THE OBJECTS OF THE SOCIETY are to encourage geographical exploration and discovery ; to investigate and disseminate new geographical information by discussion, lectures and publications ; to establish in the chief maritime city of the country, for the benefit of commerce, navigation, and the great industrial and material interests of the United States, a place where the means will be afforded of obtaining accurate information for public use of every part of the habitable globe. The Society has been in existence twenty-nine years. It has a geographical library of thirteen thousand volumes, and a large and very valuable collection of Maps, Charts, and Atlases relating to every part of the world. It publishes a Bulletin, an annual Journal, and co-operates and interchanges information with one hundred and twenty domestic and foreign Geographical and other Scientific Societies.

The initiation fee and annual dues of a Fellow for the first year are \$10; and the dues \$10 yearly thereafter. Life Fellowship, free from all dues, \$100.
