



Dear Dr. Spear:

I am so very anxious to find help in some perplexing problems, and there seems to be no one near to whom I can go. Perhaps if I were free to go about I might find some one in St. Joe or in Kansas City able to advise me. But I am quite tied with my work as a practical nurse. So you will please pardon me for troubling you. Perhaps I should confess that anyway you are the one whom I prefer above all others to consult. I say this for two reasons: first, because I have read at the end of my 1908 edition of W. E. Blackstone's "Jesus is Coming" that you had read it twenty years before and that you approved of it, thus showing that you are a Premillennialist, and second, because you are a member and a leader in our own church. A Premillennialist in our own church, that is one who is also an outstanding Christian leader is not so easy to find in these days, it seems to me.

My questions are about the importance of studying prophecy and where to find safe leadership in its study. Lately I have had access to the Sunday School Times and have been reading about an International Prophetic Conference held recently in New York City. It seems these conferences have been held during the last twenty-five years at least. Do you approve of these conferences?

In the Christian Church today there seem to be two widely divergent trends and two very distinct views of the manner in which the Kingdom of God is to be established upon earth. I have always been a Premillennialist and am eager to find writers or speakers of today, favoring this belief, who are of our own church or are at least approved by some of our own leaders. I have long wished I might see a copy of your book "What Christ Means in my Life" as, I believe, you touch upon Christ's Second Coming in it.

Do advise me how to get the best help on this subject.

Do you like the notes and explanations in the Scotfield Bible? They seem to me helpful. I have read Gordon's "Ecce Venit" and liked much of it.

How do you regard the trend of writings in the Sunday School Times? Or do you see them? I am now reading the series by Dr. Louis S. Bauman. Does he not perhaps go too far in assigning exact events to the fulfillment of specific prophecies? And in the last issue of the "Times" that of January 27<sup>th</sup>, Dr. Rowell's article "Shall the Pope be Supreme Arbiter" has crystallized the fearful dread I've been having all along in recent times as newspaper items have shown the tendency of all Christendom to turn to the Pope for help. Is Dr. Rowell too strong in what he says, I wonder.

Another question which is mine at the very present. In our next missionary meeting I have been assigned to lead a devotional service, using a chapter on "Mysticism" in John A. McAfee's book "Toward a Vital Christian Experience." Mr. McAfee's discussion of mysticism seems for the most part fairly sound, treating it chiefly as a vitally spiritual communion with God. But is it not very unfortunate to use the words "Mysticism" and "Mystic" ? And is it not very regrettable that in this discussion he alludes with commendation to Pagan Mysticism ?

I shall very much appreciate your reply. I've been wishing for years to write to you about these questions. I trust I am not laying too heavy a burden upon you.

I want to express my warm appreciation of your very generous offer to give us a number of copies of your memoirs of George Bowen of Bombay for our Mission Stations.


This book would be most helpful for our missionaries and I am eager for them to have an opportunity to read it.
