
Dear Del:-







My dear Rob:

I have your reply to my inquiry in regard to the Bowen Biography. Most booksellers expect 40% discount, but this is adjusted according to the number of copies ordered, and the type of book. I have a letter today from the Presbyterian Committee of Publication that runs the Massanetta Conference Book Store. They will take copies on sale provided that a 40% discount is allowed on all sales, and that unsold copies be returnable. This means that they would pay you \$1.50 a copy for those sold. You would pay the shipping charges for sending to Massanetta, and they would pay the return charges. They say - and I believe it is true - that the \$2.50 price will make the sale much smaller than if it could be offered at \$2.00. I think the sales would be larger if the book could be offered at \$2.00, and if booksellers could be given a 30% discount. This would mean that you would receive \$1.40 a copy, but would pay the postage from the press. I think it is right to offer a larger discount on books purchased outright in quantities, but not for those merely received on consignment for sale, and return of unsold copies.

I am sorry not to be able to be at any of the meetings of the General Assembly, but as no responsibility takes me there I am not going.
