## What to Bid On:

As you read through the catalog for the first time, record the numbers of all the lots you are interested in on a worksheet. If you are interested in specific types of coins, be sure to check the catalog index.

## How Much to Bid:

The price you bid is determined by you. You must remember the value that you place on the coins. Check the descriptions in the catalog and decide what you are willing to pay. You should bid generously on the lots you strongly wish to obtain. If there are some lot you would like to have "if the price is right," then you may want to place nominal bids on those lots. Because a number of collectors choose to bid on many lots, the number of successful bids will be relatively small. This is controlled by a very active market. You can safely extend your bidding (and take advantage of a "bargain") by placing a dollar total limit on your bids. Should your total be reached before all your bids are executed, we will then terminate your bidding.

Remember that your bids are limits. It is possible, and quite often does occur, that you will succeed in purchasing a lot for less than your bid since we start the floor bidding at about $5-10 \%$ above the second highest mail bid. Example: You bid $\$ 500$ on the lot and the next highest mail bid is \$400; we start the lot bid at $\$ 425$. If there are no bids from the floor, you will then be awarded the lot at $\$ 425$ - or if the floor bidding stops at perhaps $\$ 450$ or $\$ 475$, then you will receive the lot at a small advance above the top floor bid. If bidding continues above the $\$ 500$, then that floor bidder will be awarded the lot.

Signatures and amount are canceled and this issue seems to have been issued by the committee of war. Unusually high condition for this type of fiscal paper with only a single horizontal fold noted. Choice About Uncirculated.

1023 State of Massachusetts Bay, October 3, 1778 Treasury Bond. Payable March 1, 1783 at 6 percent per annum for the amount of 34 pounds. Signed by H. Gardner, treasurer and committee associated with issue. Signature of Gardner is canceled. Embossed seal of clasped hands at center. Basically Fine with splitting along folds.


1024 State of Massachusetts Bay, Produce Bond, January 1, 1780.880 pounds payable to the heirs of Edm Munrow and enclosed on back by Robert Harrington. The bond was for a period of 14 months, payable March 1, 1781 in the then current money of the state which is tied into the value of corn, beef, wool and leather at the current versus future prices. This note illustrates one of the earliest attempts of the government to stabilize the value of its currency. The engraving is attributed to I.M. Furnass of Boston and is signed by Thomas Daves and Richard Cranch as the "committee" and by H. Gardner as treasurer. Both Daves and Cranch were also signers of several issues of Massachusetts colonial notes in the 1770's.
Three corners missing, only one corner hits the very edge of design. Small punch hole noted at center and stamp hinges have been used to reinforce folds and a couple of minor edge splits. Overall appearance is of an attractive Very Fine and is the highest denomination note we can recall. Afflect example had a value of only 280 pounds.

Also included are facts and general information about the school itself.
The booklet is black with gold lettering with the date 1883 below. The front cover has a two inch bottom separation, the bottom left rear cover corner with folds. The contents are generally excellent with little evidence of aging. One of the two plates inside showing in blue and red a sample of the currency and checks used in the college is detached. Also included is the original mailing envelope addressed to Morris Lloyd of Hornellsville, NY. An interesting addition to the specialized collection.

2428 Eastman College Companion Piece: Similar to preceding lot but with different covers, undated and we estimate it to be circa 1875. The front cover depicting Eastman College is almost detached, has ragged and torn edges; the rear cover detached and ragged. The contents are generally very good, the corners are rounded and aging is evident throughout. Like the preceding lot, the contents depict interior and exterior drawings of the college, typical "nose to the grindstone" quotes and sayings of prominent personages, examples of correct handwriting, and the like. ## THE BERNARD FEINBERG COLLECTION

It is with pride that Kagin's presents selected rarities from the Bernard Feinberg Collection of U.S. Paper Currency errors. Chicago native Feinberg (1924-1980) was a prominent Windy City banker, founder of the Jefferson State Bank. Not content to rest on his laurels as the nation's then youngest bank president, Feinberg received nationwide publicity in both popular and numismatic press for his currency collecting. Devoting years to systematic and exhaustive investigation of Federal Reserve currency errors, he created his own working lists and guides as his hunt expanded throughout the field of modern currency. It is hoped this select offering will be a suitable memorial to the decades of effort expended in the error currency field by pioneer Bernard Feinberg.
