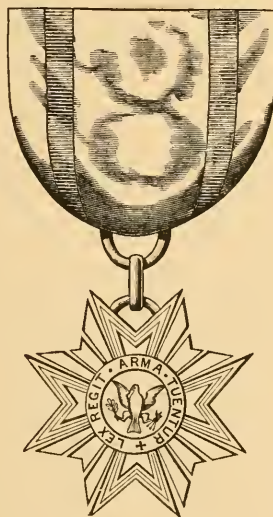

PRAYER BY BISHOP MEADE, JUNE 5, 1861.

ALMIGHTY GOD, who by thy holy apostles, hast commanded that supplications and intercessions be made for all men, especially for those in authority, look down, we pray thee, on the people and rulers of our land. Thou alone canst order the unruly minds and affections of sinful men, and make us to be of one mind in a house. Pour into our hearts, we beseech thee, that most excellent gift of charity. Make us to believe that it is righteousness alone that exalteth a nation, and that sin is the reproach of any people. We pray for all sorts and conditions of men in our land. May thy Holy Spirit incline their hearts to peace and concord. We pray for all those who profess and call themselves Christians, that they may be led in the way of truth, and hold the faith in unity of spirit, in the bond of peace, and in righteousness of life. We pray especially for the rulers and leaders of our country, that grace and wisdom may be given them according to their need. Save them from all ignorance, error, pride, and prejudice. Direct and prosper all their consultations, to the advancement of thy glory, the good of thy Church, the safety, honor, and welfare of thy people. Nor pray we for this land only, but for all the nations of the earth. Look in pity on the whole human family. Overrule all the commotions of the earth. Bring order out of confusion, light out of darkness, and hasten the time when men shall learn war no more, and all the kingdoms of the world shall become the kingdoms of Christ. We ask these things, O Heavenly Father, hoping only to be heard through the intercession of our Lord and Saviour, to whom with thee and the Holy Ghost be the glory evermore. AMEN.

○ LORD of heaven and earth, who leddest our fathers forth, making them to go from one kingdom to another people; we yield thee hearty thanks for all that thou didst for them and art doing for the land to which they came. May we always remember them in thee, and be grateful to them through thee. We remember them not only as valiant in fight, but as wise in council; not only as brave warriors, but as far-seeing statesmen, and incorruptible patriots. And we give thee thanks for them. We remember those of a later day, who spared not their lives that our land might be one; patriots of the newer time, prophets and martyrs of our country's unity. And we give thee thanks for them. And we pray that we may follow their good examples and bequeath to our children a nation worthy of such founders and preservers, meet to do thy will, a kingdom subject completely to thee and to thy Christ. AMEN.
