Published in 1918, *The Lilt of Life* was the third book of verse from Australian poet Zora Cross. The book, like her earlier works, largely focused on her experiences of love, erotic entanglements (notably from a woman's point of view), and motherhood. Many of the poems were written as an homage to her then-husband, David McKee Wright, whom she met while writing for *The Bulletin*, where Wright was her editor, causing a significant scandal in Sydney literary circles.
