Dear Friends:

Some of you may have seen or read the book which Dr. Robert E. Speer published last year, <u>GEORGE BOWEN OF BOMBAY</u>. Dr. Speer gave us some copies of this book at the time and has now made the offer to send us more copies for missionaries of our Board who may care to have it. We are, therefore, asking him to send us fifty copies more, one for each mission of the Board, with additional copies for the missions in India and Ceylon. If there is demand for still further copies, we feel sure that Dr. Speer will allow us a few more.

"Dr. Robert E. Speer's 'retirement' has already borne fruit. We are in his debt for another notable biography of a missionary through his book GEORGE BOWEN OF BOMBAY: MISSIONARY. SCHOLAR. MYSTIC. SAINT., privately printed for distribution to missionaries.

"George Bowen was one of the unique figures in missionary work in India during the last century and in this book Dr. Speer has in the main followed the method of letting him speak for himself by means of long quotations from his revealing letters and diary.

"Coming from a home of wide literary culture and holding a position of religious unbelief, Mr. Bowen's conversion to Christianity led him to a complete reversal of ideas and, indeed, of character. He set about with keenness of mind and inexorableness of spirit to be the sort of simple Christian whom he found pictured in the New Testament record. His quest led him to Union Theological Seminary and in 1836 to missionary appointment to India under the American Board. .

"It was Mr. Bowen's definite plan on going to India never to return to America and, frail as he seemed to be and attacked by severe illness in his first years, he was able to carry out this program through a long life of unusually active service. . .

"Any one who dips into this book will not only be inspired by George Bowen's spirit but also deeply impressed by his keenness of mind and his remarkable gift of expression. Indeed, it may be that the greatest influence of his life was exerted through his editorship for many years of the Bombay Guardian. One lays down the book with the feeling that through it he has been put in touch with a Christian devotee of rarely beautiful character. . . "
