

Brighton S.S. Morristown.

Thursday 5 P.M.

Oct 9th 1851

My dear Sam

Had a fine journey:
on the platform stood Robt. Charleston.
He cordially greeted me, & after a
word or two about the weather, he
passed, looked in post card, & told
me, he had written something for
the "Mercury" to explain himself
as he was misunderstood: I ap-
plauded his proceeding, & then
got into a double carriage, & seated
myself in one compartment where
no one was: Mr. C. seeing me there,
joined me. Our discourse was
much & to me amusing, we talked

on all
points, & I told him wherever he
had blundered. But this evening,
the conversation was not interest-
ing, friend has not a comprehen-
sive mind, and is utterly ignorant
about A.S. matters. But our
union was not only friendly, (that
is too cold a term), it was down
right affectionate. He told me
Mr. Eaton persuaded him to write
his letter. When written & doubting
whether he ought to put in the
papers anything so barred as Mr.
Wickham's, he saw Eliza's sentiment
so he put it at an antidote!
He is a weaker man than I thought
he was; I regret having made myself
noise in talking to him. Still I

amplified to find what poor creatures
we have to deal with. I gave
Robert the Liberator to read. He
soon pitched upon, & shewed me
with exultation, where Garrison
uses the terrible expression, that
the Americans were worse than
the Jews that crucified Christ.
I told him I agreed with W. L. G.

I was at Mr. Wibley's at 12, &
at Mr. Gromb's before 1. I had a most
pleasant chat with him, & a
very instructive ^{one} as regards knowing
him more fully. I told him about
W. L. G. & thought I will write
lines to him or Miss A. Weston.
He likes all the things we send him
& inserts them readily. The act
of the Bazaar will be insisted.

He gave me to Aug's paper which
I send. He has written to
Prof. Wyl. am. Their's was an
excellent idea. N. G. is much
pleas'd. I wish others wd do
the same - From Fleet St

I drove to Chittin's. he was out.
Then on to the Myrtle Station, &
was there 2 minutes before 2: at
2.45 started for B. & arrived at 3.50
Have just dined. Anna cheerful
& looking well - Not tired
