Sunday Morning.

Dear Mr May,

A very painful & suffering
scene has just closed with
us. My aunt died last
night about half past 10.

I write at the request
of her sisters who join with
my father in the wish that
you should attend her
funeral.

It will take place on

Tuesday, Afternoon next
at half past 2.

We have arranged it
thus early, that you might
return to town in the half
past four train, which
is the last one into town
from Weymouth. We will
send a sleigh for you to
North Braintree; the cars
leave the Old Colony Depot
at a quarter of 10; it would
be inconveniently early for

you to take the mail train
to Weymouth.

I earnestly trust that
your engagements are
such that you may be
able to comply with this
arrangement.

Thank you for your
care about the proof;
I will correct it & return
it with this.
