## Fatal Crash Takes The Life of a Young Mother

Sunday around 4:30 pm a fatal crash took the life of 23, year old Whitney D. Roberts of Booneville, KY. Whitney was a passenger in the truck, a 1992 Ford Ranger operated by her father Dave A Reed, 55 years old of Booneville, KY. They were traveling east on Hwy 30 when he crossed the centerline and sideswiped a Dodge Avenger that was driven by 29 year old Christopher P Ritchie of Jackson, KY.

After the Ford Truck driven by Dave Reed hit the Dodge, the truck came back across the line, went over an embankment toward the creek and struck a tree. The jaws of life had to be used to free Whitney, after they got her out, she was pronounced deceased at the scene by the Owsley County Coroner, Eddie Isaacs.

Dave Reed was air lifted to the University of Kentucky Medical Center with non-life threatening injuries. No seat belts were being utilized by Reed or Roberts in the Ford truck.

The Kentucky State Police were called in to reconstruct the scene. Investigating the accident is KSP Trooper Charles Brandenburg.

## Wreck on Highway 11 In Front of Dollar General

According to the Owsley County Sheriff's Department, Everett Brandenburg was traveling North on Highway 11 when he attempted to cross the lane of traffic and turn into the Dollar General, directly into the path of Selena Faulker. Ms. Faulker attempted to steer her vehicle, to keep from hitting Brandenburg, but they still collided. She then swerved again to keep from hitting another car and hit the guardrail. Ms. Faulker received minor injuries and did not receive medical treatment at the scene of the accident. Mr. Brandenburg was transported by Allen's Ambulance Service to Jackson for non life threatening injuries.

## Jackson Farm Service Agency Nomination Period Begins June 15, 2014

The nomination period for Jackson Farm Service Agency (FSA) county committees begins Sunday, June 15, 2014. To be eligible to serve on an FSA county committee, a person must participate or cooperate in a program administered by FSA, be eligible to vote in a county committee election and reside in the local administrative area where the person is nominated.

Farmers and ranchers may nominate themselves or others.

Organizations representing minorities and women also may nominate candidates. To become a candidate, an eligible individual must sign the nomination form, FSA-669A. The form and other information about FSA county committee elections are available at [www.fsa.usda.gov/elections](http://www.fsa.usda.gov/elections). Nomination forms for the 2014 election must be postmarked or received in the local USDA Service Center by close of business on Aug. 1, 2014. Elections will take place this fall.

While FSA county committees do not approve or deny farm ownership or operating loans, they make decisions on disaster and

conservation programs, emergency programs, commodity price support loan programs and other agricultural issues. Members serve three-year terms. Nationwide, there are about 7,800 farmers and ranchers serving on FSA county committees. Committees consist of three to 11 members that are elected by eligible producers.

FSA will mail ballots to eligible voters beginning Nov. 3, 2014. Ballots are due back to the local county office either via mail or in person by Dec. 1, 2014. Newly elected committee members and alternates take office on Jan. 1, 2015.

Chapters two and three of the book of Revelation consists of seven letters from Christ to seven churches. In each of the letters, there is a description of Christ, some specifics about the particular church, instruction on what to do and a promise.

These were actual churches in the cities mentioned at the time the letters were written but I also believe that every church today, if they take an honest, good look at themselves, can point to one of the seven churches and say, "There we are." What about your church? What type of church are you?

When Christ speaks of the characteristics of each church; He has some good and some bad things to say about four of them; two of the churches He has nothing bad to say, and one church; He has no praise for.

Church number one is Ephesus (Revelation 2:1-7). When speaking of the church's good traits, this church seems like the perfect church. They were hard workers (Christ compliments them on their labor twice), they were patient, not rushing into things, working in the Lord's time. They also knew the Word of God well enough to recognize false teachers, and they did all of this in the Lord's name.

However, there was one big problem with the church; they had left their first love. They were not working for the Lord, not because they loved Him, but because it was their duty. The heart for the work was gone. This is serious because Ephesus is

the only church of the seven in which Christ threatens to take the church away (Compare Revelation 2:5 with Revelation 1:20).

The second church is Smyrna (Revelation 2:8-11). Smyrna is one of the two churches Christ has nothing but good to say about. Against the worldly standard the church was poor; in fact, Jesus uses the word "poverty" when describing their worldly possessions but praises them for being spiritually rich. The church was persecuted and went through much suffering; the word "tribulation" is used twice in describing them. Because of their spiritual riches Satan was after them and Christ promises them a crown of life.

Church number three is Pergamos (Revelation 2:12-17). This church is an interesting one because Christ commends them for not denying Him but He rebukes them for accepting false doctrine. The basic truth of the gospel is still there but it is hidden because of other teaching that has overshadowed it, and that other teaching is not Biblically correct.

The rest of Revelation chapter two is the church of Thyatira. Like Ephesus, Thyatira is complemented on her work, patience and even her faith. Unlike Ephesus however, she is not founded in the Word well enough to recognize false teachers and allows them to teach in the church. The work continues but with all the false teaching the gospel is lost in the mix.

Chapter three of Revelation begins with the fifth church, the church of Sardis (Revelation 3:1-6). Sardis is often described as a church that is dying. Christ criticizes the church because their works are not pure but

also praises them because some of them are worthy to "walk with me in white." He encourages them not to give up and tells them to "be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain."

Church number six is Philadelphia (Revelation 3:7-13). Philadelphia is the second and last church Christ has nothing but praise for. He praises them for keeping His Word, not denying His name, going through the open doors He has provided them in getting the gospel to others and for having "a little strength;" this is probably because of


their reliance on them. The last church, the church of Laodicea (Revelation 3:14-22) is the only church Christ had nothing good to say about, in fact, He said they make Him sick to His stomach. Being neither hot nor cold, the church is indifferent and filled with selfishness.

They rely on themselves and their material wealth for the things of everyday life because they "have need of nothing." In doing so they do not live by faith as Christians should do (Habakkuk 2:4; Romans 1:17; Galatians 3:11; Hebrews 10:38) The sad thing is they don't even realize that spiritually they are broke, destitute and blind. Christ is on the outside, knocking on the door, hoping someone answers.

There they are; the seven churches. Honestly, take a deep look inside, determine which church you are, and then follow the correction Christ gives to each church on how to

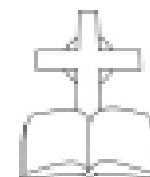
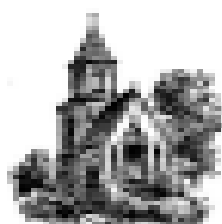

This report is designed to inform the public about the quality of water and services provided on a daily basis. Our commitment is to provide our customers with a safe, clean, and reliable supply of drinking water. We want to assure that we will continue to monitor, improve, and protect the water system and deliver a high quality product. Water is the most indispensable product in every home and we ask everyone to be conservative and help us in our efforts to protect the water source and the water system.

Booneville Water treats surface water from the South Fork of the Kentucky River. An analysis of the susceptibility of the Booneville South Fork Kentucky River water supply to contamination indicates that susceptibility is generally moderate. However, there are a few areas of concern. Nonpoint source pollution such as agriculture, livestock, and logging are the most prominent sources of potential contamination. Several oil and gas wells are in the protection area as well. Bridges are another area of concern due to the potential for spills of hazardous materials. Fortunately, there are no bridges within 1/2 mile of the intake. A complete source water assessment can be viewed at Booneville City Hall during regular business hours. The Annual CCR is distributed via, internet, newspapers, or hand delivery every year.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects may be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and may pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity. Contaminants that may be present in source water include: Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, (sewage plants, septic systems, livestock operations, or wildlife). Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, (naturally occurring or from stormwater runoff, wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming). Pesticides and herbicides, (stormwater runoff, agriculture or residential uses). Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, (by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, or from gas stations, stormwater runoff, or septic systems). 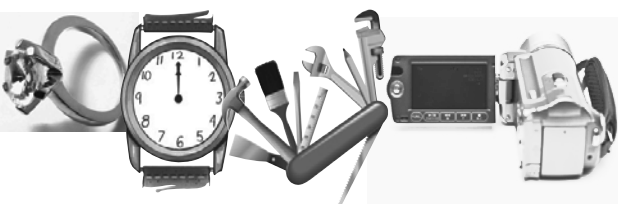

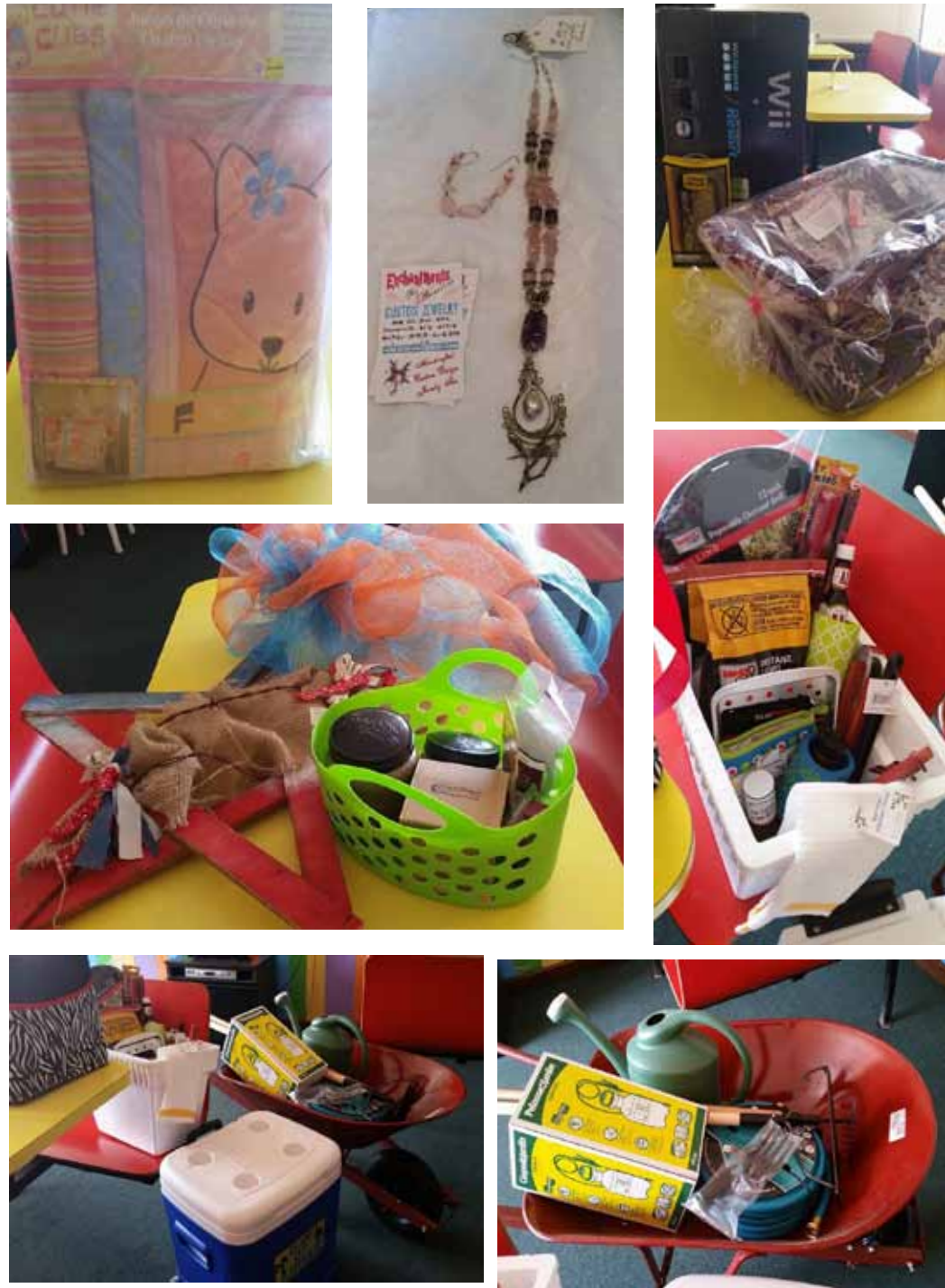

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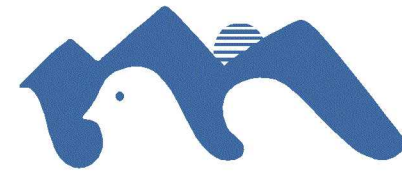


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
