This Study aimed at identifying practised sexual deviances upon inmates of rehabilitation and correction centers in Jordan.

The sample of the study included 361 inmates, 41 of them were females While 320 were males. the number of the questionnaires distributed was 321. 31 of them were lost while 66 questionnaires were excluded because they were not suitable for the statistical analysis. Because of this, 254 questionnaires were only subject to the study.

Another questionnaire was presented consisting of three standards: the first one was the practised sexual deviances during the period of infancy. The second one was the practised sexual deviances during the period of imprisonment while the third standard discussed the factors which lead to the sexual deviances. The study indicated some results: first, practising sexual deviances such as sodomy, lesbianism and sex appeal during infancy and imprisonment periods. Second, there was a significant relationship between the social gender variable and the sexual deviances during the periods of infancy and imprisonment. Third there was a statistical relationship between the length of imprisonment and the strength of the inmate. Fourth, there were not statistical differences between receiving grants, the strength of the protection system and conjugal visit. Finally, the study presented some recommendations such as classifying the inmates according to the sexual danger and editing the version of the place of practicing the conjugal visit .
