Dear Friend

I am

requested by Mr Emerson and many
other friends to add my entreaties to
theirs in behalf of a contemplated con-
vention in this Town - & I do it read-
ily because I am convinced of the im-
portance of the measure -

We all believe that the discussion un-
awakened here by the surrender of
a fugitive & the abandonment of one
of our citizens to the horrors of a
Southern prison - may be made the
means of greatly advancing the cause
- Mr Richardson his claimer - the
misgoverned state-mate of Gilbert Rich-
ardson - the unscrupulousness of the
pursuers & the arguments undertaken respect-
ing us - have at every State's come-
mission plainly enough - that the
public mind is so much warmed as
to be insusceptible of impressions - & we
are quite convinced that the hour

has come - & we wish only to be assured
of the men - we wish to have
a convention that shall take upon
this community which has contrived
to remain in L'abri - long enough -

It will be of no use however to do
any thing of the kind unless we can
be assured that you & Wendell can
both be here - Without this assurance
nothing will be attempted - Now it
we shall proceed to advertise - to "com-
municate" such predictions to our daily
papers as will fix public attention anx-
iously on the convention - To invite Colman
Dowdy, S. G. May, C. C. Burleigh & the
Hutchinsons - & to make arrangements
for paying the expenses of these friends.
The time will be left to your de-
termination - only it is important that
it should be as early as possible - I quite
settle that Friday - Saturday & Sunday
must be the days of the convention.

I know that the friends here would
be very glad if you let me would permit
you to be with us - a fortnight before this
date - & if you should find that both
youself & Wendell could come at that time

they would wish the convention to be
advertised in the Liberator of this
week - Mention the names of all the
Speakers who ~~were~~ will certainly be here
& if no answer can be obtained from the
Abolitionists in Seneca - say that it
is hoped that they will be present -
(I think they might get a good concert
here after staying at the convention)

Don't let any one suggest to Henry Clapp
the possibility of his coming - It would
be a misfortune were he to be here,
he is unfavourably regarded here as
I believe entre nous. He deserves to be
every where - It is very important to
the integrity of the cause in New Bedford
that the New Hampshire difficulties should
be seen in their true light - & I need not
point out to you the mischief that
Clapp might be able to do here many of
French has addressed circulars to ~~tell~~
the friends here - in which I under-
stand that he proposes to "resume"
the publication of the Herald - &
that Rogers shall continue to edit it,
I have not yet seen this circular
but will send you a copy if I can pro-

ear one before closing this letter - I
think this step cannot fail to show
