Read Daniel 2 (p. 613)

What do you think of the king's demand?

The words of the astrologers in response to the king are telling: "No one can reveal it to the king except the gods, and they do not live among men." They are admitting that even though they claim to be magicians and/or psychics, they don't actually have access to supernatural truth!

Today, people are still fascinated with those who claim access to the supernatural (tarot, astrology, etc.) Why do you think that is? Is there any truth to their claims? Have you ever shared that fascination?

How is Daniel's response different from that of the other wise men?

When God comes through and reveals the dream to Daniel, Daniel praises God for two things: wisdom and power. What does Daniel say about God's wisdom? What does he say about God's power?

Aside from all the debates, the best interpretation of the dream is probably this: Three kingdoms will follow Babylon, the Persians, the Greeks, and the Romans, before God establishes his own forever kingdom. On Sunday, I remarked that this prophecy is fulfilled in Jesus. He claimed that the kingdom of God had arrived in him, existed among his followers, and would later come in fullness.
