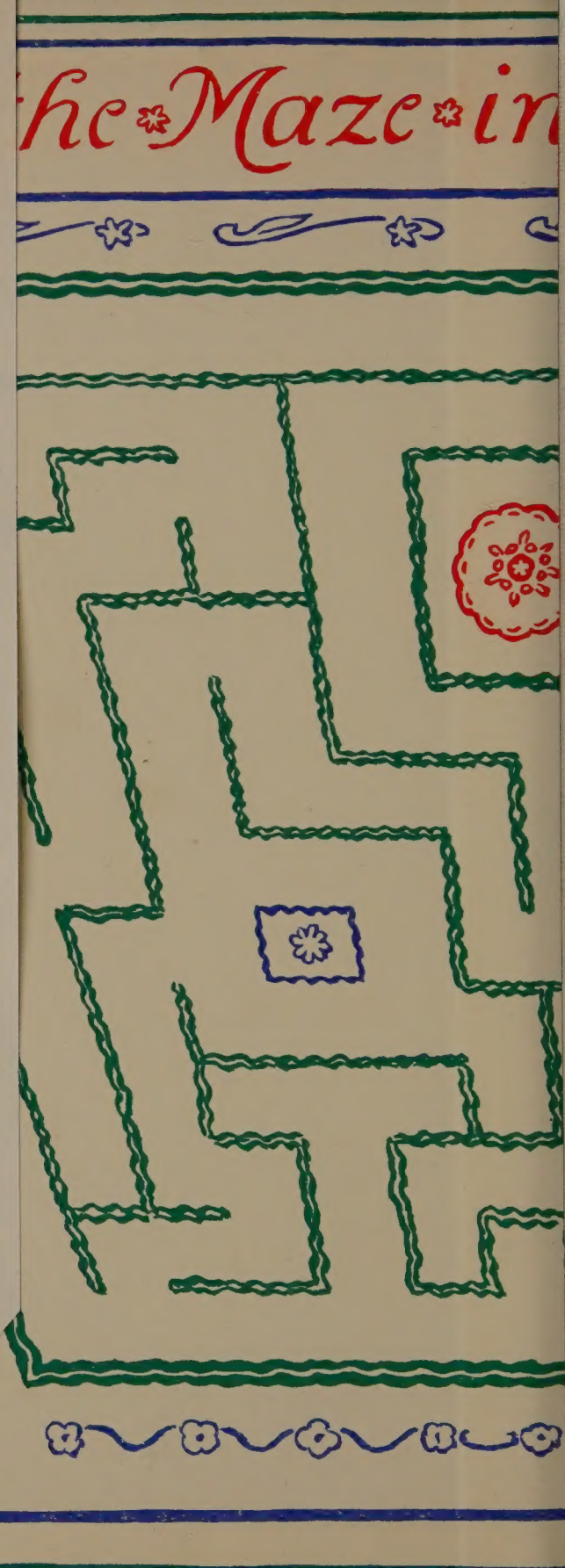

“Leslie Brooke was born in 1862 and died in 1940 having ensured for himself a place among the immortals.

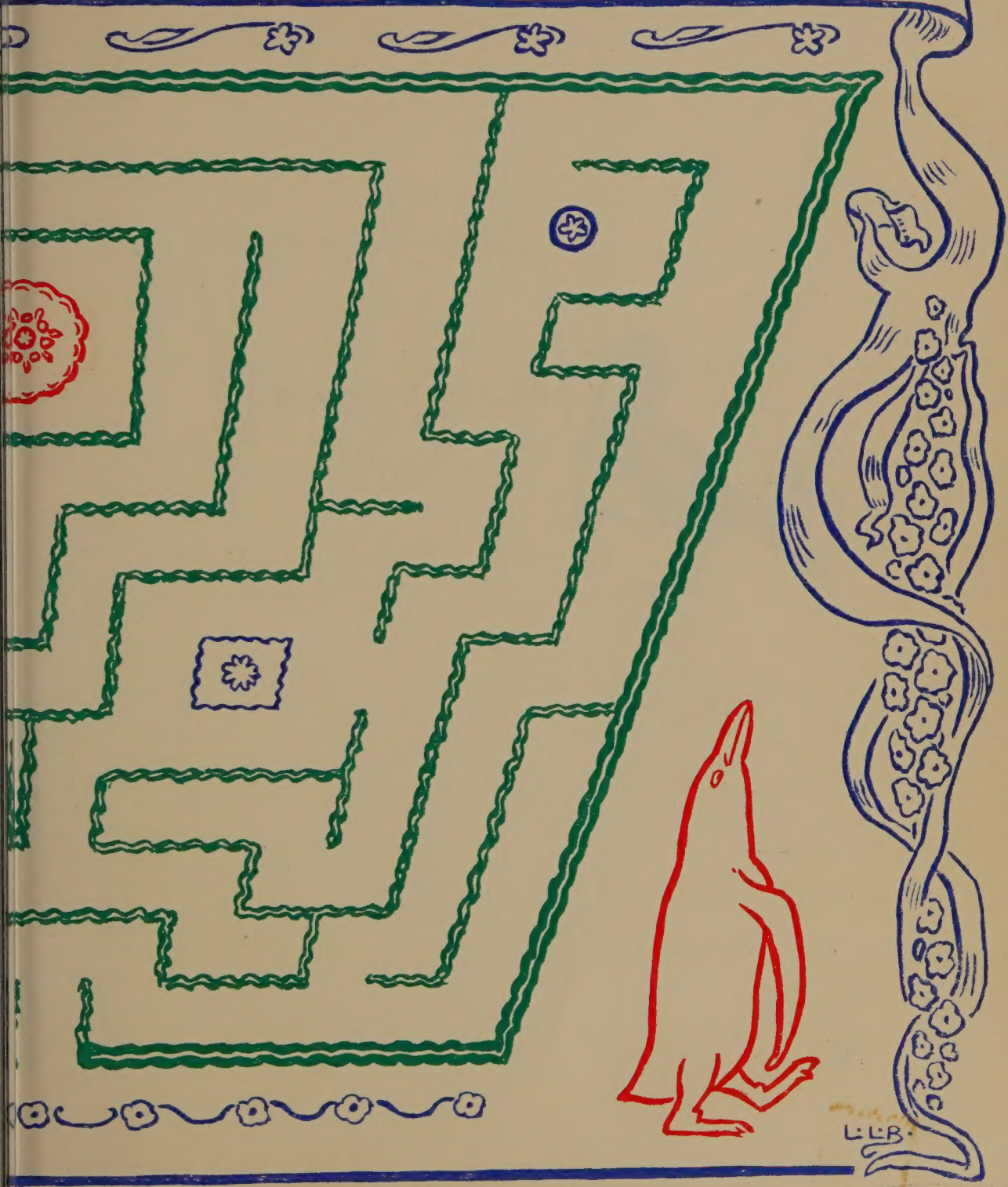
