























ATHLETICS






The Bulldogs scored in the first, second and twice in the third period to sink the Goslins. Left halfback Gerry Hodges and right halfback Dick Pate were the big guns in the Bulldog's running attack that grounded through the Pensacola line for a net of 266 yards and 13 first downs.



After the kick off, the Demons were held fast and




The Band and Red Jackets form a Texas steer

The 1948-1949 edition of Coach "Dutch" Reinhardt's Bulldog basketeers chalked up one of the finest records made at home by any S.L.I. hoop team in recent years winning ten games and losing only one before the home fans. However a poor record on the road which saw them win only two games ruined the hoopster's chances of any postseason tournament.

As it was, if the courtmen had made one more basket at crucial times in each of three different games this year, the Bulldogs would have copped the conference title instead of winding up in third place in the nine team Gulf States league.

The outstanding victory of the season was the 48-44 win over Rice Institute. This was indeed quite a feat since in the final Associated press poll, Rice was voted the top team in the Southwest region totaling more votes (by 161 AP writers) than either Arkansas, Arizona and Baylor. Rice was also Southwestern conference co-champion.







game by nipping Spring Hill, 45-41, after building up a 31-13 halftime lead. Mort Elkind was again high scorer with 14 markers, scoring eight of the Bulldog's fourteen second half tallies.

Then came the Camelia Bowl and Lloyd Verret's sensational exhibition of one-hand shooting. The eagle-eyed cager shot nine times in the first half and connected with seven. The Bulldogs downed Loyola 43-33 as Verret and Elkind accounted for 30 points between them. North Carolina defeated Arizona, 60-49, in the second game.

The Bulldogs lost two straight—44-50 to Centenary and 48-52 to Northwestern. Both games could have been won if the Bulldogs would have connected with just one more bucket in the last two minutes of either game. Coach Reinhardt revamped his starting line-up and the result was a overwhelming 70-27 win over Louisiana College. The next game saw the Red and White cagers present Coach Reinhardt with a 48-42 win over La. Tech. on "Reinhardt night".

A disastrous road trip saw Southeastern and Spring Hill avenge earlier season defeats by the Bulldogs. Elkind, who scored 22 points against the Lions the first time, accounted for 20 in a losing cause. The Bulldogs came up against the worst officiating of the year against Spring Hill which allowed the Badgers to catch up and overtake the Southwesterners, 54-49.

The Bulldogs then won their first road game of the year downing a fighting La. College team, 53-40, with Elkind and Verret leading the way with 16 and 13 points, res. A 1-3-1 zone by La. Tech. cost the Bulldogs another game at Ruston as they failed to hit the bucket from the outside. Catha hit for 19 points from the corners.

Travelling to New Orleans on the first day of the second semester, the S.L.I.'ers played under the television cameras for the first time and drubbed Loyola, 45-35 with Billy Globig and Elkind scoring a dozen points apiece. Northwestern became the only team to defeat the Bulldogs twice as they ran up a 54-43 score in Natchitoches.

Cathe, Verret and Elkind scored 34 markers between them to lead the Red and White to a 48-38 win over Centenary knocking the Gents out of the league lead. Bill Globig turned in a top notch defensive game holding Joey Johnson of the Gents to three baskets. The "city slickers" from Loyola came up against the Red and White for a third time in the season's finale and for a third time tasted defeat. Elkind scored 16, Verret 11, and Catha 10 as the curtain rang down for the season with a 48-36 win. For the first time in S.L.l. cage history, a Bulldog hoopster was named to the all-conference first team for a third consecutive season.

Mort Elkind, stellar Bulldog cager, wound up his colorful collegiate career this year by being selected first string guard on the all-Gulf States conference basketball team. Thus the New York born hoopster has garnered all-conference honors during each of his three years here at S.L.l.

Elkind also took top scholastic honors at graduation being one of seven in the graduating class of 627 to graduate "with highest distinction". He was awarded a graduate assistantship in Chemistry in the Louisiana State University Graduate School for his high scholastic rating.

Coach "Dutch" Reinhardt placed Elkind on his first team all-time all-Southwestern hoop team, and to prove that Coach Reinhardt made no mistake, we are printing the following excerpts from the sport sections of various local and state-wide newspapers.

AIR FORCE RESERVE OFFICERS TRAINING CORPS AT S. L. I.

Once again the Southwestern campus has assumed a military air. As during the days of the wartime Navy and Marine V-12 program, Southwestern has adapted itself to the needs of military education. The establishment of a unit of the Air Reserve Officers' Training Corps at Southwestern marks the beginning of a momentous phase in the history of this school.

The mission of the Air ROTC program is to supply

the United States Air Force with reserve officers who may be called upon in time of national emergency. The Southwestern Air ROTC unit is beginning its second semester with a corps of over 300 cadets, of whom a large number are veterans from every branch of the military service.

The complete Air ROTC course covers the usual fouryear college period, divided into a two-year basic course and a two-year advanced course. The successful com-

pletion of the program leads to a reserve commission in the USAF.

Basic-course cadets attend Military Science classes two hours a week, advanced-course cadets four hours a week. The entire cadet corps spends one hour a week in close order drill.

The advanced course, restricted at present to sixty members, is currently composed solely of men with previous military experience. These advanced Air ROTC cadets receive subsistence pay of \$27 a month during the school year and \$75 a month while attending summer camp. This is in addition to the subsistence pay received under provisions of the "G. I. Bill."

Students in the basic course receive classroom instruction in subjects applicable to all services, such as military organization, map reading, first aid and infantry drill. Advance course classes deal with Air Force subjects, such as Air Force inspecion systems, statistical control, transportation, supply, organization, meteorology, aeronautics and personnel management. Cadets receive regular college credits for these classes.

A draft exemption quota, issued from Washington, assures the Air ROTC cadets virtual immunity from their draft boards as long as the cadets' work satisfies the requirements of the Military Department.

Upon entering the advanced course, each cadet signs a two year contract with the government, obligating him to complete the four-year course and accept a reserve commission in the USAF.

The Military Department owes a great deal to President Joel L. Fletcher, Dean Joseph A. Riehl, other college authorities and the faculty. Their cooperation and interest in the new program since its debut in September has helped the Military Department shape the cadet corps into what is hoped will prove to be the outstanding Air Reserve Officers' Training Corps unit in the 12th Air Force.

A recent statement by President Fletcher points out his interest in this embryonic organization:

"Southwestern Louisiana Institute is very proud of the Air ROTC. The College Administration pledges its fullest cooperation to the development of this important phase of college life today.

"The Air Force has assigned a fine group of officers to the unit. These men are doing a splendid work in training the students who are members of the Air ROTC.




