Leicester 4<sup>th</sup> Mar 17<sup>th</sup> 1839

Dear Friend

I yesterday received a letter from thee requesting the Females of this town to furnish a table at the fair. I have not seen Sarah P. May, and do not know whether she or any other person out of our society (which embraces but a small section of the township) will feel an interest in the cause, but we think we should like to furnish one if some individual in Boston would be willing to tend it for us; as we know of no one among our members to whom it would be convenient and agreeable to perform this duty.

We should like to be informed what articles are most salable and perhaps we may wish to commission you to purchase some materials. I do not know whether the town of Leicester has any device or not, but will endeavor to ascertain & inform thee soon, if thou thinks you can procure some one to take charge of the table.

The package of "The Cradle of Liberty" which is sent to Leicester comes free of expense, I would therefore thank thee to direct my copy of the "Non-Resistant" to be sent in the same with them; and as I paid Henry C. Wright for this, if you like to send another copy for circulation, I will endeavor to make it as useful as I can in disseminating the principles of "Peace on earth and good will to men!" You will understand that it is not for my own accommodation that I make this proposition, & consult your own interest in regard to compliance with it; but as there are only two copies taken in this town, I thought perhaps you might like to send another.

Whatever letters or circulars it may be necessary to send to my Brother, <sup>Wm</sup> B. Carle, Sister Eliza, or myself, might also be sent in the same package, for as our bill for postage is unavoidably large each quarter, we are willing to save this expense whenever we can conveniently do it.



Have you sent letters on the subject of the fair to the towns adjoining  
us? Holden, Paxton, Spencer, Oxford, Charlton and Auburn?  
I think in some of those places they might like to furnish a table,  
or send articles to you for your disposal. Sister Eliza wishes me  
to enquire whether you expect to have a Post Office department  
connected with it?
