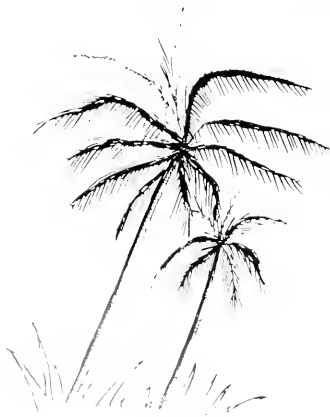

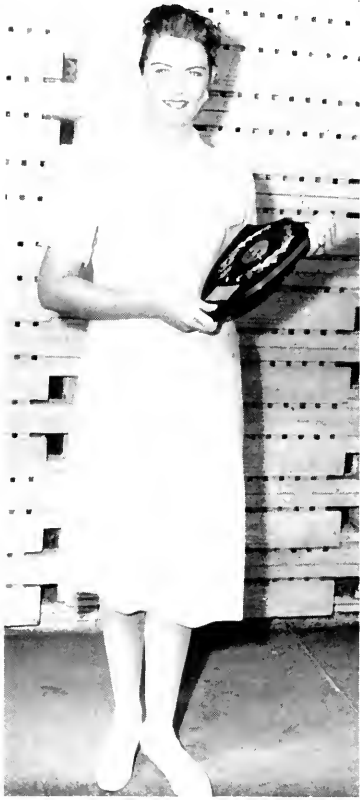

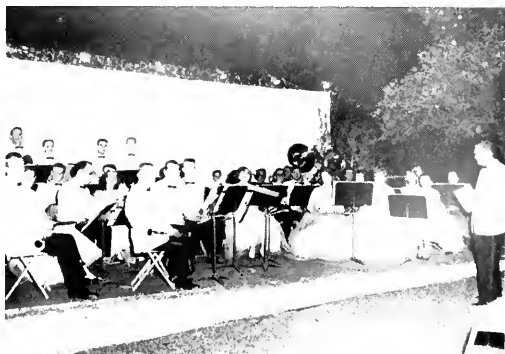

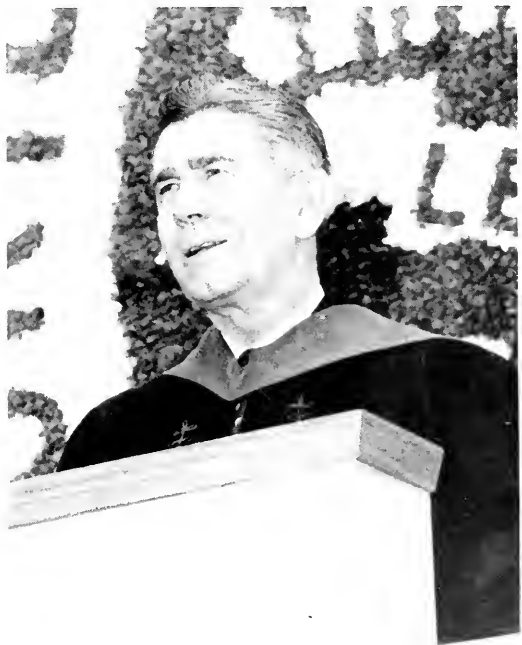

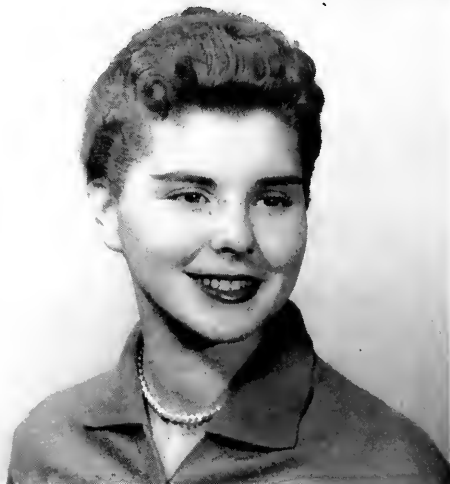

American Chemical Society

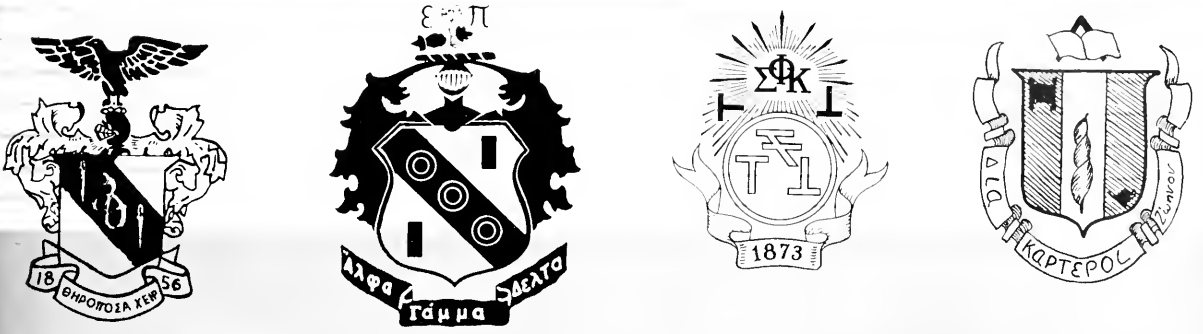

Interfraternity Council



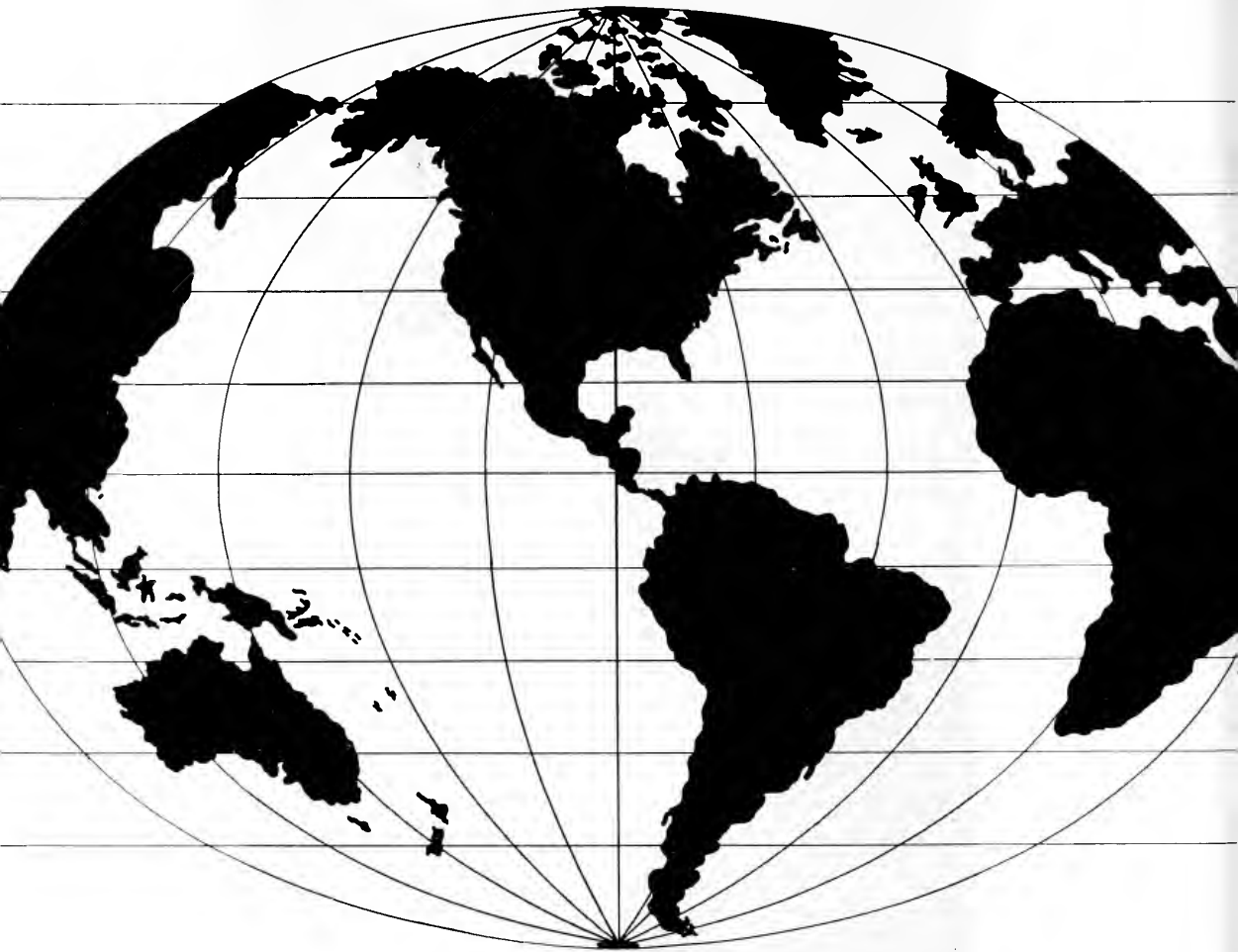

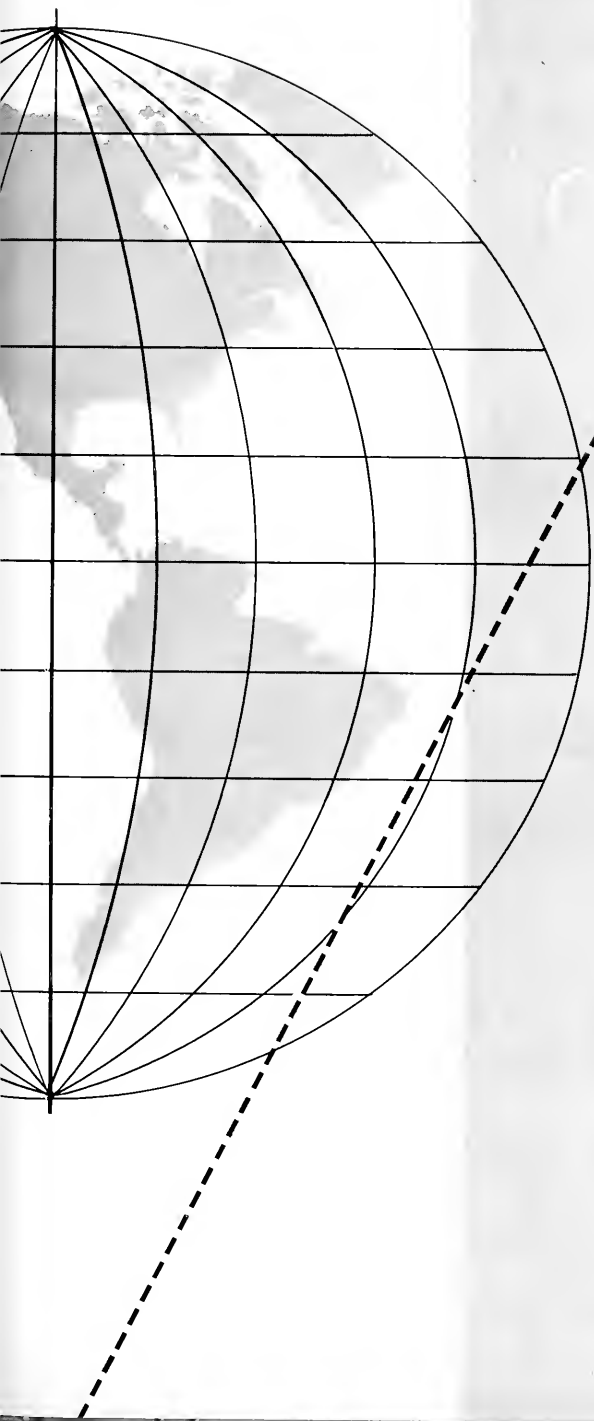
BISHOP JOHN BRANSCOMB answered the call of our Heavenly Father on Friday, January 16, 1959.
