FOREWORD

This bibliography was compiled primarily for use by members of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics who are working on subjects pertaining to land economics. Others in the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, in Agricultural Colleges, Experiment Stations, and the Extension Service, and other agencies and individuals who are interested in land classification, may find it useful.

In compiling the bibliography the viewpoint adopted was that land classification constitutes an integral phase in the development of programs of land use. The bibliography is designed, therefore, to serve as a handy reference to recent literature relating to this phase of land-use programs.

The basic source of the reference material included has been the Bibliography on Land Utilization, 1918-36 (1938). References have also been taken from the files in the Land Classification Section of the Bureau, from card catalogues of various libraries in the U. S. Department of Agriculture system, and from a number of indexes to current literature. A complete list of the sources is given on page III. This bibliography is, therefore, at once a selected part of the Bibliography on Land Utilization, 1918-36, and a supplement to it.

The materials of the bibliography are limited mainly to reports, bulletins, monographs, and articles on land classification studies and to reports of investigations made in the field. References closely related to this type of classification, however, are also included, such as descriptions and analyses of land-utilization patterns in particular areas, classifications of present land use, inventories of present and potential resources, and classifications of land in terms of use capabilities. References regarding general discussions of land classification in its theoretical aspects and in its relation to land policies, forestry, soils, irrigation, etc., are included. The land-classification references selected, moreover, are concerned in general with classifications which group land areas according to problems for the purpose of recommending certain measures of land-use adjustment. They are not concerned with classifications of land according to types of farming, types of vegetation, types of soil, types of tenure, erosive conditions, etc.

The numbers enclosed in parentheses at the end of certain references signify that those references are listed in the Bibliography on Land Utilization, 1918-36 (1938).

The numbers correspond with the item numbers under which the references may be found in that Bibliography. The asterisk (*) at the end of a limited number of references signifies that these materials are in the files of the Division of Land Economics but are not available for general distribution.

The index of Authors, page , should be consulted for item numbers to locate references in this Bibliography. The material to which these items refer, except that taken from the Bibliography on Land Utilization, have been examined by the compiler. A brief description of the content of items in the Bibliography on Land Utilization is contained in that publication.

Grateful acknowledgment is made of advice and suggestions received from Harold A. Vogel, principal agricultural economist, and William F. Jusbach, associate agricultural economist, and of the work of Mrs. Frieda Goetze, who made a preliminary compilation of references.
