Remembrance of J. A. Huntington Esq
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To the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States :
 The undersigned,
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 in the Commonwealth
 of Massachusetts, believing it demanded by every consideration of justice and humanity, of con-
 sistency and good government, by the honor of the nation and the law of God, do respectfully
 and earnestly pray your honorable bodies to abolish slavery, immediately and entirely, in the Dis-
 trict of Columbia.
 They also respectfully pray your honorable bodies, promptly to reject all proposals
 for the admission of Florida, or any other new State into this Union, whose constitution of gov-
 ernment shall permit the existence of domestic slavery.
