

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INTRODUCTION

Over 5 million full-time employees of State and local governments were members of employee organizations and 14,302 State and local governments engaged in collective negotiations and/or meet and confer discussions with employee organizations as of October 1980. There were 34,751 labor-management agreements in effect between State and local governments and employee organizations as of that time.

The number of employee-bargaining units in State and local governments totaled 34,278 in October 1980; these bargaining units represented over 5.1 million employees, or 38.4 percent of all State and local government employees.

During the 12-month period of October 13, 1979 to October 12, 1980, State and local governments experienced 502 work stoppages involving 233,095 employees compared with 553 work stoppages involving 212,340 employees during the similar 1978-1979 period. When work stoppages are measured in terms of the schedule days or work shifts for which employees withheld their services, a total of 2,406,708 days-of-idleness occurred during the October 1979 to October 1980 period, an increase of 13 percent from the similar 1978-79 period.

EXTENT OF EMPLOYEE ORGANIZATION

The 5,030,564 full-time State and local government employees who belonged to employee organizations in October 1980 accounted for 48.8 percent of all full-time State and local government workers. This represents a 3.1 percent increase since October 1979 in the number of full-time employees who belong to organizations which exist for the purpose, in whole or in part, of improving conditions of employment.

Table A provides a distribution of the 50 States and the District of Columbia in terms of the percent of full-time State and local government employees who belonged to employee organizations in October 1980.

Data in this report on the extent of employee organization are presented by level and type of government and by governmental function. When these data are examined in terms of types of government, independent school districts are found to have the highest proportion of employees who belong to employee organizations-60.2 percent of all full-time school district employees. Table B provides a distribution of the number of organized full-time State and local government employees by type of government as of October 1980.

When the extent of employee organization is viewed on the basis of both governmental level and function, the fire protection function at the local government level has the highest proportion of organized employees with 70.6 percent of full-time employees belonging to employee organizations. At the State government level the highway function, with 52.9 percent of full-time employees belonging to an employee organization, had the highest proportion of organized employees. Table C, by governmental level and function, displays the percentage of full-time employees who belonged to employee organizations in October 1980.

LABOR RELATIONS POLICIES

For purposes of this study, a government is considered to have a labor relations policy if it engaged in collective negotiations or meet and confer discussions with employees (see the appendix for definitions of these terms). The number of governments having a labor relations policy in October 1980 was 14,302, an increase of 3.0 percent over the 13,882 governments with a policy in 1979. Table D provides a summary of the number and percentage of governments with a labor relations policy in October 1980.

Of the governments with a labor relations policy, 6,511 engaged in collective negotiations only, 2,050 had a policy for meet and confer discussions only, and 5,741 engaged in both collective negotiations and meet and confer discussions.

Meet and confer discussions, as used in this report, refers to the process by which the public employer consents to discuss conditions of employment with representatives of an employee organization. If the parties reach an agreement, it may be written in the form of a memorandum of understanding. The employer, however, is not legally bound to enter into these discussions, nor to abide by any resulting memorandum of understanding.

Collective negotiations, on the other hand, refers to negotiations in which both management and employee representatives are equal legal parties in the bargaining process and decisions are reached jointly through bilateral negotiations. The end result of collective negotiations is a mutually binding contractual agreement.

Table E illustrates, by State, the number and percent of governments that had a labor relations policy in October 1980. Because special district governments represent a large portion of all local governments but only a small number of them engage in collective negotiations or meet and confer discussion, the data in table E have been displayed to both include and exclude special districts.

LABOR-MANAGEMENT AGREEMENTS

State and local governments had 34,751 labor-management agreements in effect in October 1980, an increase of 6.8 percent from October 1979; 27,274 of these agreements were mutually binding contracts and 7,477 were memoranda of understanding. The number of State and local government employees covered by contractual agreements in October 1980 was 4,270,875 or 32.1 percent of all full-time and part-time employees. Of the 27,274 contractual agreements in effect as of mid-October 1980, 12,157 had been renegotiated during the preceding 12 months and 1,089 were new contracts (i.e., negotiated for the first time) during this period. The renegotiated contractual agreements covered 1,624,019 employees and the new contracts covered 92,923 employees.

State governments reported 728 contractual agreements in October 1980 and 231 memoranda of understanding. Con-

tractual agreements between local governments and employee organizations totaled 26,546, up 4.4 percent during the October 1979-October 1980 period; memoranda of understanding in local governments increased by 17.9 percent during this same interval to 7,246. School districts reported more labormanagement agreements than any other type of government, and special districts reported the least. Table F provides a summary of State and local government labor-management agreements by type of agreement and type of government in 1980.

BARGAINING UNITS

Employee bargaining units existed in 13,408 State and local governments in October 1980. These governments had a total of 34,278 bargaining units representing 5,115,166 employees, or 38.4 percent of all full-time and part-time employees.

Of the 13,375 local governments with bargaining units, the vast majority had only one or two units, but 223 of these local governments had 10 or more bargaining units. State governments, on the other hand, had larger numbers of bargaining units per government—of the 33 State governments with bargaining units, 23 had 10 or more bargaining units and only 3 States had one or two bargaining units.

In governments where bargaining units exist, a group of employees must demonstrate a "community of interest" in order to be represented by a particular unit for the purpose of collective negotiations. The definitions of "community of interest," however, varies greatly from government to government. Some bargaining units, therefore, may represent all members of an employee organization, others may represent all employees of a government or agency who are classified as eligible for representation by an employee organization, and some may represent only employees of a specific occupational category. The occupational categories represented may be broadly defined (such as "skilled craft and trade") or they may be more specifically defined (such as "Fire fighters").

WORK STOPPAGES

State and local governments experienced 502 work stoppages which lasted for at least one full shift or one full workday during the period October 13, 1979 to October 12, 1980. For the equivalent period in 1979, 553 work stoppages were reported. These work stoppages involved 233,095 employees in 1980 and 212,340 employees in 1979 accounting for 4,426 and 4,243 workdays respectfully. In terms of time lost from work, the effect of these stoppages is more apparent when the duration of each stoppage is multiplied by the number of employees involved to obtain a measure of "Days-of-Idleness." For the year measured in 1980, 2,406,708 days-of-idleness occurred, compared with 2,135,178 days-of-idleness in 1979.

Table G provides a summary of work stoppages by type of government, including the number of employees idled, the duration, and days-of-idleness.

The largest number of work stoppages in 1980 occurred in school districts. Accordingly, the governmental function most affected by work stoppages was education where the average "days-of-idleness" per stoppage was 5,636.4. Table H provides summary information on work stoppages by governmental function.

During the 12-month period ended October 12, 1980, a State or local government work stoppage was most likely to have occurred during the renegotiation phase of an existing labormanagement agreement and the major cause of most stoppages (76.5 percent) concerned disputes of an economic and/or hoursof-work nature.

The two most frequent methods of finally resolving State and local government work stoppages during this period were direct negotiation between the employer and the grievants or their representatives (19.5 percent of all stoppages) and mediation (36.3 percent). Court injunctions ended 14.5 percent of the stoppages, fact finding was used to resolve 6.2 percent of the cases and arbitration was used to resolve another 3.2 percent. Over 20 percent of the work stoppages were resolved by some other means, such as voluntary return to work, dismissal of employees engaged in the work stoppage, etc.

Information on work stoppages for this report were generally reported by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), U.S. Department of Labor, from its regular statistical series. Units of government were asked to report the occurrence of work stoppages on the Bureau of the Census questionnaires and these reports were then checked against the work stoppage situations regularly collected by BLS. The BLS work stoppage data supplied for inclusion in this report consisted of completed questionnaires prepared by the employing government; alternative BLS source information was supplied, whenever possible, if an employer report was not obtainable.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics attempted to secure information for work stoppages not already collected for its statistical series and also provided information on work stoppages not reported by the Census Bureau's respondents. Coverage of State and local government work stoppages by the Bureau of the Census includes all stoppages, regardless of size, provided the duration was for at least 1 day or shift; BLS limits its coverage to those stoppages involving six or more employees for a period of at least 1 day or shift.

SOURCES OF DATA

Data for State governments shown in this report result from a complete canvass of all State agencies and institutions. Data concerning total employment, full-time employment and payrolls for local governments are estimates from the Bureau of the Census's Survey of Government Employment. The Survey of Government Employment utilizes a random sample of approximately 20,000 local governments; for an explanation of sampling techniques and measures of sampling variation, see *Public Employment in 1980* issued by the U.S. Bureau of the Census in June 1981.

Labor relations data were gathered primarily by a mail canvass of all State governments, the approximately 20,000 local governments sampled for the Survey of Government Employment and all other local governments which reported 50 or more full-time employees in the 1977 Census of Governments. Mail requests for data were sent to approximately 4,700 State government agencies and institutions and to approximately 26,500 local governments and school systems. Usable replies were received from approximately 85 percent of the panel canvassed. For governments not included in the survey panel, data from the 1977 Census of Governments were utilized, and for units which were surveyed but failed to respond, the latest available data were utilized.

Data received on questionnaires were reviewed and edited for internal consistency, comparability with prior year data, and other known facts about each unit. Supplementary correspondence and telephone followup with State and local

officials were utilized to resolve any apparent problems. Some public employee organizations were contacted to obtain information on membership when an individual unit of government could not supply the requested data. Special assistance was obtained from the American Association of University Professors, State government employee organizations, and State personnel boards and directors.

RELIABILITY AND LIMITATIONS OF DATA

The mail canvass questionnaires used in this survey included detailed definitions and reporting instructions to guide respondents and facilitate uniform interpretation and reporting procedures. Each questionnaire also contained a Census Bureau telephone number that local officials could call to obtain additional clarification or assistance from subject matter specialists. Quality control was also assisted by reference to information collected by the Bureau in its surveys of public sector labor-management relations for previous years. However, human and mechanical errors occur in any large statistical operation, including omissions, misinterpretations, errors in reporting, errors in the clerical review and editing of survey responses, errors in the preparation of computer input and at other stages of electronic processing. Quality control procedures were applied in the various stages of processing to keep such errors at an acceptable low level.

DEFINITIONS

The appendix which follows the statistical tables contains definitions of the types of governments, functions of governments, and labor relations terms included in this report.

DEFINITIONS OF SELECTED TERMS

Following are definitions of the concepts, categories and terms applied in the collection of data for this report and used throughout the publication. They are grouped as follows: Types of Governments, Governmental Functions, and Labor Relations terms.

Types of Governments

In general, a government is an organized entity whose governmental character is evidenced by popular election of the officials or their appointment by public officials, a high degree of public accountability, and the power to raise revenue to provide authorized services. In addition, a governmental unit must have sufficient discretion in the management of its own affairs to distinguish it from the administrative structure of any other governmental unit.¹

State governments. This category refers to the governments of the 50 States which constitute the United States.

Local governments. The Bureau of the Census classifies local governments by five major types-county, municipality, township, school district and special district. Following is a brief description of each type of local government:

County. Organized county governments are found throughout the Nation except in Connecticut, the District of Columbia, Rhode Island and limited portions of a few other States. These governments are legally designated as "boroughs" in Alaska and "parishes" in Louisiana. There were 3,040 county governments as of October 1979. Excluded from county government statistics and included with municipalities or townships are certain local governments that combine area and governmental characteristics of both counties and municipalities or townships.

Municipality. A municipality is a political subdivision within which a municipal corporation has been established to provide general local government services for a specific population concentration in a defined area. A municipality may be legally termed a city, village, borough (except in Alaska), or town (except in the New England States, Minnesota, New York and Wisconsin). Included in this category are certain cities that are completely or substantially consolidated with their county governments, operate outside the geographic limits of any county, or for other reasons have no organized county government operations within their boundaries. Comprising this group are the following: Anaconda (Mont.), Anchorage, Baltimore, Baton Rouge, Boston, Butte, Carson City, Columbus (Ga.), Denver, Honolulu, Indianapolis, Jacksonville, Juneau, Lexington (Ky.), Nashville, New Orleans, New York, Philadelphia, St. Louis, Sitka, San Francisco, and Washington, D.C. as well as the "independent cities" in Virginia. Nantucket, Massachusetts is included with townships.

Township. Township governments, as distinguished from municipalities, are created to serve inhabitants of areas defined without regard to population concentration. This classification is applied to local governments in 20 States, including governmental units officially designated as "towns" in the six New England States, New York and Wisconsin, and some "plantations" in Maine and "locations" in New Hampshire.

School District. There is considerable organizational diversity in the type of governmental units that operate public schools. In 31 States, public schools are administered exclusively by school districts—governmental entities that are fiscally and administratively independent of any other government. In Alaska, Hawaii, Maryland, North Carolina, Virginia and the District of Columbia, schools are operated as dependent school systems that are administratively and fiscally part of another government (either the State, county, municipality or township) and are not counted as separate governmental entities by the Bureau of the Census. In 11 States there is a mixture of independent school districts and dependent school systems.

Special District. Special districts are local governmental units created to provide specific services that are not being supplied by other governments. They are known by a variety of titles including districts, authorities, boards, and commissions. A majority of special districts are established to perform a single function, but some have authority to provide several, usually related, kinds of services.

Governmental Functions

The data shown in this report for each of the following functions is not limited solely to the personnel directly involved in providing the services mentioned in the title of each category, but also includes all support personnel who are indirectly involved through administration, maintenance, and other support activities in the function.

Education. This category includes instructional employees as well as the administrative, clerical, maintenance, and auxiliary

employees of public schools. **Instructional employees** includes not only classroom teachers, but also principals, supervisors of instruction, librarians, teacher aides, library aides and guidance and psychological personnel; for institutions of higher education, this subcategory also includes persons engaged in departmental research and teachers at hospitals and agricultural experiment stations and farms. **Other employees** includes all noninstructional personnel of local schools and higher education institutions as well as State government employees engaged in the supervision and regulation of public and private elementary and secondary schools, programs and institutions for the training of blind, deaf and other handicapped persons, and vocational rehabilitation programs.

Fire protection. This classification is applied to local government fire protection and prevention activities plus any ambulance, rescue or other auxiliary services provided by the fire protection agency. Volunteer firefighters, if remunerated for their services on a "per fire" or some other basis, are included as part-time employees.

Highways. Activities associated with the maintenance and operation of streets, roads, sidewalks, bridges, tunnels, toll roads and ferries are included at this function. Also included are snow and ice removal, street lighting, and highway and traffic engineering.

Hospitals. This category includes only government operated medical care facilities that provide in-patient care. Employees of private corporations which lease and operate governmentowned hospital facilities are excluded. In hospitals affiliated with government operated medical schools, the instructional staff are included in the "Education" category and all other hospital employees are included here.

Police protection. This function covers activities concerned with the enforcement of law and order and includes coroner's offices, police training academies, investigation bureaus, and local jails, "lockups," or other short-term detention facilities.

Public welfare. Included in this category are such activities as the administration of various public assistance programs for the needy, operation of homes for the elderly, indigent care institutions and programs which provide payment for medical care and other services for the needy. Hospital services provided directly by a government are included in the "Hospital" functions rather than here.

Sanitation other than sewerage. This category covers refuse collection and disposal, operation of disposal sites, and street cleaning activities.

Labor Relations Terms

Employment and employees. These terms are used interchangeably and refer to all persons employed by and performing services for a government. Employees include all persons paid for personal services performed, including persons paid from Federally funded programs such as the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA), paid elected officials, persons in a paid leave status and persons paid on a "per meeting," annual, semi-annual or quarterly basis. Unpaid officials, pensioners, persons whose work is performed on a fee basis, and contractors and their employees are excluded from the count of employees. **Full-time employees** are those persons whose hours of work represent full-time employment in their employer government; **part-time employees** are those persons who work less than the standard number of hours for full-time employment in their employer government.

Employee organization. An organization (e.g., union, association, federation, or council) that exists for the purpose, in whole or in part, of dealing with the employer concerning personnel policies and practices, employee grievances, labor disputes, wages, rates of pay, hours of employment and other conditions of work.

Collective negotiations. The method of determining conditions of employment through negotiations between representatives of the employer and employee organizations, usually resulting in a contract or agreement that is mutually binding.

Contractual agreement. A written document developed by collective negotiations between representatives of the employer and employee organizations that describes the conditions of employment (e.g., wages, hours, fringe benefits, etc.) and the methods by which disputes or grievances arising during the term of the contract shall be resolved. A contractual agreement is mutually binding on both parties and is for a definite period of time—usually one to three years.

Meet and confer discussions. The method of determining conditions of employment through periodic discussions between representatives of the employer and the employee organizations to seek agreement on matters within the scope of representation, frequently resulting in a nonbinding memorandum of understanding.

Memorandum of understanding. A written document usually developed from meet and confer discussions, and sometimes from the unilateral action of the employer, that describes the conditions of employment (e.g., wages, hours, fringe benefits, etc.) and the methods by which disputes or grievances between employer and employees shall be resolved. It is nonbinding but is sometimes tantamount to a labor contract in States that prohibit public sector collective negotiations.

Bargaining unit. A group of employees recognized as appropriate for representation by an employee organization for the purpose of collective bargaining and/or meet and confer discussions. Units commonly include both member and nonmembers of the employee organization. Bargaining units are classified in this report by categories that describe the majority of employees in the unit. Work stoppage. A concerted and complete withholding of services by employees which lasts for at least one workday or one work shift. A work stoppage is included in this report if its starting data fell during the survey period of October 13, 1979 through October 12, 1980.

Duration of work stoppage. The number of regular work shifts or workdays during which employees are idled by work stoppage. The **average duration** is computed by summing the number of work shifts or days idled and dividing the resultant total by the number of work stoppages.

Days of idleness. The total number of employee workdays or work shifts lost during a work stoppage. It is computed by multiplying the number of employees affected by a work stoppage by the number of work shifts or days that occur during the period of stoppage.

Work stoppage issue. As used in this report, this term refers only to the primary cause for the work stoppage. Economic and Hours issues refer to pay-for-labor disputes including shift differentials, overtime pay, salary scales, promotion guidelines, and the length and scheduling of work shifts. Job Security issues include seniority or layoff clauses, job maintenance, division of work, job transfers, subcontracting and mechanization. Administration issues relate to supervision of personnel, physical facilities, safety, work rules, work assignments, and employee discharge and discipline. Recognition disputes are those arising from the refusal of an employer to acknowledge an organization's right to represent some or all employees in matters affecting the conditions of employment, Organizational Security and Related Matters are issues involving the organization's continuance as the representative of employees, including such matters as dues checkoff, agency shop and maintenance of membership. The Other category covers those issues not elsewhere classified.

Contract Status. This term refers to the condition of contract negotiations at the time of the work stoppage. The **Recognition** category refers to situations where an employee organization has requested recognition but has not formally received it. **Negotiating First Agreement** means that the organization has been recognized as the official bargaining representative and negotiation of the first agreement has commenced. **Renegotiation of Existing Agreement** means that the parties have negotiated at least one agreement and the current dispute arose during renegotiation due to expiration or reopening. **During Time of the Agreement** means that there is a negotiated agreement in force. The **Other** category includes situations in which an employee organization is not involved, recognition is not legally allowed or has not been requested, and any other condition not elsewhere classified.

Method of Resolution. This term refers only to the final manner in which the work stoppage is resolved. Agreement of Parties means it was resolved by direct negotiation between the striking workers and the employer. Mediation is the introduction of a third party to help settle the dispute (the mediator may interpret, suggest and advise but does not make recommendations). Fact-finding is a procedure whereby an impartial individual, panel or board conducts an investigation in order to ascertain and report the facts surrounding the issues in dispute (the fact-finder, appointed by mutual agreement of the parties or under government authority, may have power to make recommendations and his report may be made public). Arbitration is a method of settling disputes through recourse to an impartial third party whose decision is usually final, but may be only advisory in certain circumstances. Arbitration is compulsory if required by law and voluntary when both parties agree to submit to it. An Injunction is a judicial order directing or prohibiting certain acts of the parties. Other methods of resolution covers methods not elsewhere classified, such as the employees returning to work without a settlement.

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
