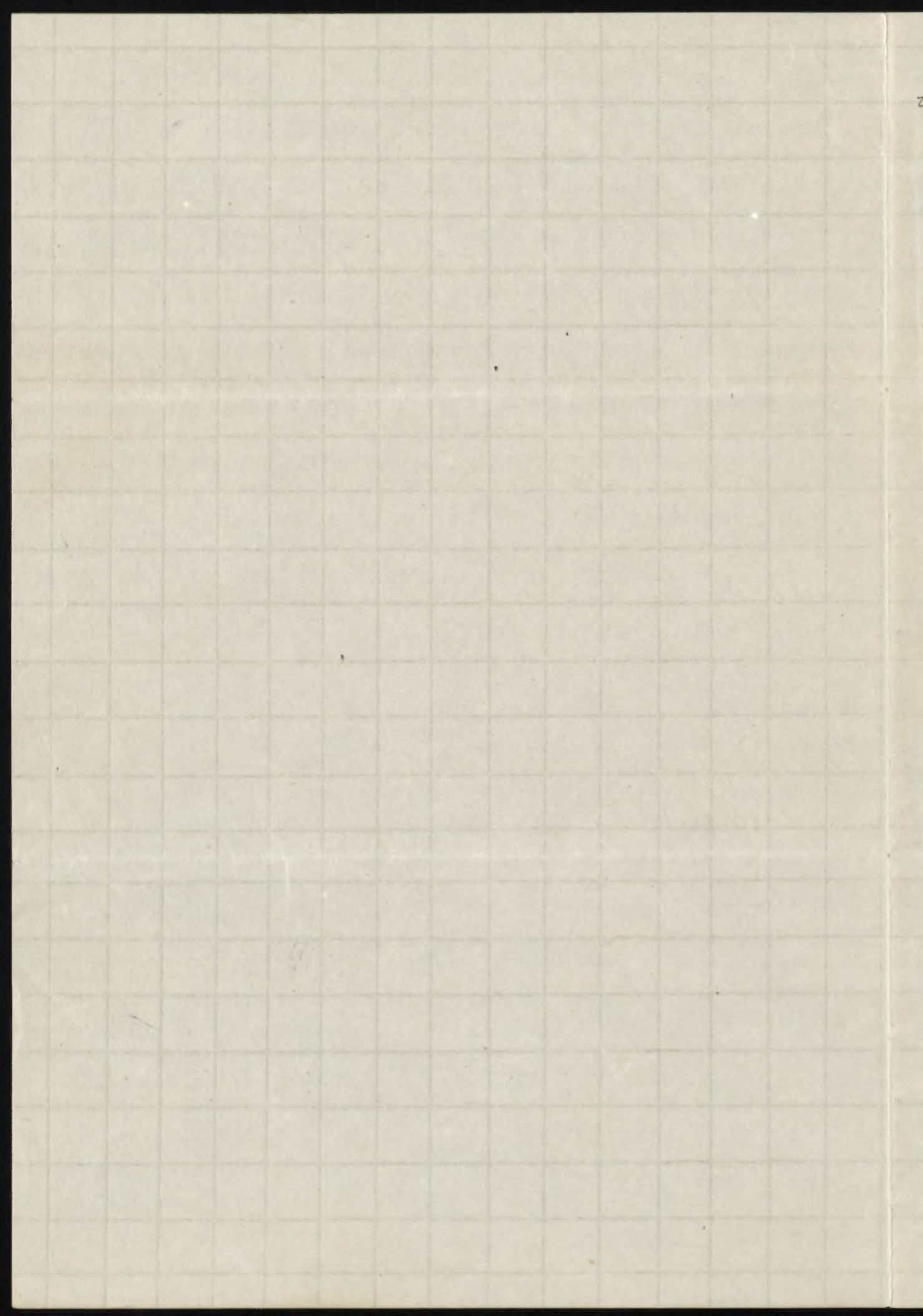


Old Cambridge, Dec 20th 1873.
