#### NOTE

This Bibliography, which is based, by kind permission of Mr. J. C. Squire, upon one which appeared in "The London Mercury," only aims at completeness as regards English and Irish first editions. Occasionally, however, an American or new edition, important for textual or other reasons, has been included. Contributions to periodicals, such as, for instance, the Dun Emer Press Broadside, are not mentioned.

In the matter of pagination, only pages which form part of the printer's sheets of the book in question are included; no account of publisher's announcements, etc., which may be bound up in the volume, has been taken; pages given in brackets are those which have not been counted in the printed pagination of the book. Bindings have only been described in a few cases in which it seemed necessary to do so. Measurements, which are those of the page and not of the binding, are given in inches.
