3. Summarized lessons at regular intervals give frequent and consistent reviews.

4. Rhymes, folksongs, and other poems furnish fine exercises for memory work, and are excellent aids in pronunciation, intonation and rhythm, not gained by reading only prose.

5. Selections for reading are chosen to give a variety in style and subject matter as well as added vocabulary, ultimately enabling the student to enter upon easy Norse literature with pleasure.

Miss Michelet's standard text-book, First Year Norse, is used in all the High Schools of Minneapolis, and generally throughout the Northwest.
