## A DISTINGUISHED COLLECTION OF KLIPPES

"Klippe" is a gencral tcrm for coins and medals struek on a squarc, rectangular, lozengc-shapcd or quitc irregular flan. Klippes oceur in various metals as ean be seen below. Silver is most common, but there are Gold Khippes, as well as base metal examples.

Regular denomination sets occur, employing dies for round format coins - as for example in Salzburg. In many instances, Khppcs wcre money of neeessity, emergeney issues struck during sieges of a fortress or city. This circumstance occurred frequently in the 16 th and 17 th centuries in Germany and the Low Countrics during the Wars of the Reformation. In England, the Civil War produeed examplcs sueh as the Ncwark Besicged Shilling inchuded in this eolleetion.

Both the Saxon Electors and Danish Kings employed the form for commemorating or presentation purposes as a eoin or medal, produeing some handsome and historic pieces.

As a mark of their special status, some pieees were embellished with additional hand engraving as on the sicge pieees of Groningen, and on the very rare and cxecptional Eight Dueats of Nuremberg offered below.

The examples presented here provide an excellent opportunity to add one of these unusual picees to a serious eollection.

## THE CARL J. AUSTRIAN, JR. COLLECTION OF BRITISH CAMPAIGN MEDALS

Campaign Medals are fascinating and personal pieces of human history. They do not denote individual heroism, but record the fact that their recipients were present and fought in certain military actions.

The modern campaign medal has its roots in the Napoleonic Wars (1792-1815). The first of the official government issue was the Waterloo Medal, awarded to all British soldiers in that final battle of the Napoleonic Wars. The Military General Service Medal covering actions between 1793 and 1814 was not issued until 1848. By the end of the nineteenth century the campaign medal had proliferated throughout the world.

Much British history is depicted in medals. They show adventurous exploits on dangerous expeditions into dangerous places. They illustrate the great days of the building of an empire now dead or dying. They deserve study for this alone.

There is an extensive literature on the subject. Many official documents are grist for the researcher's mill. For many of the campaign medals offered below, copies of soldiers' rolls, etc. can be made available to the successful bidder upon request.

The son of King Eadgar and Aethelflaed, the young king Edward seemed bad tempered and prone to violence. His brief reign was marked by rivalry between the leading nobles and a bubbling resentment against the rise of the powerful new monasteries and their attendant privileges. The custom of striking coins in the name and type of the previous king continued into the early years of Edward I's reign. This practice, though, proved untenable. Wear and tear on the 'Longcross' Pennies, now some thirty years in circulation, was heavy. Coinage was also plagued by endemic and systematic clipping. In the sunmer of 1278 , the foul state of currency in the realm was brought before the Parliament of Gloucester.

Making a final break with Anglo-Saxon traditions which had survived the Norntan conquest, a recoinage was ordered, along with the recall of all the old pennies. On May 17, 1279, Gregory de Rokesley and Rolandin de Puy were sworn in as "Keepers of the King's Exchange." Models for the new coinage dies were turned over to them. Meanwhile the enormity of the recoinage process necessitated supplementing the issues of London. On Dec. 8, 1279, William de Tournemire of Marseilles, moneyer at London, was appointed naster-moneyer over all the king's mints (except the ecclesiatical mints of Durham and St. Edmundsbury). New mints were opened at Bristol and York, with 12 furnaces each. In the next year, a royal nint was added at Lincoln followed by one at
Newcastle and the reopening of the ecclesiatical mint of York Newcastle and the reopening of the ecclesiatical mint of York.

To counter clipping, improved flans were used for the new coins - made most likely by slicing blanks from cast silver rods instead of the old practice of shearing them from sheet metal. To replace the cut divisions of a Penny, Half Pennies and Farthings were struck. In addition, the moneyer's name was discontinued on all coinage (with one exception).

Edward I, although bearded, is depicted beardless on the new coinage. This possibly was intended to differentiate the new money from the old longcross coinage which sported a very bearded portrait of Edward's father.

The new coinage also saw the introduction of the Groat, a novelty most likely suggested by the recently introduced and successful Gros Tournois of St. Louis in France.

Very rare and seemingly experimental in issue, Edward's Groat was struck only at London. This lovely issue marked the first appearance of the titles of Ireland and Aquitaine on an English coin. The five or six minor varieties known bespeak a number of dies being cut for this new denomination. Very few of these Groats, however, are known today.
It appears that they were struck with the first London emissions of the new coinage, but for some reason the public disliked the new coin and objected to being paid in it for Pence brought into the mint for recoinage. Perhaps unfamiliarity with such a large piece put off the public; the Groat's artistic merit, though, was appreciated. The preponderance of extant mounted and gilded pieces seems to indicate that its only success was as a jewelry ornament.

After Edward I's Groat experiment, the denomination would not reappear until 1351 when it became firnly established as the preeminent English silver coin of Tudor times.

Russian platinum production began in 1824 with the extraction of 81 Russian pounds fron the mines in the Urals of Western Siberia. Mint and government officials soon eyed the metal favorably for coinage purposes because of its durability and excellent striking qualities.
In 1826, platinum was experimentally utilized for coronation medals and a unique striking with the dies of the silver Half Ruble. Two years later, platinum coinage - in tlue denomination of 3 Rubles - was launched for circulation by imperial ukase. A second ukase introduced the 6 Ruble denomination, while the final ukase brought about the 12 Ruble.

The public, however, proved indifferent and even hostile to the pale precious metal. In 1845, an ulase ordered a complete and permanent lualt of platinum coin production and directed a recall of all existing pieces to occur within a six-month span.
