Dear Sam —

I hope you will be in town next Thursday to attend the ~~next~~ meeting, (concerning the letter of the Unitarian Ministers,) at Berry Street vestry. I wish you would bring with you an authentic record of your speech made in Great Britain (Dublin was it?) in which you alluded to ^{me, at Taunton, England} the course of the Ministers of this country in relation to Slavery. It was said in the Boston Association that you had spoken with severity of them (i.e. Unitarian Ministers in America) and that this was the occasion of the letter. I think it likely that something of the sort may be said on Thursday, & I wish you to be "forewarned & forearmed" —

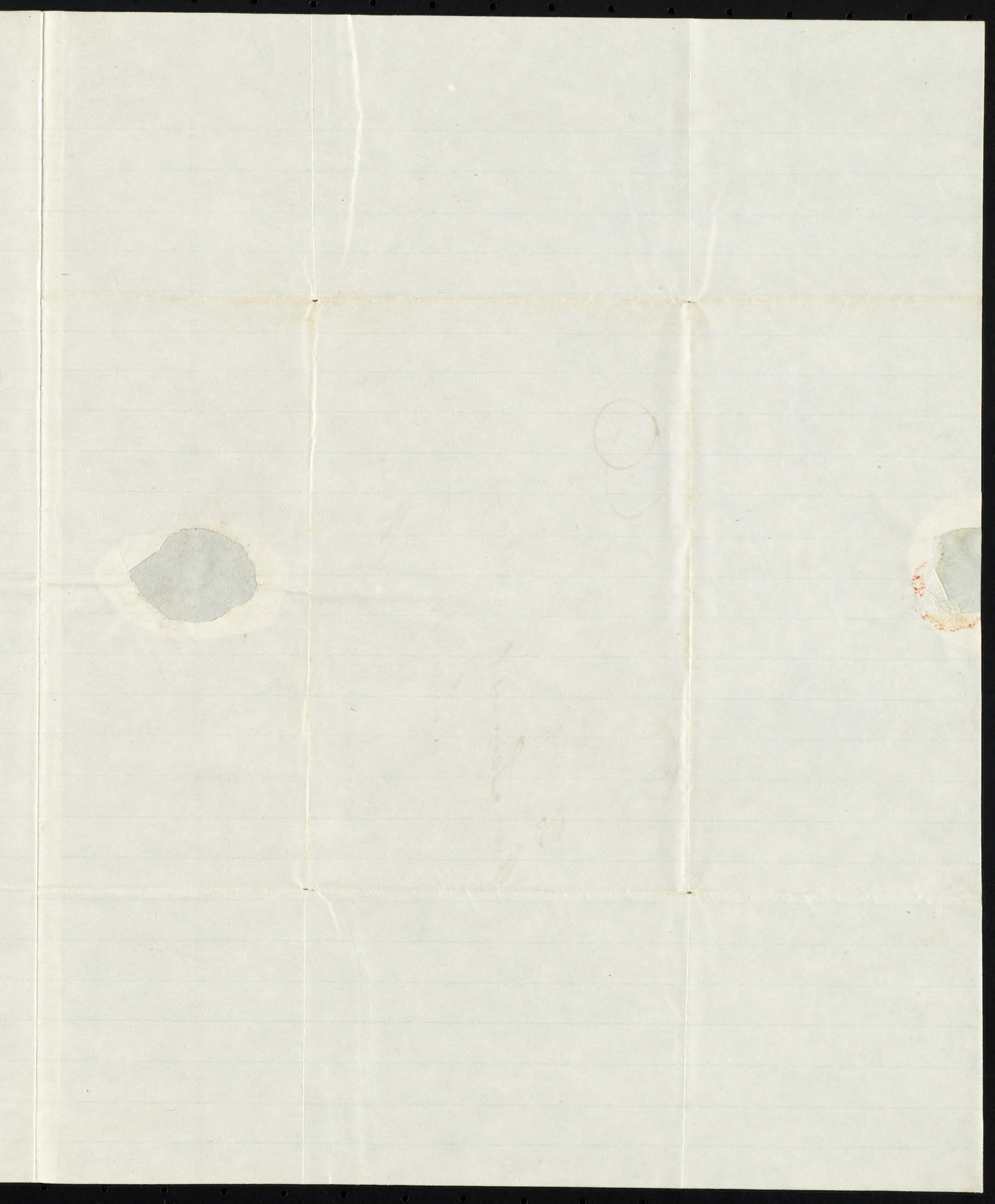
