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

CORNELIUS CLARKSON VERMEULE III

Collecting Coins of the World

Cornelius Vermeule began collecting Crowns and other Renaissance to modern coins for much the same reasons he collected United States coins, currency, and postage stamps. He inherited several collections. In addition, travels to every corner of the world presented challenges of acquisition hard to overlook. His great-great grandfather, Benjamin Carpenter became interested in European and other crowns through his shipping interests from the Hudson River to France, Africa, and the West Indies, and through his bank in Newburg, New York. International activities in support of anti-imperial causes included construction of a fast sloop to rescue Napoleon off St. Helena. Napoleon died before the plan could be carried out.

A great-grandfather, who lived in the lives of every President from Thomas Jefferson to William Jefferson Clinton, established a tobacco firm with offices from Milwaukee to Philadelphia (inland from Smyrna and Sardis) and put aside coins of all denominations that came over his counters.

Special collections began in South America and Europe in the 1930's, in the Philippines and the Far East in the 1940's, in England in the 1950's, and on Cyprus and beyond from 1960 to 1980. Nowadays, the search is made painfully easy by all the governments, semi-official mints, and global agencies which sell proof sets and mint coins in shopping malls, on television, and through the

world wide web. Collections like those presented here are difficult to replicate in the 2000's and therefore become not-to-be-overlooked opportunities.

The following friends and colleagues have helped prepare these collections for sale here: Mary Comstock, John Herrmann, Kevin Cahalane (also of State Street Global), and Laura Gadbery with Lawrence Berman (the last two, navigators and transporters) in the Department of Ancient Art, Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. Alexandra Elizabeth Gratton of Adelaide, SA, and Armidale, NSW (University of New England) has provided crucial assistance in a variety of ways. Not least, Stephen A. Bergquist of State Street Advisors has been a true bench coach. J.B., Morton, Benjamin, Norman, and Harvey G. Stack were mentors and friends from 1935 on (the year the firm took its present form), and Stack's is the only institution to shepherd these coins back across the globe.





The low weight of this piece, 3.17 grams, strongly suggests an ancient plated fourrée. Banti-Simonetti list two varieties, one where the obverse legend BRVT IMP is slightly curved, a scarcer one where these words are straight. The weight range for the first type is noted as 4.20 to 3.87 grams, while the second of the two examples of the second type is recorded in a 2002 Bank Leu auction at 3.72 grams. The British Museum catalogue lists three specimens with weights of 58.7, 57.6 and 52.8 grains, with the above offered specimen weighing 49 grains. The presently offered specimen shows slight evidence on the obverse of a surface split and the slightest buckling, suggesting a plating. However, there is no evidence of a core showing, despite surface scratches and some granularity. While these last mentioned features may have decreased the weight of this coin slightly, this is largely offset by the adherence, particularly on the edge, of a noticeable patination.

At noon, on the Ides of March 44 B.C. Caesar sat in his chair in the Senate House, surrounded by men he had cared for, had promoted or spared. There he was struck down, struggling, until he fell dead at the foot of Pompey's statue. The conspiracy had been extensive, nearly sixty men, led by M. Junius Brutus and C. Cassius. The reasons for the conspiracy were many and complex. Certainly Caesar's powers and honors, and especially his control of offices was intolerable to men whose family honor required that they achieve at least the offices and rank of their fathers and, if possible, one step higher. Caesar's repeated refusal of the title "Rex" (king) left many unconvinced, finding the mere mention of the word proof that Caesar intended to become a monarch in the style of the eastern Hellenistic Greek kings. A vague phrase in the Sibylline Books was interpreted by the Quindecimvir L. Cotta to mean that only a king could defeat the Parthians, a potentially difficult situation with Caesar on the verge of launching a campaign against the Parthians. The possible solution that Caesar would be declared king outside of Rome did nothing to quiet the view, firmly embraced by Brutus, that the Republic.

After the assassination, public outrage required the conspirators to flee from Rome. The Senate cooperated by assigning Brutus the vital task of importing grain to Rome from Asia Minor, though shortly thereafter the Senate relegated him to the relatively unimportant task of governing Crete. After a quarrel with Antony, Brutus took it upon himself to sail to Greece where, with money handed over by the retiring Questors of Asia and Syria and with the support of Q. Hortensius, the governor of Macedonia, he raised an army. Later the Senate accepted this fait accompli, voting him command of all the Republic troops in Illyricum, Macedonia and Achaea, and probably making his imperium "maius" and valid in Asia as well. Brutus continued to collect men and material and gathered other like-minded men such as his co-conspirator Cassius. In the summer of 42 B.C. he faced Antony and Octavian and in October of that year was defeated in the second battle of Philippi, after which he committed suicide.

Marcus Junius Brutus claimed descent from Lucius Junius Brutus, the traditional founder and first Consul of the Republic, who is said to have sworn on a bloody dagger to expell the Tarquin kings from Rome. One coin type he chose, the Eidibus Martiis Denarius, is arguably the most famous in the entire Roman series, a unique reverse design so extraordinary that it prompted mention by the historian Dio Cassius who wrote in the early decades of the third century A.D. The issue was coined under the authority of Brutus' lieutenant Lucius Plaetorius Cestianus shortly before the fateful second battle of Philippi. The reverse shows two daggers of the assassins flanking a pileus, a liberty cap associated with the Twins, Castor and Pollus, divine patrons of Rome who, according to legend, intervened in the fateful battle of Lake Regillus where Rome defeated the Latins. The combination of the symbols in this case, the daggers and the pileus, in a sense links the assassination of Caesar with divinities and events related to the very survival of the Republic. The appearance on the obverse of Brutus' portrait is particularly ironic. It can be argued that Caesar's portrait on coins of January-February 44 B.C., the first appearance of a Roman while living on coins from the mint of Rome, fueled suspicion of Caesar's regal intentions and probably constituted one of the several justifications for his assassination.

The story of local gold coinage in Australia closely parallels that of the Appalachian and Far Western gold rushes in the United States. After Gold was discovered in New South Wales, South Australia found itself emptied of able-bodied men needed to work the harvest. Hoping to retrieve its "diggers" from the gold fields, South Australia's Executive Council voted on Dec. 16, 1852, a reward of £10,000 for any discovery of gold within the Colony. In offering solutions to the goldinduced problems, writer Charles Simeon Hare recalled the experiences of Georgia and Virginia in the 1830's and 1840's. On Dec. 31, Lieutenant Governor Sir Henry Young and representatives of three leading banks met to discuss creation of official gold ingots to take the place of inconvenient dust. Bullion Acts were passed, the first on Jan. 28, 1852, attempting to regulate use of Gold in the Colony. On January 4, Hare was seeking qualified mechanics to strike Tokens of 1 or 2 Sovereigns "to facsimile the Sovereign not only in value but in form," i.e. in coin shape rather than as irregular ingots.

On January 6, 1853 the colonial government petitioned Her Majesty's Government to establish Branch Mints in South Australia. The three leading banks opposed legal tender status for the proposed colonial ingots but were prepared to use them as backing for bank notes that would be placed in circulation. One colonial spokesman exhorted Lieutenant Governor Young to emulate Admiral Horatio Nelson, disregard official instructions and issue local gold ingots or tokens to save the colony. The Governor said "if he were properly supported out of doors he would do the needful." The disadvantages of ingots led to grumbling against "cast ingots... varying in weight, dimensions and quality would, although stamped with their weight, dimensions and standards of quality by the Government, be very cumbrous and objectionable as a currency...." On Jan. 28, the Governor assented to ingot issue, assured of the legality of the ingot or token coinage by the Crown Solicitor. Gold was to be valued at £3 Pounds, 11/ per ounce, with assaying charges set a low 1%. The Government Assay Office opened on Feb. 10 with 29 deposits, and the first ingots were made March 4. Few survive today of these oddly sized and shaped official issues.

As soon as the ardently hoped-for action was taken, complaints rolled in. Eastern Colonies protested the whole concept, wailing was heard about slow production causing bullion to sit idle for too long, favoritism was alleged in processing deposits and unfounded complaints were made against the purity and reliability of the finished ingots. By now struck gold Sovereigns were beginning to arrive from the Royal Mint in far-off London, "by the ship load," reducing the need to strike local gold, now authorized as circular "coin-tokens" in denominations of £5, 2, 1 Pound and 10 Shillings. Only two types of £1 were actually struck in any quantity and their carefully specified "token" status was designed to protect the local officials against charges of violating British coining laws. A few £5 pieces are known, all restrikes of a much later date inside the Melbourne Mint. The few surviving £1 pieces are among the most sought-after highlights of Australian numismatics.

The incuse-lettered edge bears the Nazi motto, Gemeinutz geht vor Eigenutz, Common Welfare goes before Individual Welfare. P48 in Kurt Jaeger's classic reference, Die Deutsche Reichsmünzen seit 1871, whose 1950's editions included Patterns with this type qualified as "Unikum?" German Pattern coin cataloguer Rudolf Schaaf assigned this type number 372a in Die Proben der Deutsche Münzen seit 1871. Unlike this specimen, the Schaaf plate piece, in the collection of the Money Museum of the Deutsche Bundesbank is identical to the coin offered here with the addition of PROBE along the rim below the chin. Krause-Bruce X93.

Gunther Kienast assigned this pattern number 659 in his 1985 Goetz II, Supplement to The Medals of Karl Goetz (Artus Publishing, Lincoln, Neb.) Kienast reprinted Kurt Jaeger's February 1971 letter to the editor of the Numismatisches Nachrichtenblatt, deploring false Hitler pieces then appearing on the market but emphasizing the authenticity of this 1942 A pattern:

Quite different, however, is the case of a Hitler pattern 5 Reichsmark of 1942, Mintmark A, copper, silver-plated, which was struck in normal size and with the customary edge engraving of the German 5 RM pieces in Berlin after a design by medalist Goetz.

One piece was presented to Hitler in his headquarters *Wolfschanze* in 1942 by the Director of the Monetary System, Herr v. P. As the widow of Herr v. P. vouches, Hitler said about the presentation that his head should appear on German coins after the final victory. This pattern is still in existence today in the above mentioned hands.

A total of 4 pieces were struck, of which one was sold at auction several years ago in Cologne for approximately 12,000 Deutsche Mark. The same piece now shows up in the January auction of the Frankfurter Münzhandlung. The estimated value was set at 23,600 Deutsche Mark.

The Wolfschanze was Hitler's headquarters near Rastenburg, East Prussia, where the assassination attempt of July 20, 1944 took place. Only one other genuine Hitler pattern is known, bearing Hitler's head and a Wehrmacht steel helmet with oak wreath reverse, another somewhat sinister "victory" theme. Here is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to acquire one of the greatest rarities of the war-scarred 20th century. Few other coins of any country can compare for sheer historical importance and rarity. Brilliant Uncirculated. (SEE COLOR PLATE) (25,000-35,000)

Holey Dollar of 5 Shillings, 1813. 39.3mm, diameter of hole 15.65mm; 21.70 grams. Host coin is a Mexico Mint 8 Reales, 1804 Mo. TH. Introduced to combat a persistent coin shortage, these pieces were deliberately over-valued to assure their continued circulation on the island. Some 1,000 Spanish Milled Dollars were officially pierced and countermarked by order of Governor Charles Douglas Smith, brother of Napoleonic era British Admiral Sir Sydney Smith. Governor Smith was widely accused of autocratic rule, and his solution for the coin shortage was announced without consulting the island legislature or promulgation of any Order in Council. The pierced coins were over-valued as 5 Shillings, but the cut-out centers were under-valued as Shillings. Since their actual silver value was greater than a Shilling, most of them vanished in short order. Above the Holey Dollar's center hole is the counterstamp of a sun with rays composed of 10 tiny triangles, of which 7 are clear on this piece. A thousand pierced pieces were insufficient to relieve the prevailing shortage and prominent area merchants surreptitiously added to the supply, agreeing to receive their version of the Holey Dollar at par with the government issue. Official circulation ceased in September 1814, though local merchants continued to accept the pieces for 10 more years. These historic coins are now a significant rarity of the Canadian and Commonwealth coinage, eagerly sought after by modern collectors. KM 2, Charlton PE-1A1. HISTORIC CUBA SOUVENIR PESOS

The New York-based revolutionary Junta of the Republic of Cuba, headed by Don Tomás Estrada Palma raised \$1,517,000 for the cause of independence between 1892 and 1898. Inspired by the release of the U.S. Columbian Half Dollar, the Junta authorized the striking of "Silver Dollars of the Republic" to raise additional funds and to assert the demand for independence. The pieces were designed by noted sculptor Philip Martiny, a student of Augustus Saint Gaudens.

On the advice of the Junta's American attorney Jerome Carty, the word SOUVENIR appeared on the 1897 issues in place of the proposed denomination UN PESO. Carty pointed out that since there was as yet no internationally recognized Republic of Cuba, such coinage would violate U.S. Neutrality laws. In 1898, following the outbreak of the Spanish-American War, UN PESO was placed on the final issue.

Cuban leaders always regarded the Souvenir pieces as coins, carefully recording the deposit of a bag of these "Silver Dollars of the Republic" in the national Treasury after independence.

Here is an extraordinary example of the emergency coinage ordered by Governor Lachlan Macquarie to serve the needs of this remote colonial outpost. £10,000 worth of Spanish Milled Dollars arrived in November 1812 aboard H.M.S. Samarang, and 40,000 pieces were pierced with clumsy, colonialbuild machinery. The cut-out centers became 15 Pence pieces called "Dumps," (see below). The center holes were surrounded by a somewhat Spartan design from dies cut by convicted forger William Henshall at the governor's order. Most were struck on Mexico Mint 8 Reales, but coins from the Mints of Potosí and Lima as well as the metropolitan Spanish Mints of Madrid and Seville are also known. Only 196 pieces of all host types are believed to exist today. Among the finest known, this unusually well struck obverse displays boldly defined denticles and legend NEW SOUTH WALES, 1813 around the hole. The reverse stamp is equally precise, FIVE + SHILLINGS and wreath. W.J.D. Mira and W.J. Noble in their compendium The Holey Dollars of New South Wales, a Pictorial Record of Known Surviving Specimens illustrate this piece as 1805-22. By any reckoning, the New South Wales Holey Dollar is a great Australasian and world rarity and a pivotal coin in the entire history of imperial and Commonwealth coinage. Decades may pass before any comparable piece appears at public auction. The Host coin is Choice Very Fine, Countermark About Uncirculated or better. (SEE COLOR PLATE) (17,500-25,000)

The "Dumps" and Holey Dollars remained in circulation until at least September 1829. Six chests of withdrawn Dollars and "Dumps" weighing 1,762 pounds were received at the British Royal Mint during 1832 and the contents melted, representing probably 28,500 Dollars, 10,500 "Dumps." Today the 15 Pence centers are only marginally less rare than the 5 Shilling Holey Dollars.

Highly successful under the Manchus, Yuan Shih-kai was equally successful in his ambitious machinations under the early Republic. In 1912, Yuan Shih-kai was elected Provisional President of the Chinese Republic by the National Council at Nanking. The next year he was formally elected President.

Within a month, Yuan Shih-kai ordered the immediate dissoltion of the Kuomintang political party. This effectively unseated half of Parliament, killing its ability to have a quorum. In January, Parliament was formally suspended even as Yuan Shih-kai consolidated power within the central executive.

This was followed the next year by a movement for the reestablishment of the monarchy, whose throne Yuan would occupy. Yuan bestowed regal titles on friends, while taking the reign title Hung-Hsien for himself. A serious rebellion in Yunnan Province, however, postponed a formal enthronement. Then in March, 1916, he issued a mercurial mandate cancelling the monarchy, becoming once more just Mr. President. Yuan died three months later and with him the monarchial scheme.







Beginning in 1884, Korea experimented with modern machine struck coinage. Designs for the Warn (romanized Hwan) came from the 1886 German-Korean-Japanese test issue.

In November, 1886, the Seoul South Grand-Gate Mint was rebuilt and refurbished for machine-struck coins and boasted three German technicians. These, though, were considered too costly, and in 1887, the German technicians were replaced by Japanese counterparts from the Osaka mint. Dies dated 1888 were then prepared for an issue of 5 and 10 Mun and 1 Warn. The coins, though, were put on hold, as a local politician, An Hyong-su entreated with the government to abandon modern-style coinage and return to traditional holed copper coins. Hyong-su's entreaty was unsuccessful, and in 1891, the mint used the 1888 dies to strike 5 and 10 Mun and a miniscule amount of Warn.

By the late 1800's Korea's Yi Dynasty and government were tittering on collapse, buckling under foreign pressure, rebellions and intrigue. Korea was torn between those who supported Kojong's opening of the country to the outside world and his reform policies and those opposed. Japan, meanwhile, was aspiring to bring Korea under her sway.

Given its own convolutions, China was able to do little to bolster her vassal state. Commanding several thousand Imperial troops in Korea, Yuan Shih-kai (later to become China's president), though, was able to suppress an uprising against the government. He was appointed China's Imperial Resident in Seoul for his efforts. Vigilant for expressions of Korean suzerainty, Yuan took exception to the usage of "Great Korea" on the coinage. He claimed this to be an affront to China and an order was issued to ban this inscription. The storm clouds of the Sino-Japanese War, however, were gathering, and the stock of Korean coins titled "Great Korea" were released as war commenced in 1894. With China's defeat in 1895, "Great" was officially restored to coinage.

PHILIPPINES

The long and eventful numismatic history of the Philippines begins in pre-Colonial times. Under four centuries of Spanish rule, a long series of Copper coins, Barrillas and later Quartos, fractions and multiples were struck from dies cut by local engravers.

Silver coins of Spanish Mints in the New World circulated throughout the archipelago. After the Latin American republics were established, coins began arriving in Manila bearing such seditious terms as "Republica, Independencia, Libertad."

During the reign of Fernando VII (1808-1833), massive countermarks of 1828 and 1830 obliterated most of the offending designs. After 1832, Latin American silver was countermarked with small round punches bearing the royal monograms F 70 and Y.II (Isabel II, 1833-1868). From 1861 to 1898, Gold and Silver coins were struck in the new Manila Mint portraying Isabel II, Alfonso XII and Alfonso XIII.

As silk, spices and tea flowed out of Asia in the 17th and 18th Centuries, silver and gold flowed in from the New World. Spain's colonies in the Americas were the main suppliers of money payment for Asian goods. And as Manila had become one of the Far East's busiest entrepots, Spanish-American silver and gold coins fueled local trade.

In the early 1800's, revolution, though, spread like wildfire across Spain's American colonies. After gaining independence, these new countries, especially Mexico, Bolivia and Peru, remained the Asian trade's major silver coin suppliers. This caused suitable dyspepsia to the Spanish authorities in Manila for they believed that acceptance of coins from these fractious rebels implied recognition of their insurgency. And, more alarmingly, it may spark a desire among the Filipinos to throw off the mantle of Spain.

On Oct. 13, 1828, the Captain-General of the Philippines decreed that all coins imported from the newly established Mexican Republic or other break-away colonies must be overstruck with the Coat of Arms of Spain and the legend: "Habilitado por el Rey N.S.D. Fern.VII" (Rehabilitated by the King our Lord Don Fernando VII). On the reverse would be stamped "Manila" and the date.

This counterstamp was used for three years, 1828-1830. In 1832, a change was made to a smaller and simpler die for the Manila die had proved damaging to the mint's machinery.

With Spain's eventual recognition of her former colonies' independence, counterstamping was halted in Manila by edict on March 31, 1837. Of all the Filipino counterstamped coinage, the Manila types are the rarest, with those dated 1830 being extremely rare.

In the Bank Leu Bostonian Sale, Oct. 1990, a doublestruck obverse example in Very Fine sold for \$16,380.

U.S. - PHILIPPINE COINAGE

The United States seized the Philippines from Spain in 1898. After in-depth study of the islands' needs by American economist Charles A. Conant, a new coinage based on a Peso of 100 Centavos was adopted. Designed by gifted Filipino sculptor Melecio Figueroa, the coins bore the Spanish name FILIPINAS, the U.S. shield with UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and either a Standing Lady or Seated Worker. After 1937 they bore the Arms of the new Commonwealth that preceded independence.

U.S.-Philippine coins were struck initially at Philadelphia and San Francisco, Manila after 1920, and Denver only in 1944-45. They are actually U.S. coins struck for an overseas possession and deserve close attention from American collectors. Note: most U.S.-Philippine coins appearing here originated with the great New York dealer-publisher Wayte Raymond. The coins display the highest levels of preservation, boasting generally mark- and spot-free surfaces rarely seen after nearly a century.

ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMONWEALTH COMMEMORATIVE COIN SETS, 1936

Designed by Professor Ambrosio Morales was a three-coin set including a silver 50 Centavos and 1 Peso portraying U.S. High Commissioner Frank Murphy and Commonwealth President Manuel Luis Quezon, struck with another Peso bearing the busts of U.S. President Franklin Delano Roosevelt and Quezon. Reverses bore the new Arms of the Commonwealth, an autonomous government that was to precede full independence. The coins were released at the height of the 1936 U.S. Commemorative boom to a hoped-for American market. These were the only commemoratives struck under the Commonwealth.

SOUTH AFRICAN REPUBLIC PROOF COINS

When its independence was restored after the First Anglo-Boer War in 1881, the South African Republic (Zuid-Afrikaansche Republiek, ZAR, the Transvaal) was still a poor and undeveloped frontier area. Five years later, the discovery of gold on the Witwatersrand transformed the Republic into the financial powerhouse of Southern Africa.

Under the redoubtable President Johannes Stephanus Paulus Kruger (1825-1904), a national coinage was inaugurated in 1892 on the Sterling standard. Dies for Gold, Silver and Bronze coins were prepared by Otto Schulz of the Royal Prussian Mint in Berlin.

Coins of 1892 bearing the bust of President Kruger were struck in Berlin and in the new Mint at Pretoria, South Africa. Berlin also struck an estimated 40 to 50 Proofs of each Gold and Silver denomination, and only six Bronze Proof Pennies. Proof Pennies are so rare that some meticulously pedigreed Proof Sets, including the Set presented to Jonkheer Beelaerts van Blokland by President Kruger himself contained an Uncirculated Penny. ZAR Proofs are among the most desirable coins of the African or indeed of the Commonwealth series.

The extraordinary Proofs offered below are from the collection of John J. Ford Jr., previously from the collection of F.C.C. Boyd.

The Arms of the Republic specified this device to symbolize the struggles of the Afrikaner pioneers or Voortrekkers whose overland migration was by ox wagon. Each wagon had four wheels, the two at the rear being of greater diameter. The oxen were in-spanned two by two to a single central shaft or Disselboom, but Schulz used a European cart for his model with wheels of equal size and two shafts, between which a horse might be harnessed. This error appeared only on the Silver Crown and Gold Pound and Half Pound and was corrected on replacement dies. Finding high quality Uncirculated Crowns today is a task as the heavy coins were easily marked and mishandled. UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA PROOF COINAGE

The Pretoria Mint closed during the Second Anglo-Boer war and eight years elapsed before the Cape of Good Hope, Natal, Orange River Colony (formerly Orange Free State) and the Transvaal (formerly the ZAR) joined together to form the Union of South Africa.

Under the Union, Pretoria became the administrative capital and a new Mint opened there in 1923 as a branch of the Royal Mint. South Africa's recovery from the 1899-1902 fighting was slow, and the unified nation's progress was further slowed by World War I and the Great Depression.

Coinage of King George V was first struck in 1923 and included the Bronze Farthing, Halfpenny and Penny; .800 Silver Threepence, Sixpence, Shilling, Florin (2 Shillings) and Half Crown. Gold Sovereigns and Half Sovereigns bore the standard British portrait and Pistrucci's St. George and the Dragon.

Reverses were inscribed in English (SOUTH AFRICA) and Netherlands or High Dutch (ZUID-AFRIKA). The latter was replaced in 1931 by Afrikaans (South African Dutch, SUID-AFRIKA). As seen in the lots below, several variants of denomination appear in response to the ongoing "language question" involving English, Dutch and Afrikaans. Mintages were often low, and during the 1920's many rural "poor whites" and Africans handled coins so seldom that schools were given celluloid coin replicas as teaching tools to accustom children to coins they would one day handle.

After the first date, 1923, Proofs were issued in minute quantities and few were conserved with the care modern numismatists might have wished. The following lots from the collection of John J. Ford Jr. include the finest offering of George V Proofs to appear at auction in decades.

CANADIAN CONFEDERATION MEDAL SELECTION

The Confederation of the Province of Canada (now Ontario and Quebec), Nova Scotia and New Brunswick on March 29, 1867 was commemorated by a beautiful medal designed by J.S. and A.B. Wyon. Struck in Silver and Bronze, the Canadian Confederation Medal bore a distinctive veiled bust of Queen Victoria wearing a graceful diadem and widow's veil. The allegorical reverse depicts Britannia and the British lion with figures of Agriculture, Forestry, Navigation and Mining with Latin legend hailing Canada's Youth and inherited Vigor. P.N. Breton 90, British Historical Medals 2875. BHM calls the Silver "RR," Bronze "R." Offered here are several examples of this great Canadian medal, an unparalleled opportunity for collectors of both Canadian and Commonwealth medals.

AROOSTOOK ARBITRATION MEDALS

The boundary between the Province of New Brunswick and the State of Maine was disputed and uncertain after the American Revolution and the War of 1812. Part of the dispute lay in identifying actual rivers, islands and highlands named by those writing the treaties of 1783, 1794 and 1814. Commissions meeting in St. Andrews, N.B. in 1816 and New York City in 1822 failed to agree on a line. In the Convention of 1827 King Willem I of the Netherlands was named arbitrator. The King deliberated from 1829 to 1831 but his solution was rejected by Maine and the U.S. Senate. In 1838-1839 actual shooting broke out near the forts erected by Maine, an event called the "Aroostook War." Gen. Winfield Scott took command on the U.S. side of the de facto border, ordering a truce until the Webster-Ashburton Treaty resolved the matter in 1842 by compromise. Some elements of the dispute remained unsettled as late as 1910. These rare medals are a memorial to an early failure of international arbitration as an alternative to war.



This extremely rare decoration, *Verwundetenabzeichen 20 Juli 1922*, was awarded to survivors of the bomb attempt on Hitler's life in the *Wolfschantze*, the headquarters near Rastenburg, East Prussia, that came within millimeters of ending the Nazi dictatorship. Col. Count Klaus Schenck von Stauffenberg placed the bomb, but a heavy oak conference table deflected the force of the resulting blast. In the bloody aftermath, an injured Hitler awarded this badge to surviving staff personnel. Field Marshal von Witzleben, Fabian von Schlabrendorf, former Leipzig Burgermeister Alfred Erwin von Goerdeler and 5,000 others implicated in the plot were executed summarily or after show trials before a specially constituted People's Court. PERUVIAN GOLD TRANS-ANDEAN RAILROAD MEDALS OF HENRY MEIGGS

The following four Gold medals record one of the great engineering feats in railroad history, the Trans-Andean lines build by audacious American expatriate Henry (Enrique) Meiggs (1811-1877). A New York state native, Meiggs' business career was typified by wild swings from prosperity to bankruptcy both in New York City and later in frontier San Francisco. He finally fled to South America after his embezzlements from the city of San Francisco came to light.

Re-establishing himself in Peru, Meiggs' career was again wildly chequered, and after triumphantly finishing his gravity-defying rail network he was ruined again, largely by local governmental corruption. His rail lines linked the port of Callao to the mountainous interior, joining la Oroya, Arequipa and Puno.
