

Sir I received a letter from Col^o. Elliot at
Hampton this moment informing that he
has bro^o. to a Rhode Island Vessel loaded with
Green Cyder Apples &c. The papers found
on board accompany this. That gentleman also
informs me another Vessel of Lt. Dunmore is taken
at Hampton with fourteen white men & two black
on board, and as the guard House there is much per-
sued he has ordered Cap^t. Holliers company to escort
the prisoners to this place & I believe they may be
expected today. That company is discharged their
Service ^{by the commanding Officer there} for Reasons I think very sufficient.
Very little salt of the last Cargoes is yet landed
because Col^o. Elliot understands it is in contempla-
tion to convey some of it away by water. Twenty odd
Muskets a few Bayonets & Cartouch Boxes are
found in the Tender together with some Cash & a
few other articles which await the Disposal of the
Convention. One of the Boats taken from the Enemy
was beat to pieces by the Violence of the Weather &
totally lost. Some papers respecting Collett are
sent herewith. With perfect Devotion to the Con-
