




When the unwinding scroll of time writes "Finish" to our college years and the inevitable future has descended upon us, we shall look with a feeling of nostalgia back over the memorable past.

When all the smoke had cleared away the Bulldogs were runners-up in the LIC and had come very near to being the conference champs. Louisiana Tech turned them back in their only loss and that in a game which might easily have gone by the board on a dry field.

The season's record read six games won and two games lost, with one cancelled. The second loss the Bulldogs suffered was at the hands of power laden Mississippi Southern College, a rival the Bulldogs have been unable to defeat in many seasons now. The wins came at the expense of Stephen F. Austin, Southeastern, Livingston State Teachers (Alabama), Louisiana College, and the Northwestern State College Demons.

Throughout the season the Bulldogs did a good offensive job, rolling up 1,990.5 yards total offense,

1,536 by rushing and the remainder by passing. There were 73 first downs for the Bulldogs to the opposition's 89, however, many were long runs which would have been good for many more first downs had they been chopped up into smaller gains.

They rolled up a total of 165 points to the opposition's 58—not a bad record in any football league. The defense was alert and gave up only eight touchdowns during the entire season. Bulldog pass defense suffered few lapses and managed to gather in fifteen of their opposition's passes. There were thirteen fumbles hawked in by the Bulldogs, some of which were converted into touchdowns.

The Bulldog line, led by Andrus and Petit, was strong all the way across. Andrus was named to the Little All-America team of Grantland Rice and played in the annual north-south game. The other five stalwarts of the forward wall were: Carlton Touchet at right guard, Landry at left end, Zeringue at right end, Brian at left tackle, and Bill Bradley at center. Other members of the Bulldog "seven blocks of granite" for the 1947 football season were: Paul Di-Giovanni, C. L. Wink, Al Marks, Ray Hebert, L. J. Raymond, Rodney Broussard, A. D. Smith, Bobby Tabarlet, Bill Glidewell, William Prather, Warren

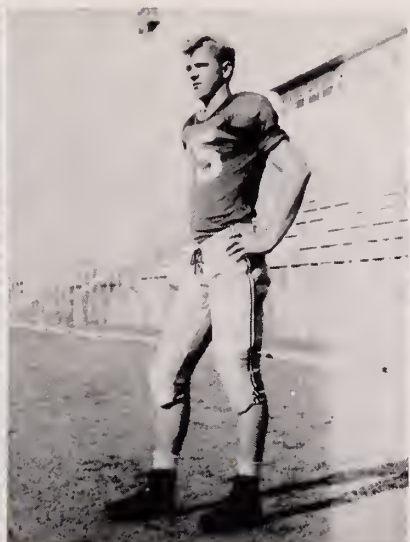

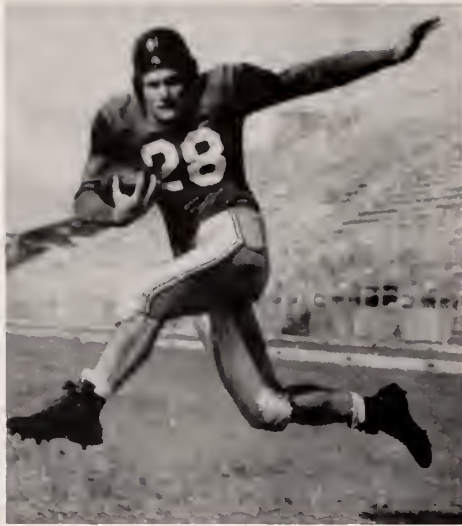

In this one, the Bulldogs probably played their best ball of the season. The first half saw only one touchdown scored and that came when Smith passed to Landry who went over standing up for the score. The second half opened with a bang when Smith raced 77 yards on the first play from scrimmage. Hatteberg kicked the point. A fumble set up the second score when Landry went around right end on the old end-around play. A little later Fisher took the ball from the Bulldog 48 and went all the way for another touchdown. Hatteberg

A bad punt gave the Bulldogs the ball deep in Lion territory and after a short drive Smith went over for another touchdown. Petit added the final touch and the game ended 40-7 for the Bulldogs.

The next victim of the powerful Bulldog team was the Livingston Alabama State Teachers College Tigers who were badly outclassed but managed to make

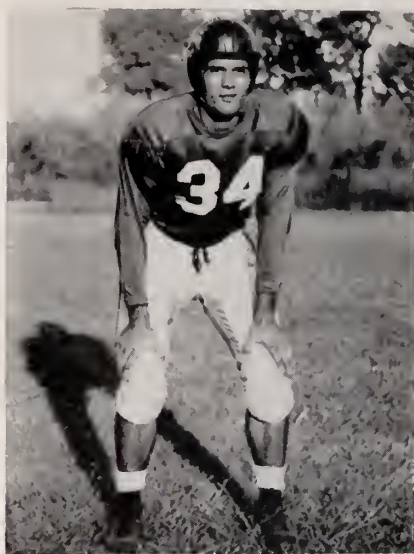

the game interesting, anyway. The Bulldogs scored three touchdowns in about eight minutes of play and then let the Tigers wear themselves out before they scored another. The first touchdown came when Frank Ferachi carried the ball almost all the way for a touchdown but fumbled and Fisher covered it in the end zone for the Bulldog's first touchdown. Hatteberg added the point. A blocked punt led to the next one with Chappuis carrying the ball. After the kick-off the Bulldogs took over and Fisher went all the way on the very first play, with Hatteberg adding the point. Late in the game the Bulldogs got another drive underway and scored with Negrotto going over.

In their next game Southwestern met defeat for the first time in seven games. The Mississippi Southern Southerners proved more than they could handle. The Bulldogs drew first blood when Smith passed to Fisher for a touchdown in the last 15 seconds of the first half, and Petit added the extra point. In the second half the Southerners scored a safety when they trapped Smith in the

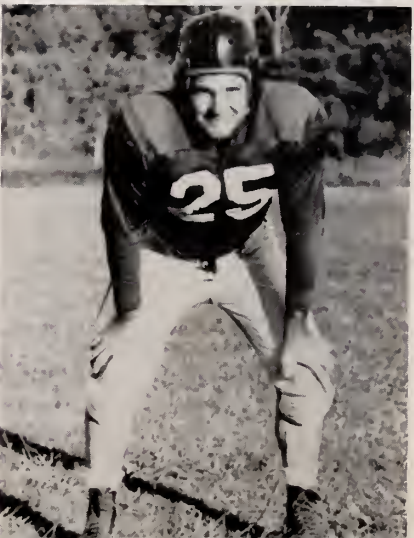

This was the only team to score two touchdowns on the Bulldogs all season. Homecoming found the Bulldogs lunging back from their defeat of the week before to trounce the Louisiana College Wildcats 38-7 in a wild scoring affair. Smith opened up in the first quarter with another Smith to Landry pass netting the first touchdown. Petit added the point. Jack Brignac scored the second touchdown when he bucked the line for two yards. A few minutes later the Bulldogs went all the way again with Chappuis scoring. The Wildcats managed to score on a desperation pass, and converted. Shortly after the third quarter opened, Dykes intercepted a pass and Brignac ran the ball over from the six, with Petit adding the point. The Bulldogs recovered a Wildcat fumble and Smith set up the score with passes to Zeringue and Caesar. Johnson went over on a quarterback sneak. Petit again converted.

A pass interception and another pass put the ball on the four and Caesar ran it over for the final tally.

In the mud and rain on Louisiana Tech's home field the Bulldogs lost their only game to an LIC opponent. They hadn't had the opportunity of working in the mud all season and their performance was seriously hampered. The first half was scoreless and the sec-

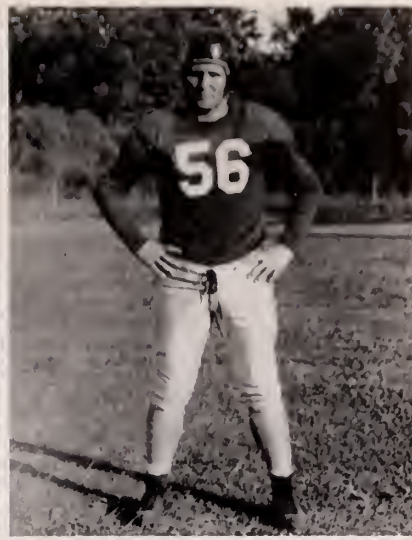

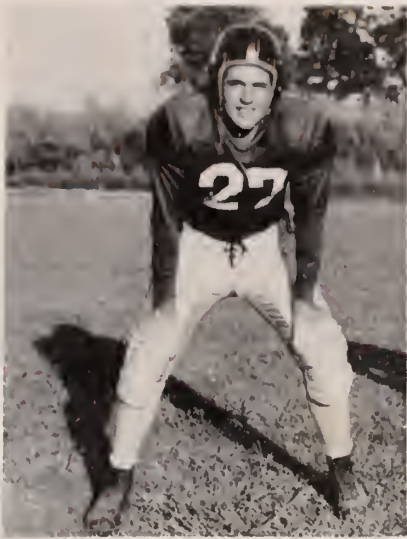

For Thanksgiving the Bulldogs had the Demons of Northwestern done to a sizzling brown when they came off the field, though for a time it seemed as if Southwestern's star had declined. The Demons crashed through with a touchdown on the second play of the game with Johnson passing to Jantz, and White

adding the point. The Bulldogs fumbled the kickoff but managed to hold the enemy. After this, the game see-sawed back and forth until about mid-way into the third period when Smith passed to Landry for a touchdown, the same old play that had scored often in several games earlier in the season. Petit missed the point that would have tied the score and the Bulldogs trailed until late in the final period when they drove to the Demon 5, lost 7 yards back to the 12, and Petit kicked a field goal from the 20-yard line. This spectacular last-minute score saved the day for Southwestern.

Thus ended the 1947 football season for the Southwestern Bulldogs, with 6 games won, 2 games lost, beaten by no more than one touchdown in any game they played, and scoring almost three times the number of points they allowed their opponents.

With this, Coach Mitchell brought to a close one of the best seasons Southwestern has ever enjoyed on the gridiron, definitely established as one of the small college football powerhouses.

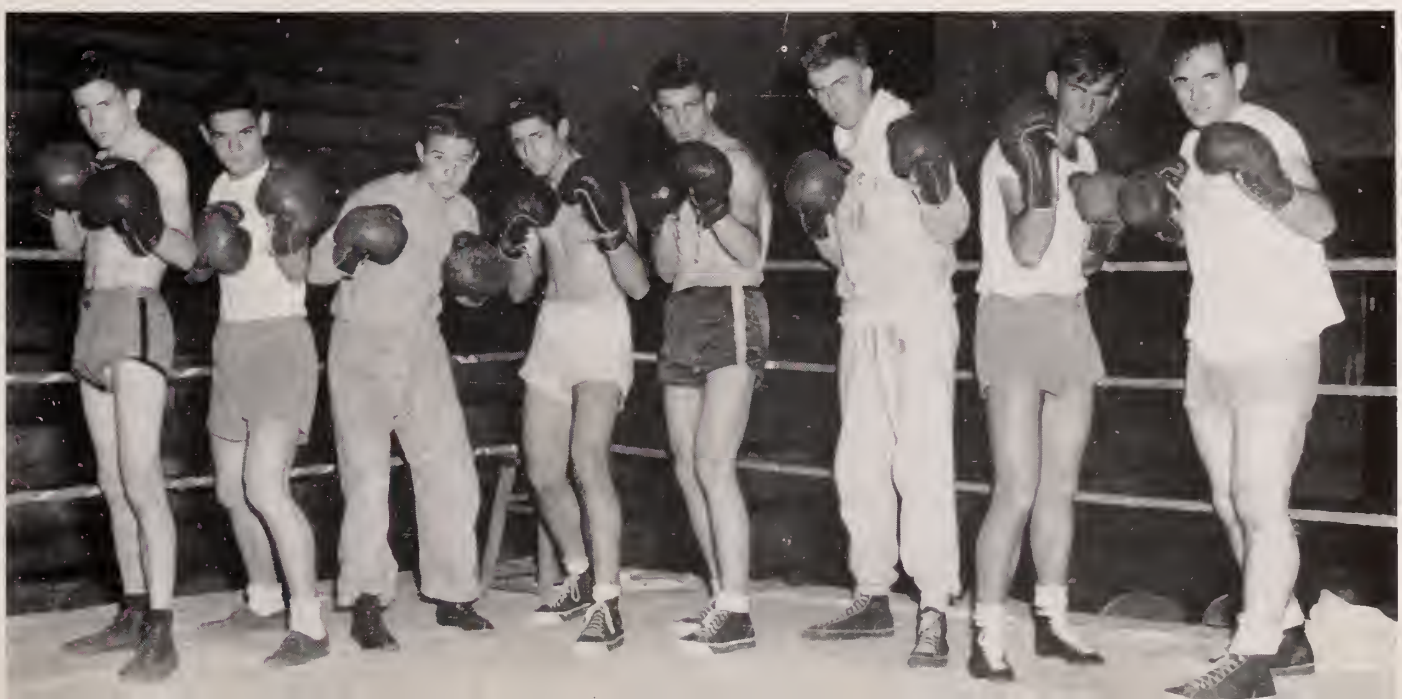
