MEMORANDUM for personal use.

Dr. Hill of the Canadian Presbyterian Board was in this morning for conference with regard to the possibility of:

- (a) cooperative work in the school at Jhansi;
- (b) the possibility of their Board teking over all our work at Jhansi and Gwaliore

The Canadian Presbyterians are prepared now to enter into some arrangement with the American Presbyterians for cooperation in these schools. The proposal is that the Canadian Presbyterians close their boys' school and send their boys to the A.P. Mission School. The distance between these schools is at present about a mile and a quarter. The Canadians have a good hostel accommodating about 150 boys, which they would expect to put at the disposal of the combined school. The American Presbyterian hostel on our Jhansi Compound would be closed. It is very cld; the rooms are dark, small; it is in poor repair and it would be good to have this arrangement.

There would have to be some agreement reached with regard to the adjustment of expenses - perhaps through the charging of fees to the boys of the Canadian Mission School for their tuition and the Canadian Mission charging boys from our school for hostel accommodations. This would probably have to be worked out on the field.

Some arrangement would probably have to be made also by which the Canadian Mission might have a voice with regard to the teachers in the school and express opinions with regard to their qualifications and effectiveness.

The Canadian Presbyterians would be prepared to take over practically all our work in Jhansi and Gwalior at once:

From General Board Minutes:

"That we acknowledge with thanks receipt through W. H. Hezlep of letters from Mr. Lowther of the Canadian Presbyterian Mission, regarding the distribution of responsibility and work in Gwalior and in Jhansi, and assure Mr. Lowther and the Canadian Presbyterian Mission of our desire to consider with them the most effective arrangement for meeting our joint responsibility in these areas; in this connection the Evaluation and Planning Conference of 1938-39 under our Board of Foreign Missions will call for the fullest possible information on all matters connected with these fields, and any information the Canadian Presbyterian mission can supply will be gratefully received."

My understanding of their property needs would be that they would wish to keep the school and the church buildings, but would not be especially interested in our bungalows since they have adequate bungalow accommodation for all their missionaries on their own compound.

Dr. Hill has premised to said me the action of his Board with regard to the combining of the schools and to write me a letter indicating their desires with regard to taking over the work at Jhansi and Gwalior.
