## Ford Part XXII: An Important Cross Section of American Paper Currency

The events of history are often chronicled by the numismatic items we collect, examine and study. A voracious appetite for - and an inquisitive approach to - coins, medals and paper money is the fundamental seed that advances the field of numismatics. The John J. Ford, Jr. Collection of Numismatic American History stands among the giants of great American numismatic cabinets. The 21 volumes of Ford auction sales catalogs represent a diversity of numismatic genres and classification that few numismatists have ever accumulated. Whenever a particularly thorny question arises, today's numismatic researchers (and likely tomorrow's) will typically reach for their Ford catalogs first, whether the subject is American Colonial coins and medals, Western Americana or American Paper Currency.

After nearly six years since the gavel fell on the final lot of the Ford Part XXI sale in Cctober 2007, we are thrilled to offer the remaining tokens, medals and paper money from The John J. Ford, Jr. Collection at the August 2013 ANA World's Fair of Money. The paper currency and related items in this Ford Part XXII catalog includes Colonial and Continental Currency duplicates from the Boyd-Haseltine-ChapmanRaymond collections, Obsolete Currency and Fractional Currency from the legendary F.C.C. Boyd Collection. The 540 lots in this catalog contain items from these pedigree core collections and also from the former inventory of the New Netherlands Coin Company, where Mr. Ford was a partner.

This sale, relatively brief when compared to the combined auctions sold over the last decade or so, features an excellent cross-section of American paper money from 1708 until just after the Civil War. Mr. Ford was ahead of his time in his appreciation of Colonial, Continental, Obsolete and Fractional currency. When mainstream American numismatics and federal coins were in vogue, he always chose to buy in these less conventional fields and did so when prices were very reasonable and rarities were available. Included for sale here are select individual rarities and high grade examples, as well as introductory collection groups and wholesale accumulations in several fields. Some of the highlights include a 1708 Massachusetts Bay Bill of Credit, several 1778 York-town series Continental notes, discovery Obsolete Bank proof notes, and fascinating Fractional Currency experimental notes that originated with Spencer M. Clark at Treasury.

Please enjoy this eclectic selection of American Paper Currency, which adds the most illustrious pedigrees to their intrinsic histories.

# VERY RARE MASSACHUSETTS 170840 SHILLINGS NOTE

There is a subtle red under tint with ornate cursive "AR" (Anna Regina). Detailed obligation runs across the bill. Bottom left with English emblem and motto HONI SOI QUI MAL Y PENSE. The bill has inked "signatures" of Elisha Hutchinson. Penn Townsend, and Samuel Chockley. The top of both sides has scrollwork with the back in red.

We are not familiar with any genuine bills surviving from this extremely early and important Massachusetts Bay issue. This contemporary counterfeit is the only type ever encountered and is extremely rare. The early unsophisticated currency printing technique of this 1708 issue led to an incentive toward nefarious activity among the mostly Puritan population. Two of the lower denominations of this issue were recalled in 1713 due to extensive counterfeiting. This bill, deceptively made, but identified in the period, was marked counterfeit on the face within the signatures and this has an attempted erasure causing a "blurry" patch. It was a particularly bold counterfeiting effort as the three signers were prominent local leaders. There is a penned endorsement on the back which may have been accomplished to create the appearance of a genuine bill. If authentic. this bill would easily be valued as a $\$ 50.000$ and up colonial currency note. For reference, a $1690 / 91$ Massachusetts Bay second series bill achieved $\$ 172.500$ at our August 2011 ANA sale. A historically important Colonial item and the only the second we have offered at Stacks Bowers Galleries. The final remaining example of three examples in the Boyd Collection and cited in the Ford III catalogue. Quarter folded, the vertical is harder creased. Slight split at the left with a crude back paper patch. Most importantly, this is a very rare example of one of the very few early circulating paper currencies of Colonial America pre-dating 1709. As such. its historical significance cannot be overstated.

The society engraved and printed these notes from the United States for use at the newly formed Republic of Liberia, capitol Monrovia.

This society, which was founded in 1816 at the Davis Hotel in D.C., was not about abolition and anti-slavery or about integrating freed blacks into America. Instead, the idea was that Monrovia was to be a place to "expel" the freed black population to avoid social integration, risk of slave rebellion assistance, and competition with white labor. Prominent Quakers, who were among many of the founders, benevolently believed that this repatriation would be better for these newly freed blacks, socially and economically. Among the society's founders was Henry Clay (pictured on the $\$ 3$ note from this series) of Kentucky, who held an extreme view regarding the integration of freed blacks into American culture and the risks it would pose to the white populace and economy. The society sold memberships and even received $\$ 100,000$ of funds from Congress. This extremely well engraved proof comes from an exceedingly rare series of notes with few survivors properly filled in and actually used in Liberia. We have always considered this eminently collectible in the American series. We have auctioned three denominations from the unique partial proof sheet from this series sold at Christie's in 1990. Two were in our January 2003 Americana sales. The unique 50 Cents proof realized $\$ 2,645$ and a One Dollar proof (two found on the sheet) brought $\$ 3,450$. The full banknote sized, superbly rendered and pedigreed $\$ 3$ proof from that sheet was sold in the June 201052 Collection part I sale for $\$ 9,775.00$. The margins are a bit tight, but extremely rare and important.
