

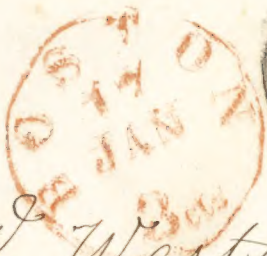

My dear Miss Weston,

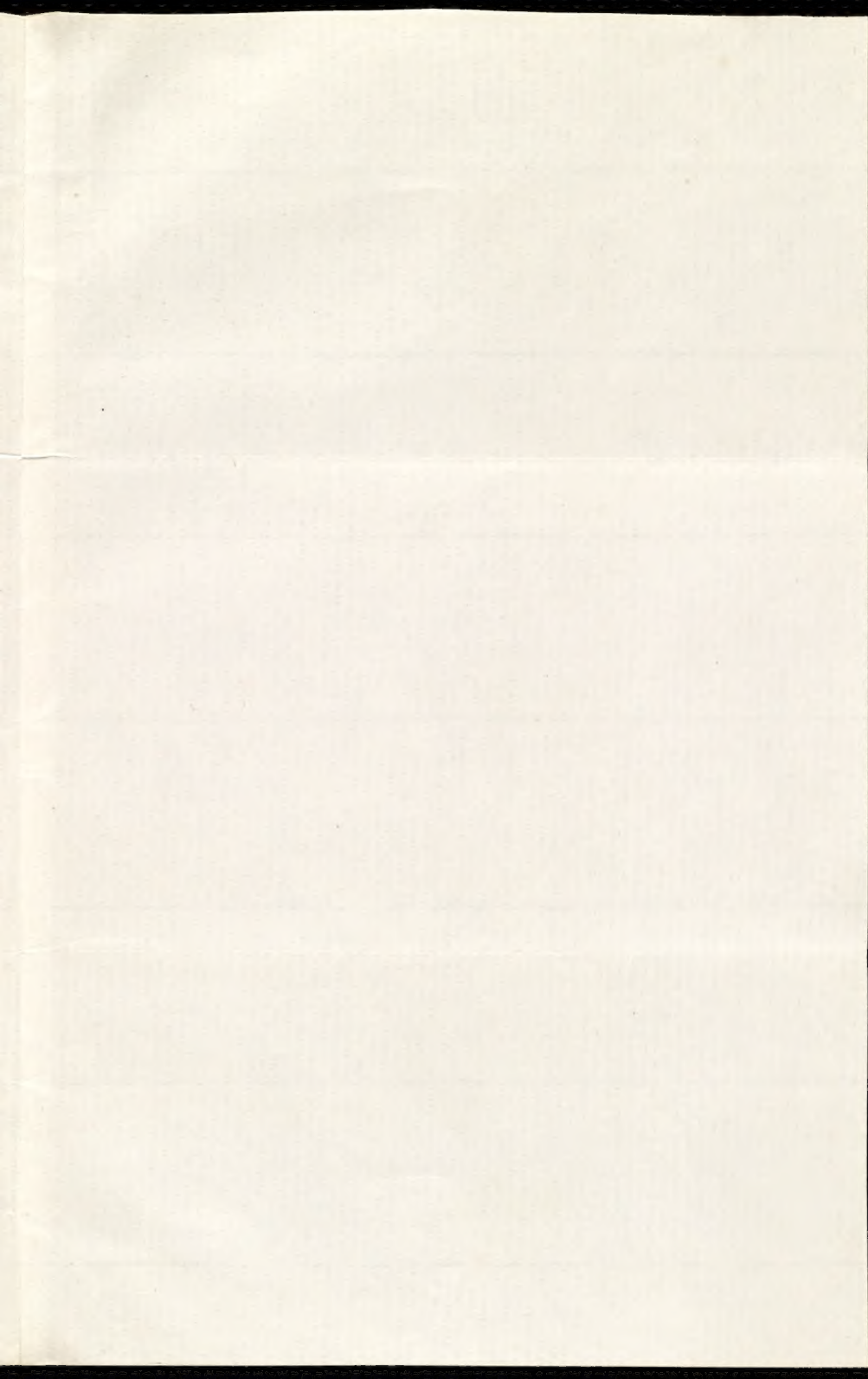
Crosby & Nichols have
