

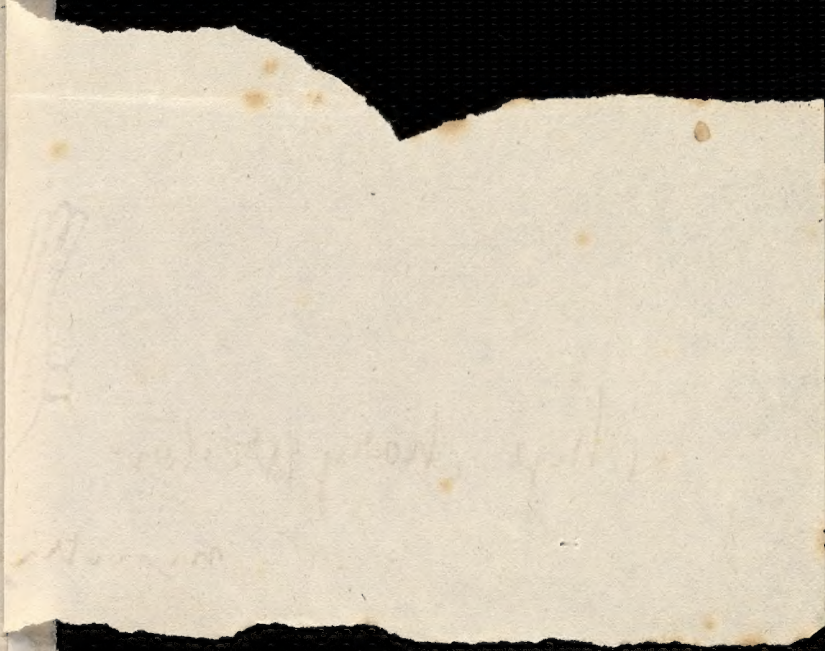
Love to Grandmama Aunt
