

Leicester 12<sup>th</sup> Mo. 17<sup>th</sup> 1841

Dear Friend

Enclosed B<sup>1</sup> & M which I thank thee to hand to thy husband in pay for 1 doz. "Slavery as it is," which I took from the A. S. office to sell in 9<sup>th</sup> mo 1839, & for which I should like a receipt.

I wish we could purchase a table for the Fair from ~~Millbury~~ Leicester, but we sent what articles we had to Millbury & since that time we have ~~no~~ <sup>no</sup> ~~more~~ <sup>more</sup> ~~of~~ <sup>of</sup> our Society, which is very small since our school, which formerly furnished the greater portion of the members, was discontinued. I do not know whether our friends in the village intend sending anything or not.

For the remaining B 1, 25 please send me by the bearer 2 copies of the new "Liberty Bell," & if there be any remainder, anti-slavery wafers to the amount.
