

Man's Hospital Slippers.

(KNITTED).

Materials required :

4 ozs. Baldwin & Walker's LADYSHIP PRIMROSE FLEECY WOOL.

1 Pair Knitting Needles, No. 6.

1 Pair Fleecy Lined Soles, size 10.

IMPORTANT—As different dye-lots should not be worked into the same garment, it is most important that you should make sure of having sufficient wool from the one dye-lot to complete the garment. Each dye-lot has a different letter which is shown on the label of the bundle or box.

Tension : taken before pressing. 7 stitches to 1 inch in width.

6 rows to 1 inch in depth.

- Note.—If the needles stated do not produce this tension, try different sizes until you get it correct.
- Alteration in Size.—For a larger Slipper, use thicker needles, or a size which produces fewer stitches to the inch. For a smaller Slipper, use finer needles, or a size which produces more stitches to the inch.

Abbreviations .--- K, knit; P, purl; sts., stitches; tog., together; rep., repeat.

THE VAMP.

Begin at the toe by casting on 21 sts. and knit 1 row working into the back of each st.

Change to the rib of K 1, P 1 and work as follows :---

1st row.	K & P into the first st., (K 1, P 1) 4 times, K 3 tog., (P 1, K 1)
	4 times, P & K into the last st.
2nd row.	K & P into the first st., rib to last st., P & K into this.
3rd row.	Increase in the first st., rib to centre of 3 sts., P 3 tog., rib to the
	last st., increase in this.
4th row.	Increase in the first st., rib to the last st., increase in this.
	Rep. the 1st. to the 4th rows inclusive until there are 41 sts. on
	the needle, finishing with a 4th row.
Next row.	Work in the rib without shaping.
Next row.	P & K into the first st., rib to the centre 3 sts., P 3 tog., rib to the
	last st., increase in this.
Next row.	Work without shaping.
Next row.	K & P into first st., rib to the centre 3 sts., K 3 tog., rib to the
	last st., increase in this.
	Rep. the last 4 rows once more.
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Continue to work in the rib without shaping until you have a depth of $9\frac{1}{2}$ inches from the cast-on edge, measuring down the centre of work.

Cast off still working in the rib.

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Use Ladyship "Lacette" Wool for tenderly soft, slim-fitting Jumpers, Undies, Negliges.

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THE BACK.

Begin by casting on 83 sts. and work in the rib of K 1, P 1—the second row will begin and end with P 1—until you have a depth of $3\frac{3}{4}$ inches from the cast-on edge, finishing with a second row.

Next row. K 1, P 1, K 1, P 1 * wool forward, K 3 tog., wool round needle, P 1, K 1, P 1. Rep. from * to last st., K 1.

Continue to work in the rib as before until you have a depth of $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches from cast-on edge.

Cast off, still working in the rib.

Make a second slipper in the same way.

See instructions under Crochet Slipper for making up.

Crochet Slippers.

Materials required :

6 ozs. Baldwin & Walker's LADYSHIP PRIMROSE FLEECY WOOL.

1 Crochet Hook, size 10 by the Bell Gauge.

1 Pair Fleecy-lined Soles, size 10.

2 Buttons.

Tension : taken before pressing. 5 stitches to 1 inch in width. $3\frac{1}{2}$ ridges to 1 inch in depth.

NOTE.-See page 2.

Abbreviations .- Ch., chain ; d. c., double crochet ; rep., repeat.

THE BACK.

Begin by making a foundation of 31 chain.

1st row. Miss the first ch. from hook, then work 1 d.c. into each of the remaining 30 chain, 1 ch., turn.

2nd row.

1 d.c. into each of the first 20 d.c. of previous row (work into the back strand of each d.c. only throughout the making of the slipper), 2 chain, miss 2 d.c. of previous row. 1 d.c. into each of the remaining 8 d.c.

Rep. these 2 rows 35 times more (72 rows in all) then the 1st. row again. Break off the wool.

Rejoin the wool to the 3 d.c. from the top edge (i.e. the edge nearest the holes) with 1 d.c., 7 ch., miss 6 d.c., 1 d.c. into the next d.c., turn and work 12 d.c. over the loop of 7 ch., 1 d.c. into the d.c. where you joined the wool (this completes the buttonhole loop). Continue all along the top edge of slipper

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as follows :— *3 ch., 1 d.c. between the next 2 ridges. Rep. from * along the top edge, then make a buttonhole at the other side in the same way as stated for the first buttonhole loop. Fasten off securely.

THE VAMP.

Begin at the toe—leaving a length of wool a few inches—by making 12 chain and work as follows :—

- 1st row. Miss the ch. next the hook, 1 d.c. into each of the next 5 ch., 3 d.c. into the next ch., 2 d.c. into each of the remaining 5 ch., 1 ch. turn.
- 2nd row. 1 d.c. into each of the first 6 d.c. of previous row, 3 d.c. into the next d.c. (centre d.c.) 1 d.c. into each of the remaining 6 d.c. of previous row, 1 ch., turn.
- 3rd row. 1 d.c. into each d.c. of previous row to the centre, 3 d.c. into the centre d.c. of previous row, 1 d.c. into each d.c. to end of row, 1 ch., turn.

Continue to work in this way, working 1 d.c. more before working 3 d.c. into the centre st., and 1 d.c. more after the centre st. until you have worked 32 rows in all. (16 ridges).

Fasten off securely.

Thread the end of wool left at the beginning of toe through a wool needle and neatly join the centre seam of toe.

Make a second slipper in the same way.

TO MAKE UP.

Press each piece carefully on the wrong side with a warm iron over a slightly damp cloth. Overlap the side edges of the back over the vamp for about 3 ridges, then neatly sew—beginning at the lower edge—to a depth of two to three inches. Pin the knitting or crochet neatly to the slipper sole easing it around the toe—placing the centre toe of work to centre toe of sole and neatly sew the sole into place on the wrong side. It is better to stretch the work slightly around the instep to give the slipper a good shape and to ease it around the back of heel.

Turn down the top point of the crochet Vamp for about 1 inch and sew on the button.

Using the wool double, make a crochet chain about 33 inches long, thread through the holes, then make a small medallion at each end of the cord and sew neatly. This will stop the cord from pulling through the holes.

For the knitted slipper a twisted cord can be made if preferred.

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For figure flattering lines and the dainty texture of chiffon, there's nothing like Ladyship "Lacette."

Page Four

Regulation Knitted Surgical Stockings with and without Feet.

(WITHOUT HEEL).

Materials required :

11 ozs. Baldwin & Walker's LADYSHIP PRIMROSE FLEECY WOOL, For Stockings with Feet. 10 ozs. of the same make for Stockings without Feet. 1 Set of 4 Knitting Needles, No. 6.

IMPORTANT.-See page 2.

Measurements: Length of Stocking with Foot, from cast-on edge to toe, 41¹/₂ inches. Length of Stocking without Foot, from cast-on edge to cast-off edge 31 inches.

Tension : before pressing. 5 stitches to 1 inch in width. 6 rounds to 1 inch in depth.

NOTE.-See page 2.

Abbreviations.--K, knit ; P, purl ; tog., together ; sts., stitches : rep., repeat.

** Using the set of 4 needles, begin at the top edge by casting on 96 sts. (30, 36, 30) and work in the rib of K 3, P 3 for 10 inches.

1st decrease round. * K 3, P 1, P 2 tog. Rep. from * all round. (80 sts. remain) Work in the rib of K 3, P 2 for 8 inches more.

2nd decrease round. *K1, K2 tog., P2. Rep. from *all round. (64 sts. remain). Work in the rib of K2, P2 for 6 inches.

3rd decrease round. * K 2, P 2 tog. Rep. from * all round. (48 sts. remain) Work in the rib of K 2, P 1 for a further 6 inches. ** For the footless stocking cast off loosely, still working in the rib.

For the stocking with foot continue in the rib of K 2, P 1 for 8 inches more, making 14 inches altogether.

TO SHAPE FOR TOE.

Slip 3 sts. from the end of the first needle on to one end of the second needle, then slip 3 sts. from the end of the third needle on to the opposite end of the second needle, making 12 sts. on each of the first and third needles and 24 sts. on the second needle.

1st round.	Knit all round.
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2nd round.	1st needle. 2nd needle. 3rd needle.	K to the last 3 sts., K 2 tog., K 1. K 1, K 2 tog., K to the last 3 sts., K 2 tog., K 1. K 1, K 2 tog., K to end of needle.
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3rd round. Work without decrease.

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Diaphanous garments are never so lovely as when knitted with Ladyship "Lacette" Wool.

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Rep. the 2nd and 3rd, rounds until 6 sts, remain on each of the 1st, and i 3rd, needles and 12 sts on the second needle, then knit the sts, from 1st, needle on to the end of third needle.

Break off the wool leaving an end a few inches long, thread through a wool needle and graft the sts. together as follows :---

* Bring the wool needle to the front under the knitting needle and put the wool needle into the first st. on the front needle knitwise, slip the st. from needle, insert the needle into the 2nd. st. on the front needle purlwise but do not slip the st. from the needle, take the wool needle under the front needle to the back and insert into the lst. stitch on the back needle purlwise and slip from needle, insert into the second st. on back needle knitwise but do not slip the st. from needle. Rep. from * until all the sts. have been worked off.

Fasten off the end neatly and securely. Make a second stocking in the same way.
