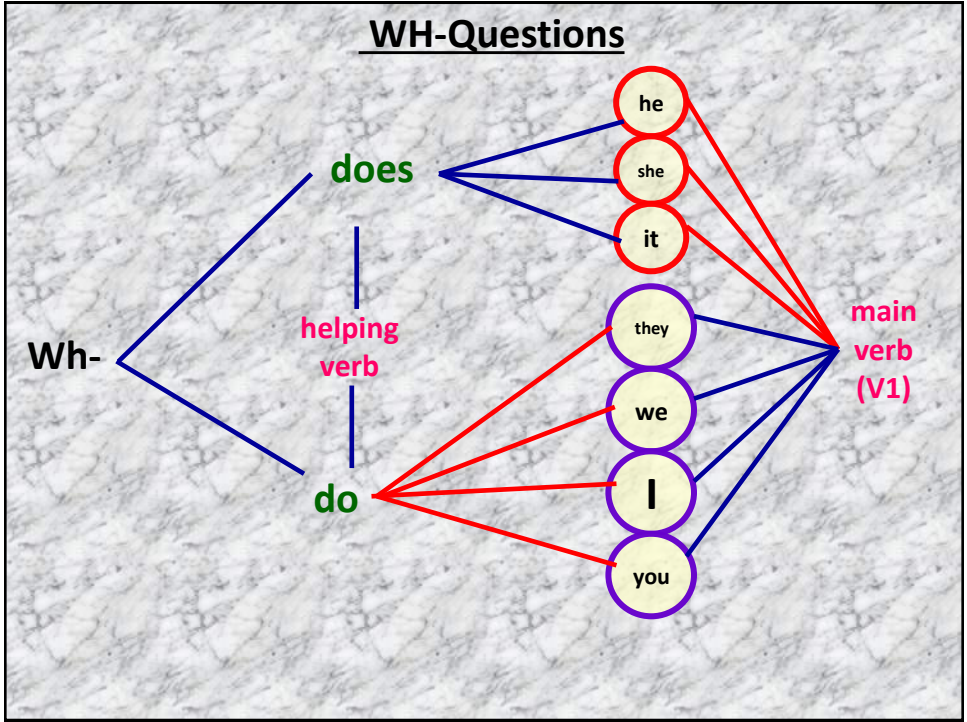

We add 's' or 'es' in simple present, and with 'do' we add 'es' and it becomes 'does'.

SUBJECT + <i>BE</i> + FREQUENCY ADVERB		Frequency adverbs follow <i>am, is, are</i> (the simple forms of <i>be</i> ).
Tom + <i>is</i> + $\left. \begin{array}{l} \textit{always} \\ \textit{usually} \\ \textit{often} \\ \textit{sometimes} \\ \textit{seldom} \\ \textit{rarely} \\ \textit{never} \end{array} \right\}$ + late for class.		
SUBJECT + FREQUENCY ADVERB + OTHER SIMPLE PRESENT VERBS		Frequency adverbs come before all simple present verbs except <i>be</i> .
Tom + $\left. \begin{array}{l} \textit{always} \\ \textit{usually} \\ \textit{often} \\ \textit{sometimes} \\ \textit{seldom} \\ \textit{rarely} \\ \textit{never} \end{array} \right\}$ + <i>comes</i> late.		



