As you may know, Dr. Speer has written and is publishing a life of George Bowen, a remarkable missionary to India who died about fifty years ago and who was founder and editor of the Bombay Guardian. Private funds are available for the printing of this biography. Would you favor having it published under the auspices of THE MISSIONARY REVIEW PUBLISHING CO.? It would involve us in no financial obligation and would, I believe, be of real advantage to Dr. Speer and to THE REVIEW as well. It will help to make the volume more widely known. Orders could be sent through this office but would be filled by the printers. THE REVIEW Articles of Incorporation permit us to publish books but we would not expect to make money on this service.

Dr. Speer favors this proposition and plans, from special funds, to donate copies of the book to mission-aries of various denominations.

Please let me know if you approve of this proposal. If so, we will proceed to perfect the plans with Dr. Speer.
