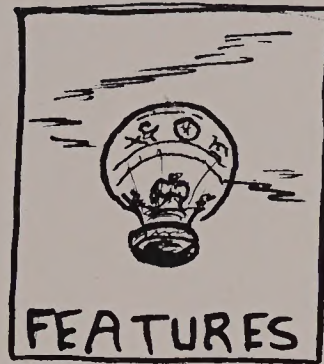
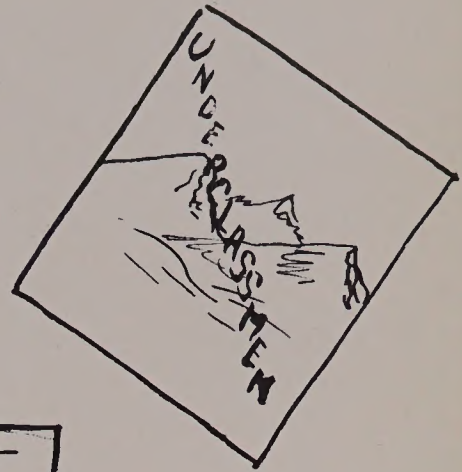
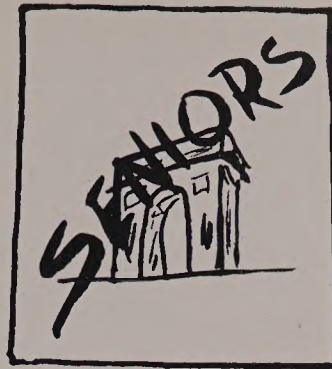


Foreword

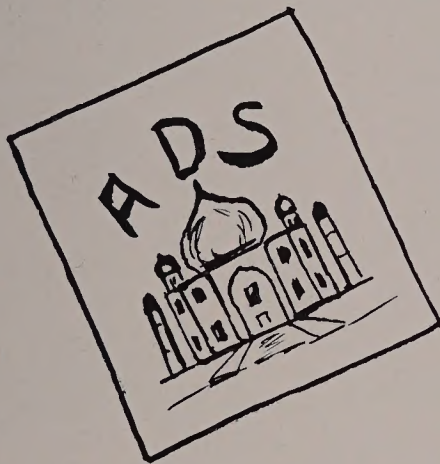

Class History

No matter how far behind they were the Maroon and Gold eleven did not quit, and for this they can be commended.

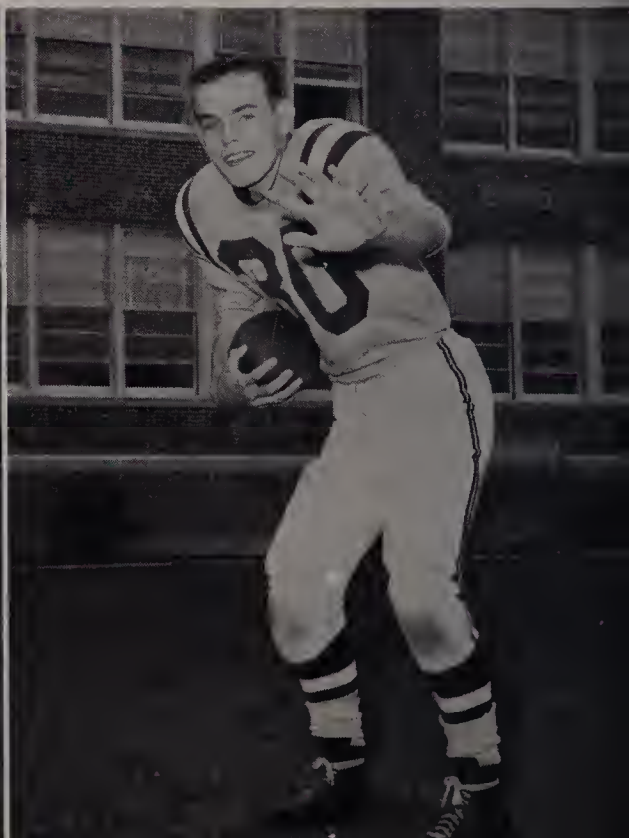
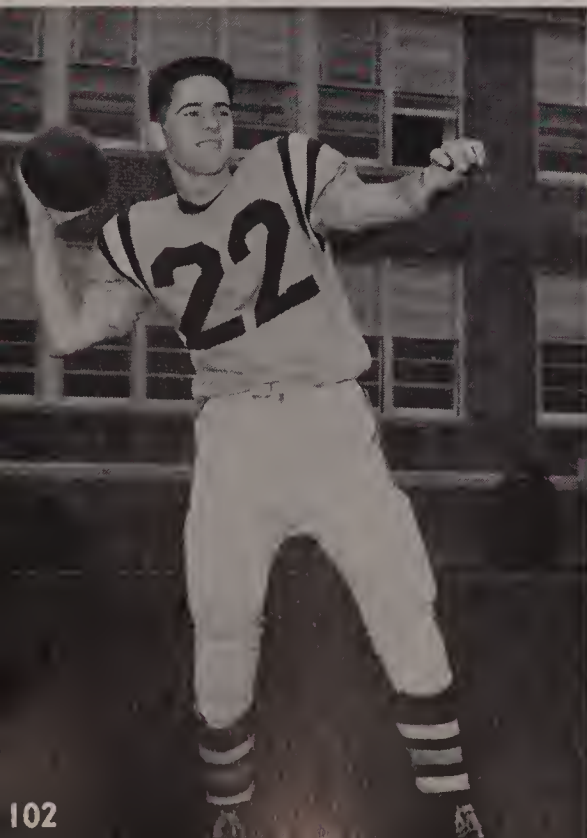
