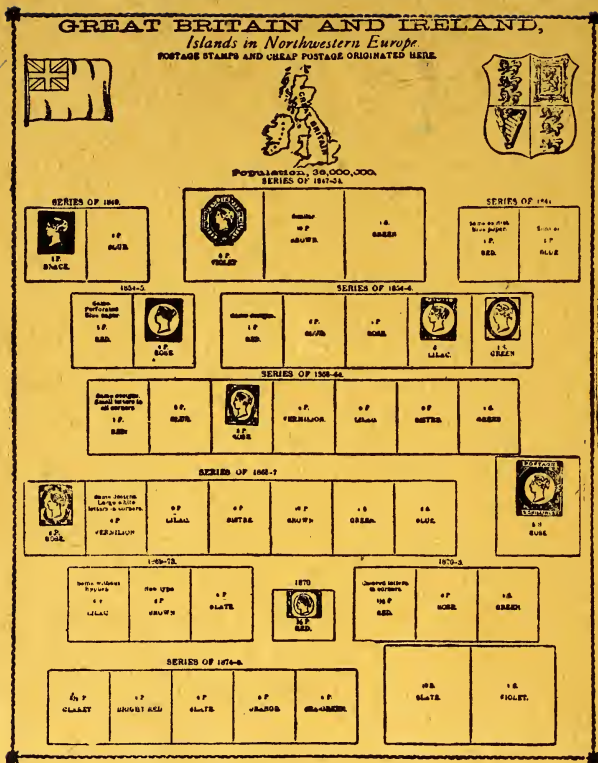

TERMS USED TO DEFINE THE VARIOUS PARTS OF A COIN

The front or face of a coin is called the **obverse**. O. Obv.

The back is called the **reverse**. R. Rev.

The principal device or object represented on a coin is called the **type**.

The area or space between the type and the circumference is called the **field**.

The lower portion of the area of a coin beneath the type and separated from the rest of the field by a horizontal line is called the **exergue**. Ex. This particular place on coins, with or without the separating line, is commonly referred to as **Ex**.

Small objects represented either in the field or the exergue as adjuncts to the main type are called **symbols**.

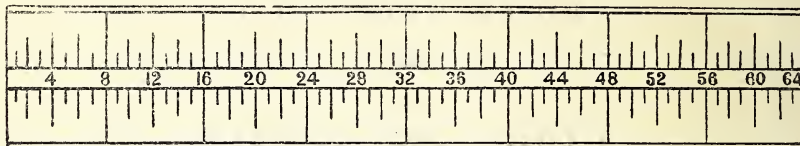
Portions of a coin which are sunk below the level of the surface are said to be **incuse**.

Over-dates. When a die made in one year, is used in a later year, by engraving one figure over another, the piece struck therefrom is said to be an "over-date." For instance, the same die from which the Cents of 1806 was struck, was used in 1807, by sinking a 7 over the 6, and portions of the latter figure are plainly visible. Hence the variety "1807 over 1806, etc.



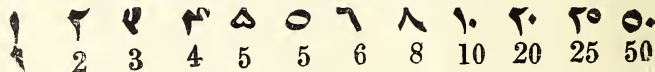
Millimeters.

MILLIMETER SCALE.



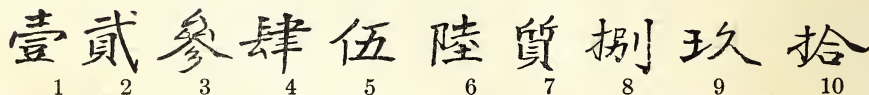
AMERICAN COIN SCALE.

ARABIC, USED ON TURKISH AND PERSIAN COINS.

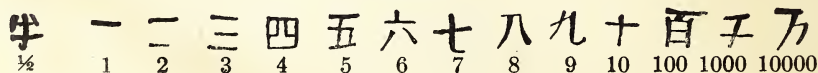

PREFACE

I T IS TO THE INTEREST OF EVERY STUDENT AND INTENDING BUYER TO READ THIS.

In presenting a new edition of the Copper Coin Catalogue to the numismatic fraternity we believe we are supplying a work that will prove of great benefit to the general buyer and of interest to all students of history.

The list has been brought up to the present year and many corrections and additions made throughout the book.

To this edition has been added a complete list of the Roman Emperors and each of their families that have been represented on copper coins. It is hoped this will be a great help to the average collector as this is the first time that the magnificent coinage of old Rome has been placed before the public in a concise and simple manner. We shall do our best to fill orders in as satisfactory manner as is possible with this class of coins.

We have followed the general plan of the Silver Coin Catalogue by placing the colonial issues after the parent country, so that all may be studied together and the danger of incorrect attribution lessened.

The engraving has been placed at the head of each set as showing the general design of the issue, while the particular piece illustrated is indicated by an asterisk (*). Given the diameter of one piece in the set, the size of all the other values can easily be computed. The plates illustrating the different monograms found on coins will be found a great advance over the simple letters heretofore printed, as in many cases the devices are too intricate to be followed without a clearer clue than that afforded by the letters. In many cases the monogram is the sole indication of the issuing country or ruler.

The general scope of the work is to supply with reasonable abbreviations a catalogue of copper coins issued since the revival of the industrial world from its long sleep in the dark ages of Europe. The awakening was signaled by the introduction of copper money as a medium of trade. It gave universal satisfaction for nearly three hundred years. The past few decades have indicated a preference for a lighter metal and the base coinage of the various nations has been gradually changing, first to smaller bronze coins and now to nickel, which will probably supply the minor coinage of the world for some generations.

The absence of price indicates that the piece is rare and seldom in stock. There are, however, some series issued within the past few years that have scarcely appeared here, and just at present we are unable to supply them; these are also unpriced.

Base or billon pieces are composed of a mixture of copper and silver.

A long dash (—) shows where the legend divides, when one part reads upward and the other downward. A perpendicular dash (|) shows the inscription is in lines so divided.

Date enclosed thus: (), signifies the period or date of issue, when not on the piece.

Klippe—square pieces.

We do not claim to enumerate here every copper coin known, but those most likely to be met with and obtainable at a reasonable sum. We frequently, however, have pieces not mentioned in these pages, and should be pleased to have our patrons name such as they may desire.

We sometimes have intermediate grades of U. S. Cents, as, for instance, we may quote fair 50c., good \$1.00, and yet have one we price at 75c.

Our experience is that collectors when ordering, too often select the lowest priced coins. This is especially the case with the beginner. It must not, however, be considered as the best bargain, by reason of being the cheapest or lowest grade. It affords in most instances, what may be termed ordinary specimens, which to the collector who remains in the field, soon become unsatisfactory.

The best returns are from the choicest specimens; a coin in absolute perfection is the pride of the advanced numismatist.

It is well to enumerate in your order a number of coins which will exceed in value the amount of your remittance. It is impossible to keep a full line of every series. No dealer in the world can do this. Stock is constantly changing through the daily transactions of our business.

Dates.—In filling orders for Foreign Coins, when more than one date is given, as Hayti, 1829-46, we do not agree to furnish any particular year. Where a special date is required the price will sometimes be higher, as value is regulated according to the supply.

Postage.—The prices given do not include postage, which should be added at the rate of one cent per ounce, and ten cents for registration. The latter is optional, but if not registered, orders are filled at purchaser's risk. It is much better to make selections to the amount of \$1 and upwards, and have them registered, than to send small orders at the risk of ordinary mail. We, however, recommend express for all valuable packages or pieces. We cannot hold ourselves responsible for letters or parcels lost in transit in the mails.

Orders for less than twenty-five cents are respectfully declined.

Remittances should be made by draft on New York, or P. O. Money Order, payable to The J. W. Scott Co., Ltd., or in registered letter. Local checks are subject to discount.

We are always prepared to buy coins, **Fine** or uncirculated U. S. and Colonial pieces being always in demand at high prices.

THE HERALDRY OF COINS

THE heraldry of coins has received careful attention, and special pains has been taken to give it with accuracy, and with sufficient freedom from technical terms to be easily understood, if the following explanations are kept in mind. A limited use of heraldic terms has been unavoidable. The arms of the ruler, or of the country, are given under the name, with the colors—heraldically called “metals” and “tinctures.” **Metals** are silver (argent) and gold (or), and are represented by white and yellow, when the arms are drawn in colors. **Tinctures** are the other colors, such as red (gules), blue (azure), green (vert), black (sable), etc. These colors are indicated on coins by conventional lines: gold is shown by dots; red by perpendicular lines; blue by horizontal lines; green by diagonal lines drawn from the observer’s left downward to the right, and black by perpendicular and horizontal lines crossed; silver or white is shown by blank spaces; but as the lines denoting colors are not invariably cut in the dies, a blank space, unless there are other indicative lines, does not necessarily mean that the field is silver.

The lines dividing the shield have specific names: a single perpendicular line divides a shield “per pale” [Wurtemberg, 1864]; one drawn horizontally, “per fess” [Buenos Ayres]; and a diagonal from observer’s left to right, “per bend” [Utrecht]. If divided into parts by lines drawn at right angles to each other, it is said to be “quarterly,” whether of four or more; four always being implied unless more are mentioned. A perpendicular stripe on the centre of the field is called a “pale;” a wide horizontal one a “fess,” but if it occupies the upper third a “chief” [Papal States, Pius VI]; a narrow fess is a “bar,” and a diagonal stripe, a “bend” [Baden, 1870]; if the latter is drawn from observer’s right to left, it is a “bend sinister.” The “chevron” is familiar to all. If several stripes appear, the field is said to be “bendy” or “paly” [Papal States, 1750]; several horizontal stripes are “barry” [Hungary], “bars” being merely diminutives of the fess, but a single bar is never borne alone. It is also customary to mention the number of stripes, or “pieces;” for instance, the thirteen perpendicular stripes on our national arms would be styled “paly of thirteen pieces, red and silver [or gules and argent],” though the word “pieces” is not always used. A combination of diagonal with perpendicular stripes would result in forming a lozenge-shaped figure covering the field (as on the Bavarian arms, 1871), and it would be called “paly-bendy.” If the edge of a stripe is not plain, it is described as “wavy,” “engrailed,” etc., as the case may be.

The left side of a shield as seen by the observer is, of course, the right side of him who bears it, and hence it is called the “dexter,” which is the principal, or more honorable side, and the other, or bearer’s left, is the sin-

ister. A husband bears his arms on the dexter side, and his wife's on the sinister. So when two countries are united, it is not unusual to place the arms of the conquering or more powerful country on the dexter, and those of the other on the sinister. For example, in the present arms of Great Britain, the lions of England have the first or dexter quarter, the Scottish lion the second, the harp of Ireland the third, and England is repeated in the fourth quarter. The upper part of the shield is styled the "chief," and the lower the "base." The student will thus be enabled to understand the divisions, and thereby to locate the place of the devices. The various stripes above described are called "ordinaries," as distinguished from the "common charges," i. e., figures or other devices; they take their names from military terms—the pale from the paling which surrounded a camp; the fess from the foss or ditch, and the bend, probably from the sash worn across the breast. If devices are placed one above another, they are said to be "in pale" [Dantzic]; if in that position on a stripe, it is named; as for instance, "three lions in pale" means that they are placed one above the other on the central part of the shield; but "three lions on a pale," are placed on a perpendicular stripe. And so of the other "ordinaries."

A few other explanations will be all that is needed to understand the descriptions which mention the "charges," or small figures borne on coats-of-arms. An eagle is usually represented as "displayed," that is, with wings and talons outstretched [Brandenburg]; a lion, if erect on his hind legs, is "rampant" [Chur-Phalz]; if crossing the field, "passant;" if his head is turned to the observer, he is "gardant," and this term qualifies the other attitudes in which he may be placed, as "passant gardant" [Guernesey], etc. Swords, spears, etc., crossed in the form of an X are "in saltire" [Scotland]; "dimidiated," used usually when two coats are united, denotes that only half of the figure is shown [Wismar], the other half being supposed to be concealed by the adjacent portion of an overlapping shield. "Billey," shows that the field is "semee" or strewn with little blocks in the form of a billet or letter envelope [Netherlands, 1863]. A "mullet" resembles a five pointed star, but heraldic "stars" have six or more points [Waldeck]; crosses are of many forms, and each form has its distinctive name, dependent on the shape of the branches or of their terminations. A "Greek" cross has four equal arms, with parallel sides and square ends [Switzerland]; a "patriarchs" cross has two cross bars, at the top, the upper being the shorter [Hungary]. We cannot mention here only the most commonly used charges. The other heraldic terms used have been explained when they occur.

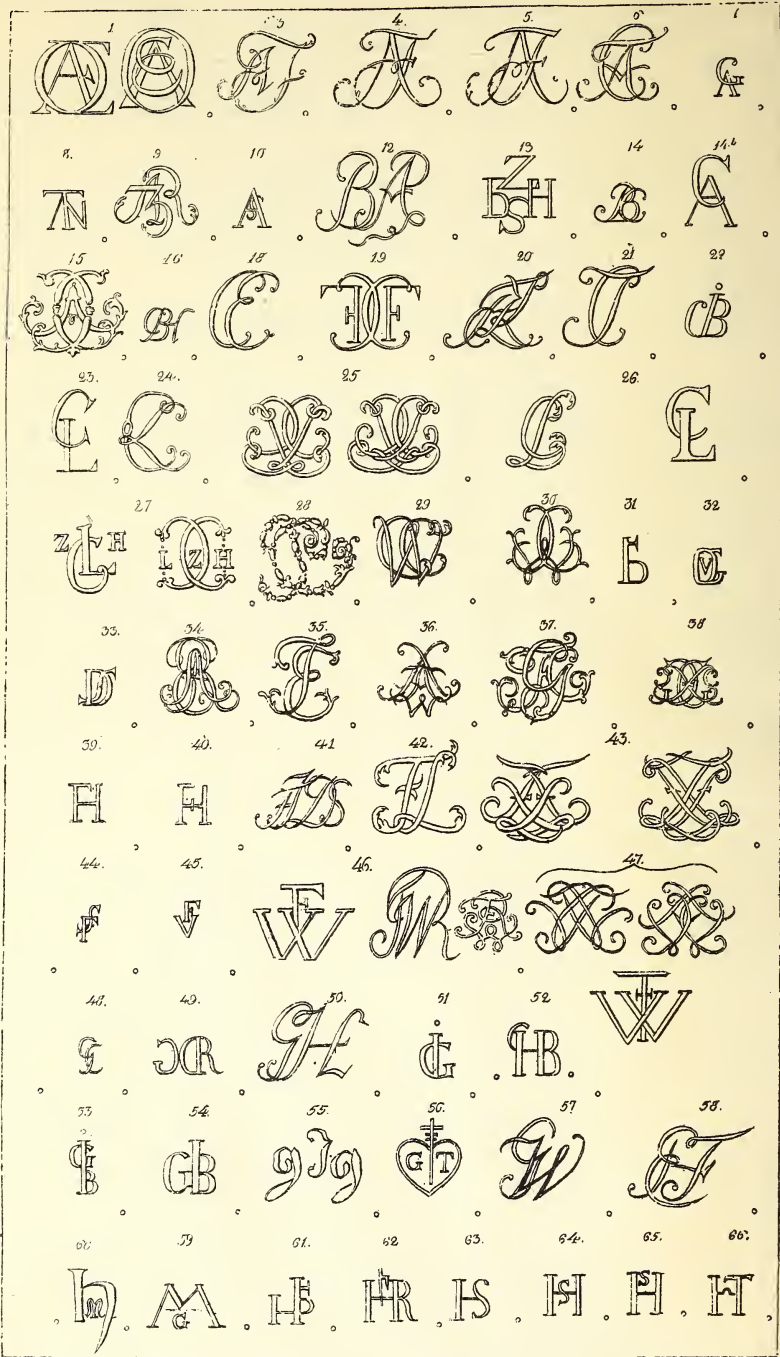
It is hoped that these heraldic notes will give increased value to this Catalogue not only affording aid in the identification of coins, when as is often the case, the arms are the only means by which one can be assigned to its proper place, but also as showing something of the history of a ruling family, by the combination of the armorial bearings which are shown; Hungarian arms have those of the Hapsburgs or early Austrian princes, combined or "impaled" with the peculiar or national device of Hungary; Tuscany unites those of the Dukes of Lorraine, the Hapsburgs and the Medici families. Many armorial bearings also have an illusion to some national tradition, historic or geographic point. The white eagle of Poland, for instance, alludes to a tradition that the founder of that Kingdom discovered a nest of white eagles on a certain spot; the eagles or allerions of Lorraine, to a fortunate shot which killed the three by a single arrow; the four silver bars of Hungary to the chief rivers of that country. Many others might be given, but these must suffice. The study of heraldry by coins will be found a most interesting ne.

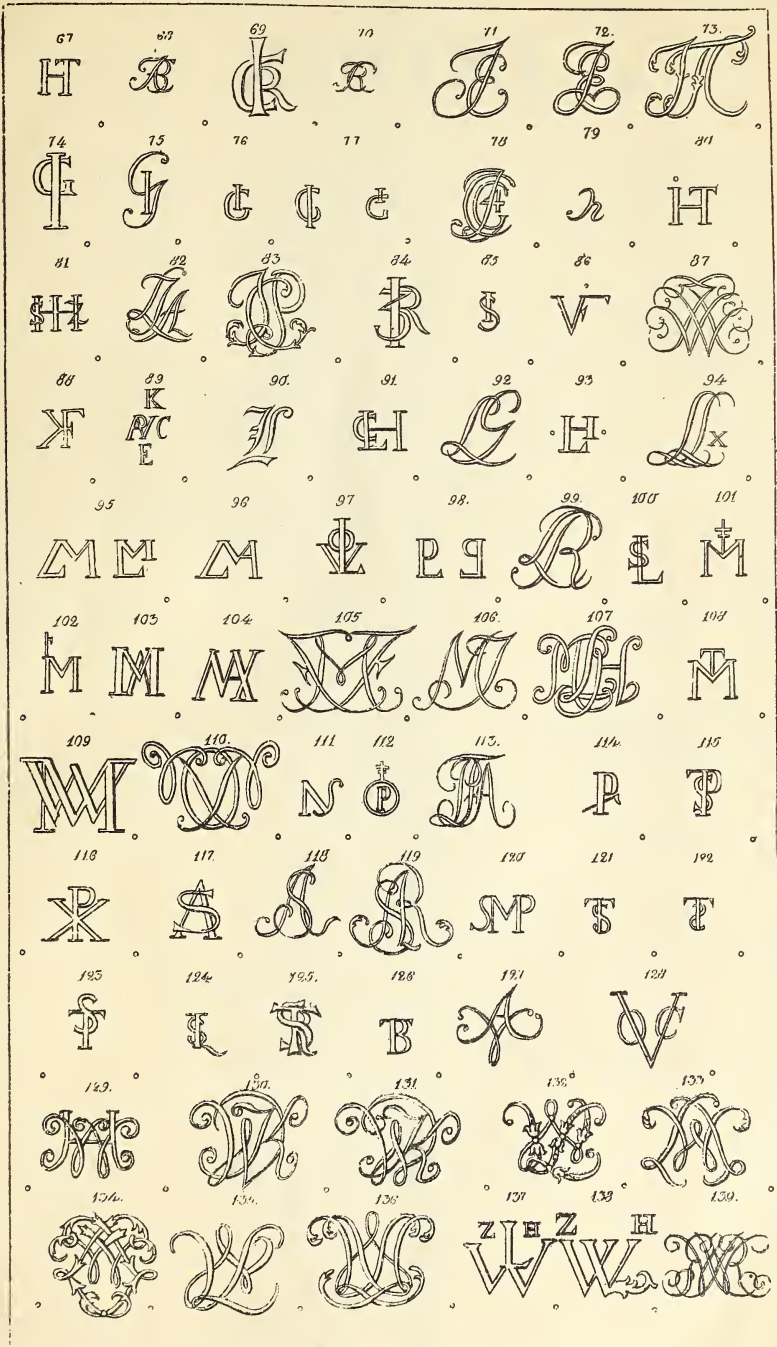

STORE CARDS OR TRADESMEN'S TOKENS.

At various times between 1798 and 1800 these private issues were uttered, but the great multitude of them made their appearance in 1863, and between the years of 1834 and 1860. They are found in copper, brass and white metal, and usually the size of the old Cent. We have large lines of them from 5c upward; there are, however, many that

are very rare, commanding from \$5 to \$10 and upwards.

1863-64 WAR TOKENS.

These little mementoes of the War of the Rebellion represent the small currency chiefly in use during that period. They were all privately issued, and the government did not interfere. Merchants displayed their cards on them (often with appropriate characteristic devices), and freely used them in their business. Others partook of a general type, were supplied in suitable quantities to the purchaser, and were "current everywhere." They continued in circulation until the end of 1863 when their use was prohibited.

The number of different tokens issued is about 3,500, and were described by J. W. Scott in the Coin Collectors Journal. This is augmented by various metals in which some were struck to a total of about 5,200. The metal chiefly used was copper; a few are in brass, while small quantities are found in white metal, copper-nickel and silver. We append a list of cities, towns, etc., from which this class of Tokens were issued, together with a page of illustrations characteristic of the series.

On the cut above, the cypher A V shows it was re-issued by Adrian de Wignacourt (or Vignacourt), the crowned crescent by Pinto, and the crowned diamond by De Rohan, thus connecting this issue with various Grand Masters. Castellar is also said (Seddall, Hist. of Malta, p. 126) to have been issued necessity pieces in brass, to the value of 50,000 crowns, redeemable in three years, which, as they came back, were

counterstamped with his device, a double-headed eagle, and again put into circulation. We have not met with them, however, and can trace through no other source.

SAXON DUCHIES.

The arms of the various Saxon Duchies were constantly varying, uniting on one shield devices showing ancestral alliances, etc. For instance, some Saxon coins bear as a crest a crowned pillar, which is a device used by Brunswick (see 5). Adelaide of Saxe Meiningen, Queen of William IV of England, had nineteen quarterings; hence, descriptions would be complicated and tedious. The shape of the shield, which often appears uncrowned, varies with the taste of the diecutter.

BRAZIL.

The copper coins of Brazil are mainly of one type up to 1832, but a great difference in size and metal is noticeable in issues of the same denomination and year, from the various mints; this is especially the case between the years 1824-32. It seems to be a reasonable conclusion that each Province has its own coinage and if their money was accepted in other parts of Brazil its rate was changed; hence we have catalogued under separate mints, located in the different Provinces. Value reduced by counterstamping, is common, after John VI. We note the original issues only.

Counterstamping with arms of Portugal is frequently found on pieces of all reigns up to include Maria I.

THE ROMAN EMPIRE.

The earliest coins of the Romans consisted of square ingots of copper stamped with the image of a bull, pig or some other animal and weighed twelve ounces. The series commenced with Servius Tullius, 576 B. C. and continued for about two hundred years. As these coins are very valuable and not in the market, we commence with the second or circular series. We give prices of those in ordinary condition. Fine specimens or scarce reverses are usually much higher in price.

These coins gradually decreased in size.

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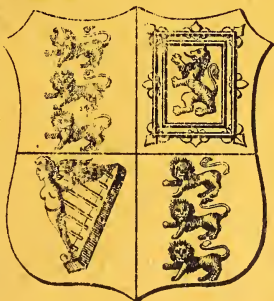
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
