Read Exodus 2:11-15. Put yourself in Moses' shoes. What feelings or thoughts do you think he might have been feeling at that time?

Read Exodus 3:1-10. Make a list of the verbs God uses in verses 7-10.

What do those words communicate to you about God and his relationship to people?

What does that passage teach you about prayer?
