


## **Cascade County**

Located in central Montana, Cascade County is Montana's third most populous with 77, 691 residents, according to the 1990 Census.

Great Falls, the county seat, is the state's second largest city with a population of 55,125. Agriculture, livestock and defense are the industrial backbone of the city's economy. Malmstrom Air Force Base alone pumps about \$273 million annually into the area's economy. The city is also a major medical center.

According to the *Montana Almanac*, by authors Andrea Merrill and Judy Jacobson, the county was established in 1887 and both the county and Great Falls were named for the Great Falls of the Missouri River. Paris Gibson was the founder of the city, notes the authors, and the area was Blackfeet Indian territory when Lewis & Clark journeyed through from 1805 to 1806.

According to the U.S. Bureau of the Census, median income for Cascade County households in 1989 was \$23,700. The county is 2,673 square miles in area; 2,659 square miles in land area and 14 in inland water area.

County residents experience the four distinct seasons. According to the *Montana Almanac*, the average daily low in January between 1980 and 1989 was 12.3 degrees above zero and average January snowfall 10.0 inches. The average daily high in July was 83.6 degrees above. The annual precipitation in 1995 was 15.43 inches and the length of the growing season 115 days.
