This theme should be seen in our lives as well.



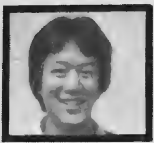
One of the most admired features on the campus is the faculty and staff. People are proud of a president who works for the students in his actions and decisions.

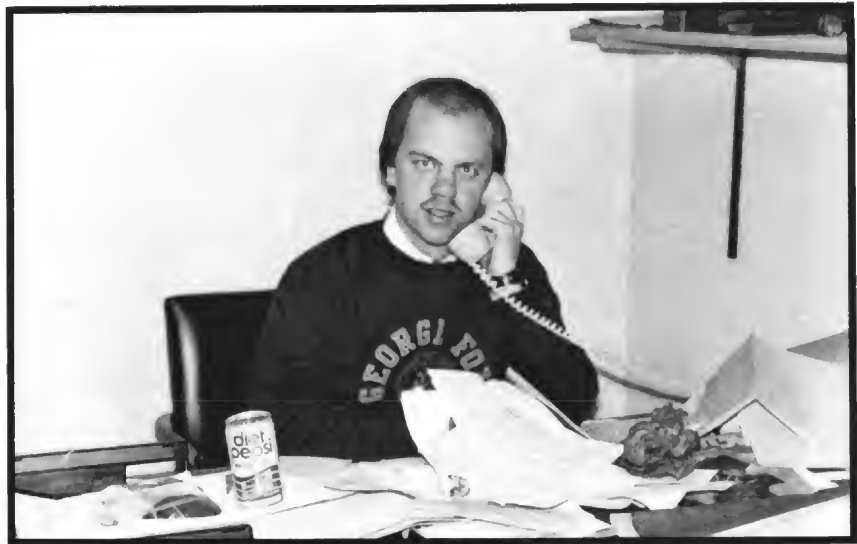
Craig Littlefield and Sharon Gilmore received their gallon pins in the blood drive held at GFC on November 1.

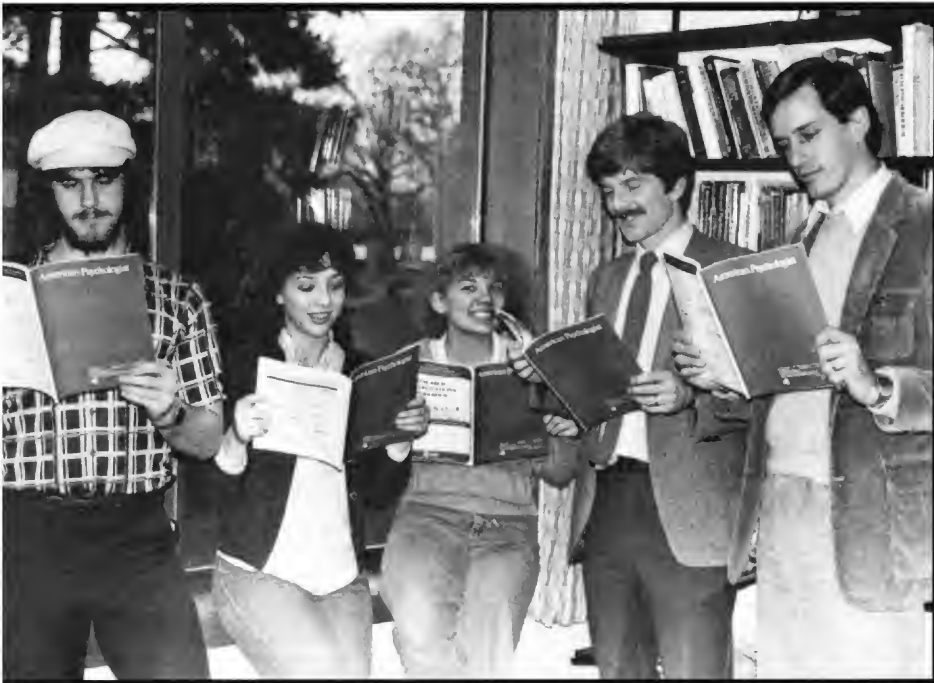
SIGMA ZETA

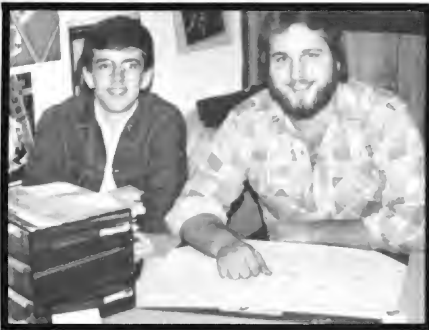

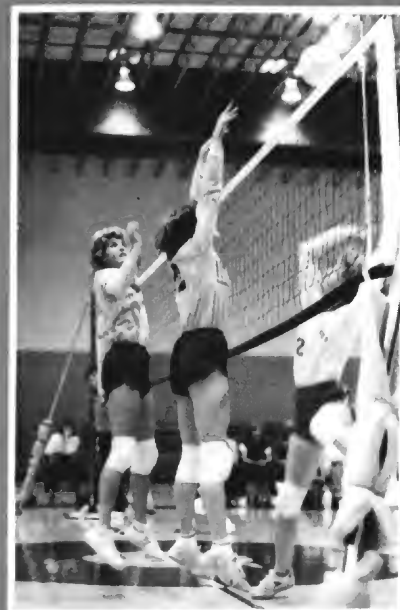

Under the direction of Paul Berry, soccer has returned to GFC. GFC had a soccer program once before, but it was discontinued.

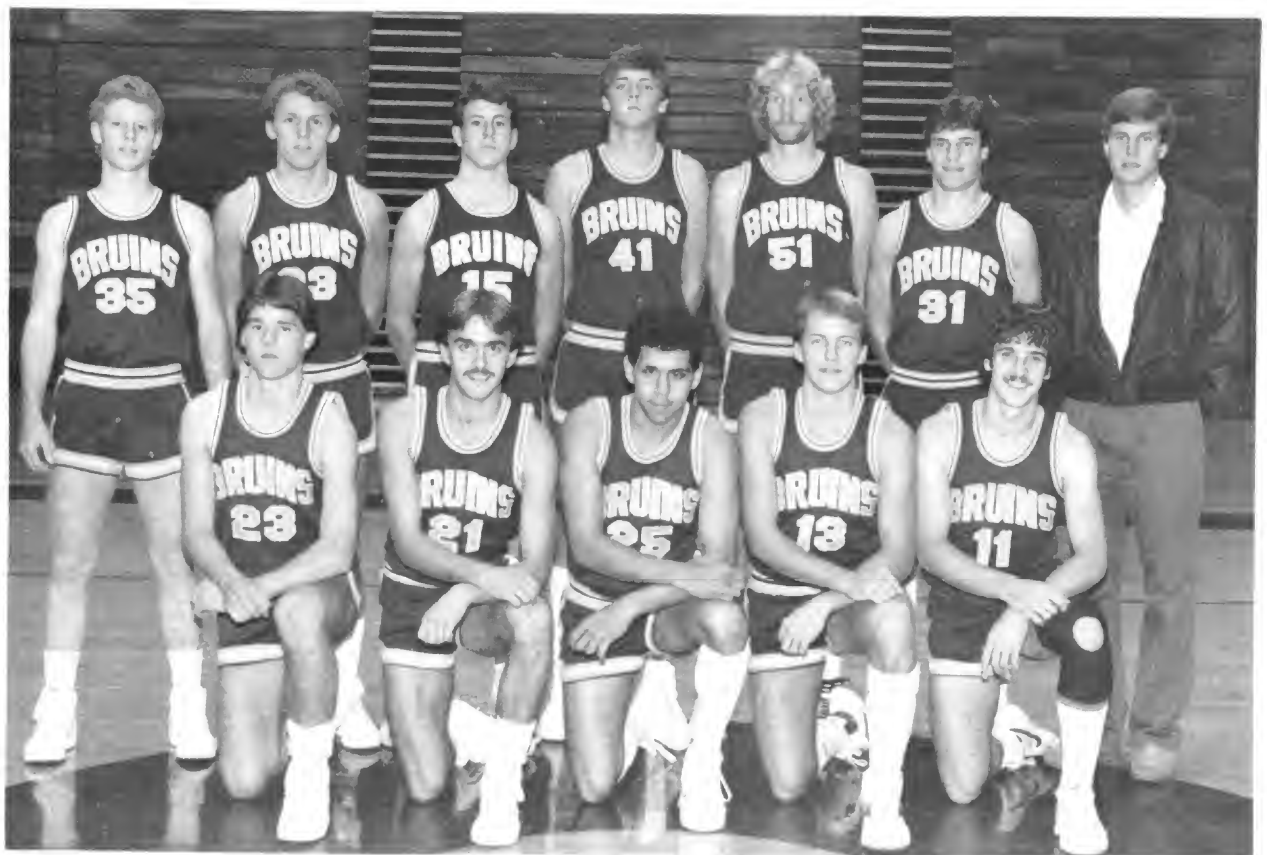




The day is done, and the darkness
