, 4-anna and 2-anna pieces. Nickel coins are

for 4 annas (six sided), 2 annas (square) and 1 anna (wavy margin). The common copper coin is the pice (3 pies).

CONSTITUTION AND BYE-LAWS
OF
THE ASSOCIATION

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE 1.—TITLE.

The Name and Title of this organization shall be "The Far Eastern Association of Tropical Medicine."

ARTICLE 2.—OBJECTS.

The Objects of this Association shall be:—

- (a) The promotion of the science and art of medicine in the Far East.
- (b) The union of the medical profession of the Far East into one compact organization.
- (c) The development and diffusion of scientific knowledge.
- (d) The promotion of friendly international intercourse between scientific men.
- (e) The elevation of the standard of medical education.
- (f) The enlightenment of public opinion in regard to the prevention of disease.
- (g) The publication of the results of scientific investigations.

ARTICLE 3.—COMPOSITION OF THE ASSOCIATION.

The Association shall consist of ordinary members, associate members, honorary members, and honorary advisory members.

ARTICLE 4.—MEMBERSHIP.

1. The ordinary members of the Association shall be medical practitioners, dentists, veterinarians licensed by their home governments and the scientists working in the sphere connected with medicine and hygiene.

2. The associate members of the Association shall be persons holding local subordinate medical qualifications in the country where the Congress is held. They are not entitled to vote or to attend at any business meeting. They are not entitled to the official publication of the Association.

3. Honorary members may be medical men or scientific workers in countries outside the zone of this Association, who have risen to eminence in their respective professions. They may be elected by the Council.

4. The honorary advisory members shall be distinguished official representatives of any nation and distinguished residents of the countries of the Far East. They need not necessarily be medical or scientific men. They may be elected for the period of any Congress by the executive committee of the country in which the Association is holding its biennial session.

ARTICLE 5.—COUNCIL.

The Association subject to the terms of this Constitution shall be governed by the Council.

- (a) The Council shall consist of the President, the General Secretary-Treasurer, a Vice-President from each of the Far Eastern countries and the local Secretary-Treasurer of the country in which the Congress is held.
- (b) One representative nominated by the government of each of the Far Eastern countries.
- (c) One representative from non-official bodies in each of the Far Eastern countries.

ARTICLE 6.—OFFICERS.

- (d) The officers of the Association shall be one President and one General Secretary-Treasurer.
- (e) A Vice-President for each of the Far Eastern countries.
- (f) A local Secretary-Treasurer for each of the Far Eastern countries.

ARTICLE 7.—OFFICE.

There shall be a permanent office of the Association under direction of the General Secretary-Treasurer, who shall take care of the archives and administer the money matters of the Association.

ARTICLE 8.—FUNDS AND EXPENSES.

- (1) The expenses of the permanent office of the Association shall be met from a biennial membership fee of two pounds sterling. These funds shall be collected by the local Secretary-Treasurers, and remitted by them to the General Secretary-Treasurer. The biennial period commences immediately after the closing of the Congress.
- (2) Funds for meeting the expenses of the Congress of this Association shall be raised by applying to the government of the country where the Congress is to be held for a grant from the Treasury, by voluntary gifts from individuals, by all local membership fees, and by gifts from medical or other organizations.

ARTICLE 9.—AMENDMENTS.

1. The Council may amend any article of this Constitution at any biennial session, provided the proposed amendment shall not be acted on until the biennial session next following that at which it was introduced, and provided that three-fourths of the voting members registered at the session at which it is taken vote in favour of such change or amendment.

2. The Association may repeal or alter any part of this Constitution at any biennial session, provided that three-fourths of the members attending such session vote in favour of such repeal or alteration, and same is confirmed by a simple majority of the members present at a meeting to be summoned not later than seven days after the passing of the first resolution.

BYE-LAWS.

CHAPTER 1.

Section 1.—An ordinary member of the Association shall be entitled to retain his membership so long as

he pays his dues and otherwise conforms to the provisions of the Constitution and Bye-Laws.

An associate member shall be entitled to retain his membership only for the duration of the meeting which he attends.

The ordinary membership of the Association may be obtained by presenting to the Vice-President of the country within which the candidate resides:

- (1) A written application for membership on the prescribed form.
- (2) Satisfactory evidence of the necessary qualifications.
- (3) The payment of such dues as may for the time being be leviable; provided that any member once elected shall remain a member as long as he conforms to the rules of the society and irrespective of his place of residence, or of honorable withdrawal from his local society.

Honorary members shall be elected by the Council and shall be entitled to retain their membership for the period mentioned in the resolution electing them.

Section 2.—When the General Secretary-Treasurer shall be officially informed that a member has forfeited his qualification, it shall be his duty to remove the name of such person from the roll of membership in this Association and to notify him of the action taken together with the reason therefor.

Section 3.—Any person who has forfeited his membership shall be reinstated at his request by the General Secretary-Treasurer when satisfactory evidence of qualification has been presented.

Section 4.—Any member who shall fail to pay his biennial dues shall be dropped from the roll of members, provided that due notice shall be previously given to the member by the Vice-President. Any member who has been suspended for non-payment of dues shall be restored only when all his dues have been paid.

CHAPTER 2.

The President of the Association together with the Vice-President and local Secretary-Treasurer of the

country in which the next biennial Congress is to be held shall form an "Executive Committee" for that Congress and shall have power to add to the number of that committee and form such other committees as may appear expedient.

The official minutes of such committees shall be forwarded to the General Secretary-Treasurer by the local Secretary-Treasurer.

CHAPTER 3.

Section 1.—The Council shall meet before the opening biennial meeting of the Association.

Section 2.—A majority of the Councillors attending any regular meeting of this Association shall constitute a quorum of the Council, provided at least three members shall be present.

CHAPTER 4.

Section 1.—Nomination of officers shall be made by members from the countries concerned, and a majority of the members present at any biennial meeting shall elect such officers. Nomination and election shall take place on the last day of the regular meeting immediately after the close of the scientific work. Any post left unfilled at the General Meeting, or falling vacant later through the retirement or death of an officer, may be filled by appointment of an officer by members residing in the country concerned, provided that such appointment be notified to the General Secretary-Treasurer and circulated by him to the other officers of the Association.

Section 2.—Any question whether a territorial unit is to be recognized as a separate "country" in applying the provisions of the Constitution and Bye-Laws shall be decided by the Council; and provided that, between sessions, the General Secretary-Treasurer may make a provisional decision which shall hold for the next ensuing Congress.

Section 3.—The General Secretary-Treasurer shall use all reasonable means to give due notice of the approaching meeting (at least six months') to the members of this Association, and the Vice-Presidents

and local Secretary-Treasurers shall co-operate in giving due notice of the approaching meeting. The local Secretary-Treasurer of the country in which the Congress is held shall prepare for publication the official programme of the meeting.

Section 4.—Each local Secretary-Treasurer shall collect and transmit to the General Secretary-Treasurer the dues from members, and at least one month before the meeting he shall submit to the General Secretary-Treasurer a list of the members proposing to attend, together with a list of the titles of papers to be read by the members of his country.

Section 5.—The General Secretary-Treasurer shall be the custodian of such funds of the Association as are collected from membership fees, and shall render to the Council a report of all funds passing through his hands at each meeting of this Association.

CHAPTER 5.

An emblem and flag shall be deposited at the permanent office of the Association and shall be used at all meetings of this Association. A badge to be worn by all members shall be designed for each Congress and shall have attached to it a ribbon showing national colours of the country in which the Congress is held.

CHAPTER 6.

Section 1.—These Bye-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of all the members present at any meeting, after the amendment has been laid upon the table for at least a day.

CHAPTER 7.

Section 1.—The Council at the first meeting of this Association, and at each meeting thereafter, shall provide for the publication of the proceedings, and one copy shall be presented to each ordinary member and such others as the Council may decide.

CHAPTER 8.

Section 1.—No address or paper before the Association, excepting the annual address, shall occupy more

than twenty minutes in delivery, and no member shall speak longer than five minutes nor more than once on any subject, except by unanimous consent.

Section 2.—All papers read before the Association shall become its property and shall be deposited with the Secretary when read.

CHAPTER 9.

The deliberations of this Association shall be governed by standard rules of parliamentary procedure such as are contained in Robert's Rules of Order, when these are not in conflict with the Constitution and Bye-Laws.

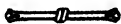
