

INVENTORY OF THE RENSSELAERSWYCK MANUSCRIPTS

EDITED FROM THE ORIGINAL MANUSCRIPT IN THE NEW YORK PUBLIC LIBRARY

LAST year the Library received by gift from the heirs of the late General Stephen Van Rensselaer, through the kind offices of Howard Townsend, Esq., a manuscript inventory of the papers of the Colony and Manor of Rensselaerswyck. This inventory fills 65 double pages and is written in a small folio blank book, on laid paper, having as watermarks the Royal arms of Great Britain and "L. Paine," the name of the papermaker. In the history of New York the papers to which the inventory relates have been cited, collectively, as "the Rensselaerswyck Manuscripts."

In a memorandum received from Mr. Townsend, he says: "My first knowledge of these papers was information given to me by my mother, that they were kept in the old building, known as the Manor House office, opposite the Manor House in Albany. This office was built somewhere about 1660 to 1680. Its removal took place only a year or two ago. The papers were contained in numerous canvas bags... During his last days, my great-grandfather, the old Patroon, I have been told, made but little effort to collect his rents. Consequently, at his death, when my grandfather found it necessary to collect them, he discovered a tenantry quite unwilling to continue the practice of paying. One favorite argument was, that they had paid in rent the equivalent of the value of the farm and therefore in equity were not compelled to make any further payments. You remember the Anti-Rent Wars which succeeded and which were followed by attacks on the Van Rensselaers, not merely by the tenants but by the State. This litigation lasted for many years and, while it was uniformly in favor of the Van Rensselaers, the result was a change in the constitution [of the State of New York] forbidding agricultural leases for over twelve years. The Van Rensselaer leases were in perpetuity -'as long as grass grew or water ran.' My great-great-grandfather, Stephen Van Rensselaer, died in 1769, leaving his son, later to be known as the old Patroon, only five years of age. An executor of the Patroon's will and the

guardian of his children was his brother-in-law, Abraham Ten Broeck, one of the prominent men of that period. Another executor was the testator's father-in-law, Philip Livingston, a signer of the Declaration of Independence. The widow was an executrix but lost her office by her re-marriage with Eilardus Westerlo, the clergyman or Dominie at Albany." Mr. Townsend also adds: "When the Patroon became of age two years after his marriage to Margaret Schuyler, daughter of General Philip Schuyler, his guardian deemed it wise to account. Evidently young Van Rensselaer was not in the neighborhood, so Ten Broeck prepared a list of these papers, giving the number of bags of them, and a summary of the contents of each bag. He then, in the presence of witnesses, stated that he had delivered these papers to Stephen Van Rensselaer."

In the heading of the inventory three persons are named, of whom some information here is desirable.² These are Stephen Van Rensselaer, patroon; his son, Stephen, later patroon, and Abraham Ten Broeck, guardian and an executor of the latter. The son was fifth in a direct line of descent from Kiliaen van Rensselaer, the original patroon of the colony of Rensselaerswyck, through Kiliaen, the fifth patroon, and the eldest son of Jeremias, the third patroon. It was to this Kiliaen that Queen Anne had confirmed the estate in 1704, he being the second lord of the Manor. The old Dutch patroonship, which had continued under English rule, was in the time of Governor Thomas Dongan erected into a lordship as the Manor of Rensselaerswyck, the patent dated November 4, 1685. The patentee was Kiliaen, nephew of Jeremias and a son of Johannes. It was this Kiliaen who was the first lord of the manor and fourth patroon. Among the large privileges which accompanied the manorial jurisdiction was representation in the provincial assembly, a right that was exercised by the proprietors themselves or by proxy, and which uniformly was allied with the side of popular liberty. "The last of the representatives was that stern patriot and whig, General Abraham Ten Broeck. He was the uncle of the last Mr. [General Stephen] Van Rensselaer...and his guardian in his non-age, and had a right, therefore, to speak and act in the name of his ward."

This last Stephen Van Rensselaer was born on November 1, 1764, in New York City, son of the seventh patroon or fourth lord of the manor, and Catharine Livingston, daughter of Philip Livingston, a Signer of the Declaration of Independence. The new Manor House was under construction at his birth and was only finished a year later. In 1769, the father Stephen died, leaving the five-year old Stephen, as heir to all his landed and feudal estates, and in his minority the management thereof fell upon his uncle, who was the guardian of the deceased Stephen's children, as well as an executor of his testament. At the age of nineteen, the younger Stephen married Margaret, a daughter of General Philip Schuyler. He rose to eminence as a statesman, major general, and chancellor of the University of the State of New York.

His part in the advancement of agriculture, science, education, and the Erie Canal, among many notable services, is entwined in the history of New York. He died at Albany, on January 26, 1839.

Stephen's guardian for sixteen years was his uncle, General Abraham Ten Broeck, son of the Hon. Dirck Ten Broeck (b. 1686; d. 1751), mayor of Albany, 1746-1748, and Margarita Cuyler. Abraham was born on May 13, 1734, and died on January 19, 1810. He married Elizabeth Van Rensselaer, on November 1, 1763, which was just one year to the day before the younger Stephen Van Rensselaer was born. Abraham Ten Broeck was one of Albany's most prominent citizens. From 1760-1765, he sat in the colonial assembly. In 1775, he became a member of the New York provincial congress; in the same year he was a delegate to the continental congress, and was commissioned a colonel in the militia of New York, becoming a general the next year. In that year, 1776, he was president of the New York convention, and of the committee of safety. From 1780-1783, he was a senator of the State, and from 1781-1794 was a justice of the court of common pleas. He served twice as mayor of Albany, from 1779-1783, and from 1796-1798. By profession he was a lawyer, and from 1792-1798, he was also president of the Bank of Albany.

Among the historians who had the freedom of access to the Rensselaers-wyck manuscripts the most noted was Dr. Edmund Bailey O'Callaghan. In the first volume of his *History of New Netherland* (New York, 1848, p. 9), he makes acknowledgment: "To General Stephen Van Rensselaer," to whom he is "behoulden...in a special degree, for the very handsome and unreserved manner in which that gentleman placed in his hands, his extensive and valuable collection of MSS., from which the chapter on the early settlement of Rensselaerswyck has been almost exclusively compiled, and many interesting papers borrowed, which are now given, for the first time, to the public." O'Callaghan adds: "From the account books and court records of that 'Colonie' have, also, been arranged the prices of imported merchandise, stock, and country produce; the list of the settlers under the first Patroon, and other tables which will be found in the Appendix." These translations appear in appendices of both volumes of his *History*.

The Rensselaerswyck manuscripts were in large number destroyed or damaged in the Capitol fire at Albany on March 29, 1911. The history of these valuable papers, just prior to the conflagration, is worth stating here. At a meeting of the board of regents of the University of the State of New York, on March 31, 1910, the commissioner of education reported⁵ that "a year or more since, the late William Bayard Van Rensselaer, of the city of Albany, delivered to the State Library a large collection of original Van Rensselaer

manuscript_[S]. Since then, other and perhaps still more valuable Van Rensselaer manuscripts, some of them going back to the very early history of New Netherland, have come into the possession of the Library.⁶ It is said that the legal title to these papers is in the Van Rensselaer estate, of which there are three trustees who have not been altogether agreed as to the final disposition of these and possibly other papers which they control. There is much discussion of the subject, and it now seems to be the disposition of at least a majority of the trustees to release the claim over the papers to the State of New York, upon conditions which have been discussed between us. With a view to this end, I recommend the adoption of the following by your Board:

"In the event that the manuscripts relating to the manor of Rensselaers-wyck now in the possession of the Van Rensselaer estate (including any which may later be discovered and which shall be identified as belonging to the same series) be transferred to the New York State Library, becoming its absolute property, the Regents of the University of the State of New York do hereby definitely engage as follows." Then followed the recommendation in several paragraphs, which, being part of a subsequent contract, is omitted here. But these recommendations, as such, were adopted by the regents at this meeting.

At a meeting of the board of regents, on January 25, 1911,8 the commissioner of education reverted to his communication of March 31, 1910, and said: "Your Board approved my suggestions, and assurances as to care, classification, mounting, translation, editing, and publication of the manuscripts were duly given, as proposed." He reported that a "desirable understanding" had been "reached after much discussion," and called attention to the "particular obligation" that was due "Mr. Howard Townsend, Vice President of the Van Rensselaer Land Company of this [Albany] city, for interest in the matter." The following agreement had been entered into, on November 26–29, 1910, between the commissioner of education on behalf of the regents of the University of the State of New York, on the one part, and the Van Rensselaer Land Company, acting through Mr. Townsend as its vice-president, and Mr. Eugene Van Rensselaer, as the sole surviving executor of the estate of General Stephen Van Rensselaer, acting as parties of the second part. This agreement, which the board of regents approved by vote, reads as follows:

"Whereas there are many important and valuable papers and manuscripts relating to the manor of Rensselaerswyck now in the possession or under the control of the Van Rensselaer Land Company and the Van Rensselaer estate, many of which are deposited for safe-keeping in the New York State Library at Albany, N. Y.; and it being desirable that all such papers and manuscripts now deposited in the said Library together with such other manuscripts of a similar series or nature relating to the said manor of Rensselaerswyck, and belonging to the said company or estate, as may be hereafter discovered, should be formally transferred to the Regents of the University of the State of New York for and in behalf of the State; and the said Regents having adopted, at a regular meeting held by them on the 31st day of March, 1910, a resolution engaging to perform certain services in respect to such manuscripts; and the said Van Rensselaer Land Company through its board of directors,

at a meeting held at Albany, N. Y., on the 18th day of August, 1910, having adopted a resolution authorizing and empowering the Vice President of such company, Mr. Howard Townsend, to accept the offer of the State in relation to such papers and directing him to execute in the name of the company any documents necessary to carry into effect the provisions of said offer;

"Now, this indenture witnesseth that the said parties of the second part hereby transfer and assign to the said party of the first part, on behalf of the State of New York, all right, title and interest in and to all papers and manuscripts relating to the manor of Rensselaers-wyck, now in the possession of the Van Rensselaer Land Company and the Van Rensselaer estate, and which have from time to time been deposited in the New York State Library by representatives of the Van Rensselaer family or the Van Rensselaer Land Company, together with such other papers and manuscripts as may be hereafter discovered, which shall be identified as belonging to the same series or pertaining to the same subject matter; which papers and manuscripts are more definitely described in the 'Description of Van Rensselaer Papers' hereto annexed and here referred to for the purpose of indicating the nature and characteristics of such papers and manuscripts." And the said party of the first part, in consideration of the said transfer and assignment, hereby covenants and agrees:

- "1. To classify and arrange this material either topically or chronologically, as may seem best to serve the purposes of historical research.
- "2. To mount each manuscript carefully and suitably with reference to its proper preservation and easy consultation.
- "3. To calendar and index the manuscripts and to hold the entire collection at the service of scholars.
- "4. To cause these documents to be competently translated and edited and to publish everything that shall be found to be of interest to local or national history. The words 'that shall be found to be of interest' to be construed liberally and to cover, so far as can be decided by a preliminary examination, presumably the greater part of the collection. This work of translation and editing to be done coincidently with the regular work of the Manuscript Section of the State Library, and the results to be published as soon as possible in the form of a supplement to the volume of Van Rensselaer Bowier manuscripts issued by the State Library in 1908.
- "5. It is further agreed by the said party of the first part that the original Dongan Charter which is among the papers under discussion, and any other documents of equal dignity, shall be properly exhibited under safe conditions in the quarters of the State Library upon completion of the State Education Building."

The aforesaid agreement became effective with the vote of adoption of the board of regents on January 25, 1911, and the Board also approved the recommendation for the employment of "an assistant to the archivist...in order to facilitate the classification and publication of the Van Rensselaer manuscripts coincidently with the early Dutch records of the State." On March 29th, of this year, only about two months after the agreement had been adopted, the tragic as well as inexcusable fire of the Albany Capitol occurred, which all but consumed the New York State Library, the archives and historical manuscripts in its custody, the State Museum, and other divisions under the board of regents, as well as other departments of the Government of the State of New York. In this conflagration, it has been already intimated, the havoc to the Rensselaerswyck manuscripts was great. The few pieces that had been in the commissioner's safe were not in the zone of the fire, hence survived intact.

This description is especially detailed with respect to certain items that were removed to the office of the commissioner of education, and therefore escaped the Capitol fire. The list is printed in *Journal* of the Board of Regents, Jan. 25, 1911, p. 345-349.

When the board of regents met on June 22, 1911, report¹¹ was made as follows:

"Rensselaerswyck manuscripts, 1634–1870. This collection included some 200 volumes of ledger and journal accounts, 1,000 Dutch letters, 3,000 leases, 500 maps and surveys, and 25,000 miscellaneous manuscripts, embracing commissions, land patents, contracts, deeds, poll lists, tax lists, colonial muster rolls, and other papers of a public or semipublic character relating to the territory covered by the former Manor of Rensselaerswyck. The manuscripts saved include, besides those already mentioned as being in the safe in the Commissioner's office, nearly all the early Dutch account books, some 50 later account books, Anthony de Hooges's memorandum book, 1643–48, the court record of 1648–52, the letter book of Jeremias van Rensselaer of 1660–74, records of the Tivoli Manufacturing Company, 1836–40, a few letters and muster rolls and about 1,000 leases."

The saved pieces that were in the safe of the commissioner of education, are referred to thus:

"After the transfer to the Library of the Van Rensselaer Papers, the following documents from that collection were added to the number in the safe:

"Map of the Colony of Rensselaerswyck, of about 1632.

"Patent of the Colony of Rensselaerswyck, 1685.

"Commissions in the militia, as justice of the peace and as commissioner for Indian affairs to various members of the Van Rensselaer family, 1670-1768. 21 documents.

"Commission to Philip Schuyler as major general in the Continental Army, 1775, and as surveyor general of the State of New York, 1781.

"Letters of freedom and citizenship of Albany granted to Jeremy Van Rensselaer, 1733, and to Stephen Van Rensselaer, 1763.

"Draft of commission to Tuenis¹² Van der Volgen as deputy ranger of the County of Albany, from Jeremiah Van Rensselaer, 1732.

The text of the inventory is printed here verbatim, with such adjustments of paragraphing and indentation as were necessary to a systematic typographical presentation. The text is not without errors. The annotations are designed principally to correct these, wherever they have been discovered.

THE INVENTORY


