In 1813, the year that he was appointed Poet Laureate, Robert Southey published The Life of Nelson. Horatio, Lord Viscount Nelson was Britain's greatest naval hero and had been killed during the Battle of Trafalgar in 1805 during which he had issued a famous message to the fleet: "England expects that every man will do his duty." Nelson's example as a seaman was considered so exemplary and Southey's biography so laudable that the American government gave a copy of the book to every officer and seaman in their fleet.
