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LAW SCHOOL. — For some time it has been proposed to build an addition to Austin Hall in order to meet the continued growth of the School, and it has now been definitely decided to extend the north wing, at a slight angle, for about seventy-five feet. In addition to the basement there will be five floors in the extension. The southern part of the lower four of these will be occupied by the new stack, which will have space for about two hundred and forty thousand volumes; the remainder of these four floors will contain eighteen desks and fourteen rooms for Professors, the Librarian's room, a room for cataloguing, and two delivery Two lecture rooms will occupy the top floor, one about the size of the present North room, the other somewhat smaller than the East and West rooms. The main building will remain practically unaltered except that the space now occupied by the office and stack will be added to the reading room, thus giving about one hundred additional seats. A turret will mark the junction of the extension and the main building on the east, and an entrance on the west will lead to stairs connecting with the new lecture rooms. Work will at once be begun upon these alterations, which are expected to be completed in about one year.
