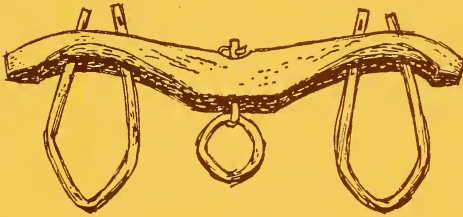

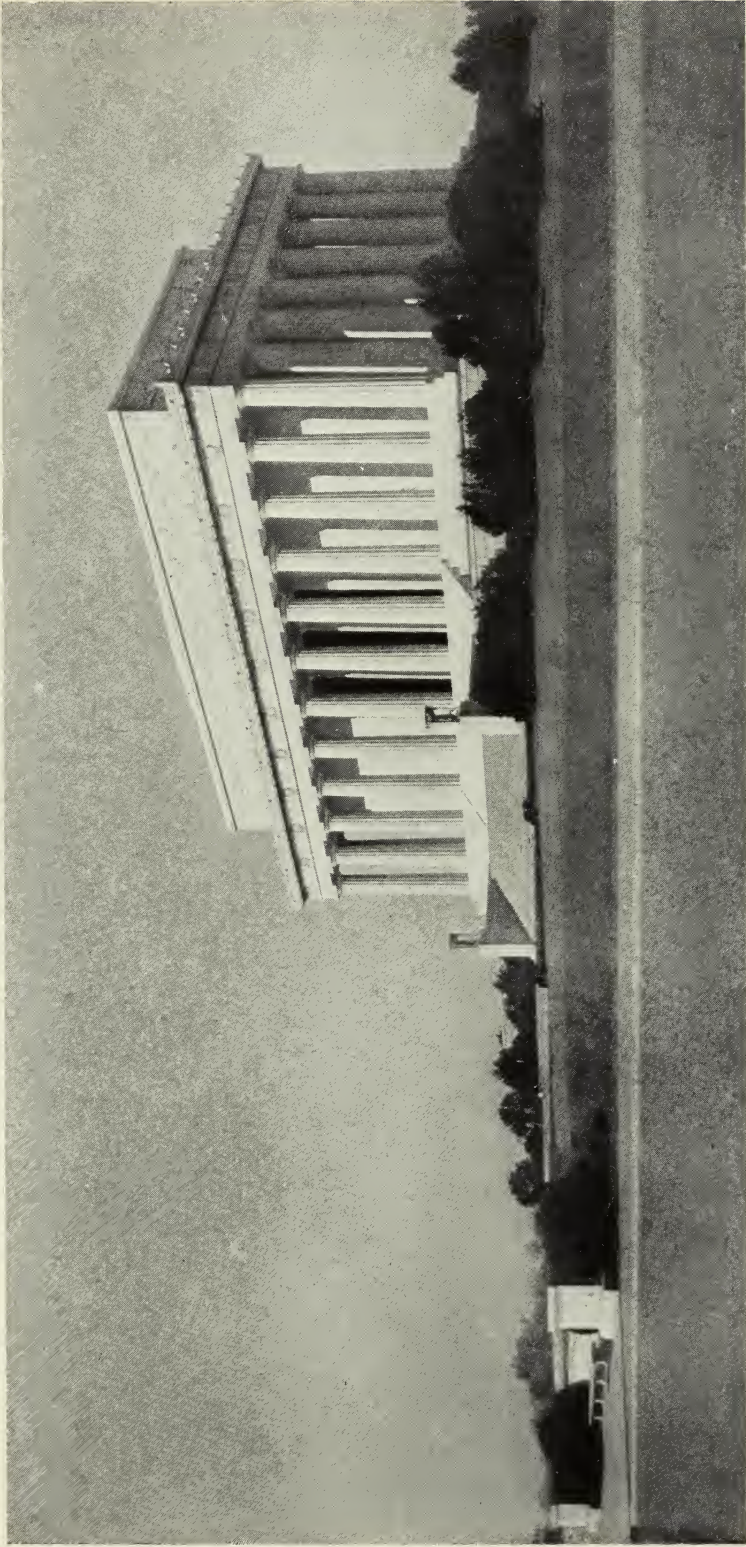

P R E F A C E

Only such books and brochures are included as relate distinctively to the principal subject. Prints devoted in part to Lincoln, but treating also of other topics, are not within the plan, though a few, wherein the former matter largely predominates, are retained. To specify all which deal to any extent with the great central figure of the civil conflict would be to enroll substantially the entire literary product of his time.

Periodical matter, not reprinted, is excluded, unless the issue was devoted wholly to Lincoln.

Publications devoted to the assassination, to the arrest and trial of the conspirators and to discussions of their guilt and punishment are included. As to all else, the reasons for insertion will be apparent.

I have digressed from the Fish plan by inserting the lives of Stephen A. Douglas, of which there are eight, for no one can read the life of Abraham Lincoln understandingly without also reading the life of Douglas, and we must not belittle Douglas when we elevate Lincoln.

It is true that much of the matter listed is of trifling value. Plainly, too, the student of Lincoln must resort to wider sources in the effort to learn what manner of man he was. For example, of the 157 volumes cited in Mr. Rothchild's recent work, but 53 are set down by Fish.

Use of the list will be facilitated by observing the method of preparation and arrangement:

Each entry embraces a full copy of the title-page,

(omitting only mottoes, etc., where indicated), followed by the collation, how illustrated, size and number of pages. Figures in parentheses () are pages not numbered in the book. Words between double bars || || are not found on the page transcribed. Care has been taken to preserve initials, capitals, and especially the punctuation of titles — or the absence of punctuation and misspelling. In titles where the word "Portrait" is inserted, it is understood to be a portrait of Lincoln.

No title is entered more than once, unless there are varying editions, excepting the Loyal Legion publications, which are also entered under the name of the speaker. Mere reprints are disposed of in notes. All are listed under one alphabet. The form is that of the "author catalogue," entailing the difficulties inseparable from anonymous publications. Compilations of Lincoln's own writings, separately published, are listed under his name; editions of the debates, under "Debates." In all other cases, editors are treated as authors. If the author's name appears in the title, the entry is under that name, whether it be real or assumed. When the name is not shown in the title, but appears elsewhere in the book, it is still used as the index-word; if learned from other sources, the information is given in a note. The proceedings of societies and of public meetings (when no editor's name appears), are listed under the name of the society, state, or place. Magazines, newspapers and periodicals, devoted almost exclusively to Lincoln, are listed under the name of the periodical. In some instances, where celebrations were held under the auspices of a city, county, or state, such place is the Index-word. Strictly anonymous prints are distributed according to the rule devised by librarians in the interests of uniformity, which requires each to be placed under the "first

word of the title not an article." The rule is not ideal, since it often leads to consequences futile, if not absurd. In the present list, for example, the names of both Deity and the adversary become index-words, whereas other titles fall under "Is," "That," and like terms, signifying little. However, the method has the merit of being applied easily, so it has been followed, with two slight variations, viz: When the authorship, being at first concealed, is announced in a later edition, the editions are brought together under the name thus disclosed; when the anonymous print deals with one of the assassins only, it is entered under the criminal's name.

I have endeavored to exhaust the field as above defined. Collections of Lincolniana have been opened for my inspection, their owners earnestly assisting in the work. Libraries have been inspected, extensive correspondence has been had, hundreds of catalogues have been examined, and yet I am not certain that there are not any omissions. Many publications are privately printed, or have a local circulation only, so that absolute completeness is impossible.

This publication does not contain the titles noted in Fish 1906.

A FIRST WORD

To write and fittingly express First Words for so complete and admirable a Bibliography of Abraham Lincoln as this volume merits, is beyond our power. No foreword can add to a work that speaks so well for itself.

This and future generations will be indebted to five men — “The Big Five” — for compiling into permanent form records of the thousands of volumes and pamphlets relating to Lincoln’s life catalogued here.

The great work was begun by Mr. Daniel Fish. Four others came to his assistance. In the afterwhile, three of the co-workers — Mr. Judd Stewart, Mr. C. W. McLellan, and Major W. H. Lambert — passed to the Great Beyond and were joined last year by Mr. Fish. Only Mr. Joseph Benjamin Oakleaf remains. And on him has devolved, as the last of those constant, patient, tireless searchers in the large field of Lincolniana which is now and here so exhaustively presented in this volume, the final task of preparing, editing, and superintending the bringing of this great work into publication. Its completion required that patient industry and ability few are so capable of giving. No greater nor more laborious love hath any man shown for Abraham Lincoln than this.

The variety of titles in this Bibliography of Lincoln suggests and illustrates the difficulties authors have both in history and fiction of telling with entire satisfaction all the character mouldings within and without in the life of Abraham Lincoln and the processes that formed them.

Let me record out of my own experience a few sentences. I first met Abraham Lincoln when I was a boy of ten years. For nearly as many years thereafter there was scarcely a month that I did not see him for a few minutes, an hour, or an occasional day which was spent in his company.

Such frequent meetings were not limited to any single portion of his varied life. They were in his home; at his law office; on the streets around the old Springfield "square" and in its stores or offices adjoining thereto: in the State House; at the court rooms where I heard his law briefs and oral pleadings in *nisi prius* and the courts of review and at divers times amid the huzzahing crowds of the political hustings.

Withal, in this early background as a memory storage there came the opportunity later of being a law student in his law office from 1857 to the morning in February, 1861, when he left Springfield, Illinois, for the last time on his way to the Nation's capital. Supplementary to all this, allow me to add, was my intimate friendship with the early New Salem people who knew him so well and who honored me by their confidence, and told me of his life with them there, where he spent the most changeful and formative seven years of his life.

Yet out of all these opportunities and frequent and close associations, I cannot claim fully to know the Abraham Lincoln of those earlier days.

This volume illustrates as no other has ever done the kaleidoscopic character of Abraham Lincoln. Every book and pamphlet chronicled in these pages has some fragments, or many, revealing views of his personality. None shows us all.

The story of Lincoln's life, especially in the New Salem and Springfield days that were so fruitfully formative in the character building of this most remarkable man has been told over and over as the pages of this volume reveal; in part, wisely and well; in part in a manner inaccurate and misleading to the historical research of the future. It is yet too early to expect an adequate biography of Lincoln. We are yet too near to him in time to get the true perspective; to trace the operations of the forces, internal and external, that contributed to his development, or to compare him with the rest of earth's immortals. But some day, after all have passed away who knew Lincoln, and that staging of peculiar

personalities and events, both simple and tragic, that formed his environment, some master historian will gather the partial and contradictory records left by his contemporaries, purge them of falsehood and caricature, and from the material remaining will write upon the unfading pages of history the true character story of Abraham Lincoln.

He stood above those of his time in waiting patiently, serenely, inflexibly, to lead his countrymen to render to God the things His justice required in national life.

He stands today, more than a century after his birth, the most unique and unforgettable figure in our history and one of the mighty spirits of the race.

Such a man the time and the task demanded, and God in His Providence gave to his country and his race Abraham Lincoln.

TO THE SUBSCRIBERS

About six years ago, I concluded to compile a bibliography of Lincoln literature, in order to make it possible for those who are interested in the subject of collecting Lincoln literature to ascertain what a complete collection covers. When I first began collecting Lincoln literature, early in 1890, I had no conception as to what a complete collection meant.

I read "Abraham Lincoln, a History," by Nicolay and Hay, as it appeared in the *Century Magazine* as a serial, at which time it occurred to me that I would like to have a collection of all the biographies of Abraham Lincoln, and I proceeded to pick them up here and there. Wherever I might be, I would visit the stores dealing in old books. I did not know of anyone who was collecting until I happened into the book shop of Frank M. Morris, in Chicago, in search of items. He then informed me that Daniel Fish of Minneapolis, Minnesota, had published a bibliographical account of books and pamphlets relating to Abraham Lincoln. I wrote to Mr. Fish and he sent me a copy (Fish 323), and I then realized for the first time what a task I had undertaken; but, nothing daunted, I went to work in earnest to secure a "complete collection."

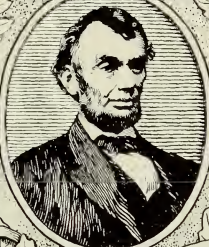
Early in 1904, I appeared before the high school of my city and gave a little talk on Abraham Lincoln. I informed the pupils that I had quite a collection of Lincoln literature and I would be pleased to have those who were interested in the subject to make use of it, my home being near the high school building. A young man by the name of Philip Joseph took advantage of the invitation, with the result that he had Abraham Lincoln as the subject of an oration delivered at the Moline High School on April 16, 1904. As there was a great deal of merit in the oration, I had it printed (Fish 475), sending a copy to Mr. Fish. Upon

acknowledging the receipt of it, he asked me to send a copy to his friend, Judd Stewart of Plainfield, New Jersey. Through Mr. Stewart, I became acquainted with Maj. William H. Lambert of Philadelphia, and Charles W. McLellan of Champlain, New York; these acquaintances ripened into real, true friendship. Each of the four had been "collecting" for a long time and their collections far exceeded mine in numbers and importance. We five concluded to, and did, establish a "Clearing House," with Mr. Stewart acting as the corresponding secretary, and new finds by any of us would be reported to Mr. Stewart and Mr. Fish. Thus we knew what each one was adding to his collection, and helped each other in various ways, in order to make the collections as complete as possible. We were known, among the book men, as the "Big Five," for the reason that our collections were the leading private collections.

Major Lambert was the first to pass on, and his collection was sold at auction and scattered throughout the world. Henry E. Huntington of San Gabriel, California, purchased a large portion of the collection, including all of the rare items. These are installed in the library at San Gabriel, known as the Henry E. Huntington Library and Art Gallery. The next to pass on was Judd Stewart, in the prime of life. His collection was disposed of as a whole and is now owned by Mr. Huntington. Then we had to part with Mr. Charles W. McLellan. His collection was purchased by John D. Rockefeller, Jr., and presented to Brown University. Having passed on in February, 1924, Daniel Fish did not live to see this compilation, in which he was very much interested, finished. It was my intention to spend a month with him and have him go over this work and criticize it before it was given to the printer. I, alone, remain to carry on the work. I was known to the other four collectors as the "Baby of the Big Five," having entered the field after the other four had been collecting for some time. Portraits and biographies of the "Big Five" are shown on other pages.

In 1906, Mr. Fish published a Bibliography which was very complete, and each of the "Big Five" decided to get every item contained therein, but no one was able to secure all of the items. The collections of Major Lambert and of Mr. Stewart were the most complete.

I have endeavored to follow the plan and rule laid down by Mr. Fish in his Bibliography, as to what would be considered Lincolniana, although he digressed once in a while and gave his reasons therefor. The student will find that I have done likewise, and the reason for admitting the item is shown in the note after each one.

In June, 1923, I sent out an advertisement of this work and then informed the public that it would be ready for distribution early in 1924, but I found that I was unable to finish the work within that time, for the reason that many unforeseen obstacles presented themselves from time to time.

For historical reasons, I concluded to insert a foreword by a contemporary of Abraham Lincoln, with his portrait, a portrait of each of the "Big Five," also six portraits of Abraham Lincoln, taken at different times, with an explanation when and where each picture was taken. I am indebted for the Lincoln portraits to the kindness of Mr. Frederick Hill Meserve of New York City, whose book, entitled *The Photographs of Abraham Lincoln*, is an item in this work, under the title head, "Meserve." His labor thereon, like mine, is a labor of love, for the work incidental to compilation is not included in the retail price of the book. It occurred to me that the best known portraits of Abraham Lincoln would have a historical setting in connection with this compilation.

I am well aware that this work is not perfect, but I have put my best efforts into it, and if there are any imperfections, it is the fault of the head and not of the heart. After this work is finished I shall continue my interest in Lincolniana until the end of my days, and if those who are interested in collecting Lincolniana or books that come to their notice will keep in touch with me, I will prepare a complete

list of such and will issue supplements from time to time as the demand may require. Therefore, I must have the help of all collectors in order to make the supplements as nearly perfect as possible.

Collectors of Lincolniana are entitled to a great deal of credit for preserving items that would otherwise be lost to posterity. Abraham Lincoln is a greater man today than he was at the time of his death, for each generation since then has been benefited by the precepts that he advocated.

There are now, in course of preparation, two biographies of Abraham Lincoln that will not be ready in time for listing in this work. One is by Mr. Carl Sandburg; the other, by Hon. Albert J. Beveridge, whose four-volume work on the Life of John Marshall was a masterpiece. We anticipate, with much pleasure, the completion of his wonderful undertaking, concerning the life of Abraham Lincoln, which will be a companion work to the life of Marshall.

EXPLANATION

All titles concerning the celebration during the Lincoln Centennial are grouped under the word, "Centennial." All titles of the Lincoln Centennial Association of Springfield, Illinois, have been grouped under "Association."

All books and pamphlets, which only contain Lincoln's Gettysburg Address, excepting where they include matter other than the address itself, are listed under the name of the author. However, the compiler has listed under the heading "Gettysburg Address" and in the index where items of such nature may be found.

In Chicago, there is a society known as the "Grand Army Hall and Memorial Association." Exercises are held annually, and some well known speaker addresses the Association. Their proceedings, published in pamphlet form, have been grouped under "Grand Army Hall and Memorial Association;" they are also shown under the name of the author, giving full title page.

The publications of the National Republican Club of New York are grouped under "Republican," and are continued in the same manner that Fish showed the titles.

The debates of Lincoln and Douglas, held in 1858, with all subsequent comments thereon, which are in pamphlet form or otherwise, are placed under the heading, "Debates."

Titles dealing with the Centennial Celebration (1909), programs on that occasion and matter pertaining thereto are listed under "Centennial;" titles concerning the Lincoln birthplace are listed under "Birthplace;" titles relating to Abraham Lincoln's Birthday are listed under "Birthday;" and titles referring to the Lincoln Highway are listed under "Highway."

Instead of listing single volumes containing speeches and writings of Lincoln under the name, "Lincoln" — for they

would be difficult to find — the compiler has listed them under the name of the editor, if there is an editor; if there are two editors, they are listed under the first name mentioned.

There has been some difficulty in arranging the order in which titles should appear in the Bibliography. The titles covering Lincoln speeches are quite numerous, and to list them under "Lincoln" would entail much search, so that, in order to locate them, where a volume of speeches has an editor, they are listed under the name of the editor; if there are two editors, they are listed under the first named. Books and pamphlets containing the "Gettysburg Address" and the "Inaugurals" are listed under "Gettysburg Address," if that address appears first and under "Inaugural" if such appears first; otherwise, books containing speeches on Lincoln, with no editor shown, and all sets are listed under "Lincoln."

In all other matters, the compiler has followed the rule laid down by Daniel Fish in his Preface to the 1906 edition, which reads as follows:

The following bibliography is a revision and enlargement of the catalogue issued under my supervision in 1900, entitled "Lincoln Literature." As expected, and of course desired, the circulation of that tentative list drew from their hiding-places many omitted items, more than a hundred such being now added. These, with the large number since published, swell the total to upward of a thousand, not counting reprints or successive editions.

The intended scope of the work should be accurately noted, for it is limited to a definite purpose:

Printed books and pamphlets only are embraced, construing the latter term broadly. Single-page prints of all sorts and unimportant leaflets, myriads of which were issued and have disappeared, are omitted. Such of these as are still extant shed no appreciable light on the life which evoked them and would only encumber the list without compensating advantage.

Only such books and brochures are included as relate

distinctively to the principal subject. Prints devoted in part to Lincoln, but treating also of other topics, are not within the plan, though a few, wherein the former matter largely predominates, are retained. To specify all which deal to any extent with the great central figure of the civil conflict would be to enroll substantially the entire literary product of his time.

Periodical matter, not reprinted, unless the particular issue was devoted wholly to Lincoln, is excluded. This is a wide and fruitful field of research, but one to be separately treated under a different method.

The merely political writings of the period have been sifted with a view to retaining such books and pamphlets only as may fairly be said to owe their origin to the man. They are very numerous, but obviously most of them would have appeared in similar form had another than Lincoln been President. To include all, therefore, would be aside from the purposes of a Lincoln bibliography, while the exclusion of all would be equally improper. The line is not easily marked, yet to attempt it was imperative. All separately printed utterances of Lincoln are of course meant to be listed; likewise all communications in terms addressed to him. Ordinarily partisan discussions, unless chiefly aimed at personal attack or defence, are omitted. In illustration, however, of the enormous administrative difficulties with which the President had to deal, and so of his statesmanship and character, some pamphlets are retained which set forth conflicting views of the larger questions of executive policy — political arrests, the habeas corpus, emancipation, and the like. The proceedings of political conventions in which Lincoln figured as a candidate are noted; and, as an interesting reflection of contemporary feeling, the song-books which contributed to his elections.

Publications devoted to the assassination, to the arrest and trial of the conspirators, and to discussions of their guilt and punishment are included. As to all else, the reasons for insertion will be apparent and it remains only

to add that a few titles in the first edition have been dropped as not within the prescribed limitations.

Obviously enough, much of the matter thus listed is of but trifling value. Plainly, too, the student of Lincoln must resort to wider sources in the effort to learn what manner of man he was. For example, of the 157 volumes cited in Mr. Rothschild's recent work but 53 are here set down. Yet this is the roll of that thousand and more who have been moved by a great man's life and death to commit their thoughts of him to prints especially devoted to that end.

Use of the list will be facilitated by observing the method of preparation and arrangement:

Each entry embraces a full copy of the title-page (omitting only mottoes, etc., where indicated), followed by the collation — size, number of pages, and how illustrated. Figures in parentheses () are pages not numbered in the book. Words between double bars, || || are not found on the page transcribed. Care has been taken to preserve initial capitals and especially the punctuation of titles — or the absence of punctuation as is the recent fashion. Some of the earlier titles are of immoderate fullness while the modern style runs to the opposite extreme, but however much or little of his purpose the author saw fit to disclose by this means, all is faithfully set forth.

No title is entered more than once unless there are varying editions; mere reprints are disposed of in notes. All are listed under one alphabet. The form is that of the "author catalogue," entailing the difficulties inseparable from anonymous publications. Compilations of Lincoln's own writings, separately published, are listed under his name; editions of the Debates, under "Lincoln and Douglas." In all other cases editors are treated as authors. If the author's name appears in the title, the entry is under that name whether it be real or assumed. Identical surnames are distinguished by adding given name or initials in the form adopted by the author.

When the name is not shown in the title but appears elsewhere in the book, it is still used as the index-word, being enclosed in brackets; if learned from other sources, the information is given in a note. The proceedings of societies and of public bodies and meetings (no editor's name appearing) are listed under the name of the society, state or place. Strictly anonymous prints are distributed according to the rule devised by librarians in the interests of uniformity, which requires each to be placed under the "first word of the title not an article." The rule is not ideal, since it often leads to consequences futile if not absurd. In the present list, for example, the names of both Deity and the Adversary become index-words, while other titles fall under "Is," "That," and like terms signifying little. But the method has at least the merit of being easily applied, so it has been followed — with two slight variations, permissible I hope in the special list of this character, viz.: When the authorship, being at first concealed, is announced in a later edition, the editions are brought together under the name thus disclosed. And when the anonymous print deals with one of the assassins only, it is entered under the criminal's name.

In the foregoing, taken from the *Fish Bibliography*, he states that no titles have been entered more than once. I have, in some instances, entered them more than once, in order to do justice to the author; for example, in the publications of the Grand Army Hall and Memorial Association, I have found it necessary to list its publications under the name of the author also.

The portrait on the opposite page is that of Joseph Benjamin Oakleaf, compiler of this work.

He was born at Moline, Illinois, on the first day of October, 1858, his parents being Benjamin Peter and Mary Oakleaf. He resided at Moline until the 20th of September, 1869, when he moved to Labette County, Kansas, with his parents, where he resided until the fall of 1876, when he returned to Moline, Illinois, the home of his birth, and engaged in mercantile pursuit until the spring of 1883, when he began reading law and was admitted to the bar in the month of May, 1886.

In 1880 he was married to Josephine Anderson, who departed this life on the 23rd of December, 1916. One child, a son, was born to him and his wife, Josephus Leroy, who is a lawyer by profession and a member of the firm of J. B. & J. L. Oakleaf. There are three grandchildren, to whom this work is dedicated.

He was educated in the public schools, read law in the office of Browning and Entrikin of Moline, and was city attorney of Moline three terms.

He has been a member of the Library and Hospital Boards, being a member at the time the Library building and the City Hospital building of Moline were erected. He has always been a Republican in politics. He is a strong believer in the doctrine of the Lutheran church and has taken part in all the activities of the Conference and Synod to which his congregation belongs. He is a charter member of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church, of Moline, Illinois, and a 32° Mason (both York and Scottish Rites).

He became interested in Lincolniana in the early nineties, and his collection of Lincolniana is the largest private collection extant. A few of his Lincoln addresses have been published and are shown in the Bibliography, together with other books on Lincoln, of which he is the author. He is the sole survivor of the quintet of Lincoln collectors who worked together so harmoniously for a number of years, Lambert, McLellan, Stewart and Fish having preceded him to the land beyond the grave.

SKETCH OF A LONG LIFE

At the special request of Mr. Oakleaf, I submit this short sketch of a long life. I was born on April 7th, 1837, at the farm home of my parents, Amberry A. Rankin and Arminda Rogers Rankin, located three miles from Athens, Illinois, and less than six from the historic, but now deserted, village of New Salem. Removed from that home to Petersburg, Illinois, in 1844 when my father was elected sheriff of Menard County. Returned to the farm of my birth in 1849. Educated in common schools and in an academy course of instruction and afterwards under private tutors; a law student in Lincoln's office from 1857 to 1861. Gave up the law and entered a strenuous business life because of my father's financial affairs. Rejected on physical examination from military service in civil war and then furnished a substitute. Later, was vice-president First National Bank, Petersburg, Illinois. A member of the Presbyterian church.

On May 4th, 1864, I married Miss Alma Hurd, of Tonica, Illinois. She was the sweetest, dearest woman I have ever known. Her decease after fifty-two years of happiest wedded life was the greatest loss I ever experienced.

In 1891 I removed my family to Jacksonville, Illinois, to give my children the advantages of a college education. This being accomplished, removed with family to Springfield, Illinois, where I have since resided. My advancing years have not caused me to abandon the management of my business investments. The past ten years have been devoted principally to literary work; though ever since abandoning the law, I have been a contributor to the press.

Our three children are all living: Fred H. Rankin for the past twenty-four years professor and assistant dean of the College of Agriculture of the Illinois State University;

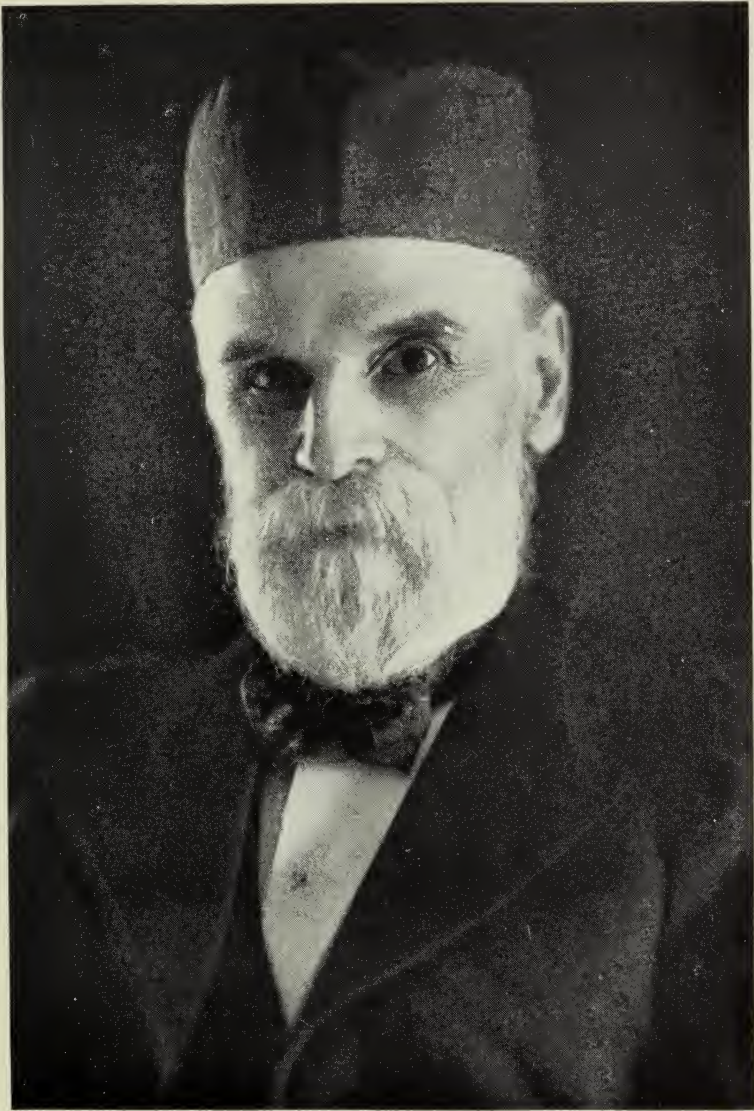
Albert H. Rankin, vice-president of the First National Bank, Springfield, Illinois; and the youngest, Emma, wife of Clayton J. Barber of the law firm of Barber & Barber, Springfield, Illinois, and with whom, in our mutual home, I am living. I have two grandchildren: Emma Louise Rankin and Henry Rankin Barber.

My first vote for president was cast for Abraham Lincoln, of whom I have written two volumes. The first in 1916, was entitled *Personal Recollections of Abraham Lincoln*, 428 pp., Putnam's Sons, N. Y.; the last in 1924, entitled *Intimate Character Sketches of Abraham Lincoln*, 344 pp., Lippincott Co., Philadelphia. These volumes fully record my years in Lincoln's law office and comprise the bulk of my writings on Lincoln. There are other pamphlets and articles written on events and for occasions connected with Lincoln's life, and part of these will be found listed in this "Bibliography of Lincoln" and need not be mentioned here, for they were only intended to meet calls on me for writing to suit the passing occasion that required them.

After answering all the inquiries of Mr. Oakleaf, I can but partly comply with his further suggestion that I should write some lines such as I would like to read about some friend that I knew and who had lived to my age.

I am aware of nothing that would interest me more, while living as I am within a limit of twelve years of a century, than to write fully of events and people and of how those years appeared on looking back across the vista of eighty-eight such changeeful years as these are which we, in this rapid, present time are hastening forward in and from. But the purpose and limit of this sketch, to say nothing of the vastness of the task and the waning strength of the hand that writes these lines, forbid.

The period in the world's history my years have spanned has added greatly to the perplexities and complexities of what came to me as my life problems. To write of those times and the pioneers of the thought and activities in the western development of our nation, into which I was so

fortunate as to have been born and that was so intimate a part of my life, would carry me too far afield. However, it can be said that my life has bridged across from the Old and into the New, in a broad and important span of history for one life. It has been a great privilege. I have known and associated with six generations, the first having been with several aged revolutionary soldiers. In those generations average men and women have achieved more advances for the betterment and welfare of all mankind than was made in the previous five centuries.

Such changes with progress have only begun. The end is not near. Weary ways and tedious toils are before us. The wisest sages of the past have left us, as the legacy of their lives, no clearer or better legend of the incompleteness of their life-work than that expressed by Sir Isaac Newton. The quotation records my own experience. This wise man, in the closing years of his fruitful life, said he had been only as a child wandering on the shores of Immortal Truth, gathering here and there a shining shell, or heaping up on the beach a pile of pebbles to attest the records of his labors there, while the vast ocean of Immortal Truth beat on the shores around him, its measureless and unfathomed waves rolling far away in the unsolved mysteries of the universe before him. How limited, at best, is the sum of human experience and knowledge. Intellectual achievements are only in their infancy and youth.

The years of my aging have not been in any degree such as described by Goldsmith as being possible and probable to age:

“Remote, unfriended, melancholy, slow.”

On the contrary, I have great personal liking of and sympathy for bright and sparkling young life, and the people of open minds and forward vision with active living ideals. Not that I love the past less, or wish to be separated from it, or the great events and best peoples who lived before us, but because I look hopefully to the future I feel young both in mind and heart and admire the things that are new

and will welcome those that are to come, both here and Beyond. I have friendship and reverence for what is oldest and truest, but wish never to be separated from an earnest search and welcome for the worthy new, that in later years has so advanced human comfort and happiness and brought so much more of the spirit of joy and gladness into the common daily lives of all mankind.

But the millenium dawn seems yet far away. As always has been, is now, and for all time to come will probably continue, there will be problems to annoy and perplex the individual, and turmoils to harass the nations of our earth which are all, at their best, earthy. This world is not intended for a heavenly abode. "Grief walks the earth and sits at the feet of each by turns." The best we each can hope and strive for is by our own best endeavors and help of the Unseen One, to go forward with courage, fortitude, and fidelity in an honest, manly, and womanly manner, prepared at all times with a spirit of readiness, to meet whatever comes next. Here I rest and abide.

DANIEL FISH

DANIEL FISH

The portrait on the opposite page is that of Daniel Fish, a lawyer by profession, born at Cherry Valley, Illinois, on January 31, 1848. He died at Minneapolis, Minnesota, February 9, 1924, and was laid to rest in Lakewood Cemetery at Minneapolis, on the anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln.

He was the son of Daniel and Permelia (Adams) Fish and was educated in the public schools of Winnebago County, Illinois. He was married to Elizabeth Meigs Porter, of Garnavillo, Iowa, on August 21, 1873.

He enlisted as a private, in the Civil War, in Company G, 45th Ill. Inftry., January 4, 1864; mustered out on July 12, 1865; Adj. Gen. G. A. R., 1878; Asst. Adj. Gen. Minnesota G. A. R., 1886; Judge Advocate, 1887.

He moved to Iowa at the close of the war and was admitted to the bar in 1871; removed to Delano, Minnesota, in 1871; established and edited the *Delano Eagle*, 1872; Probate Judge, Wright County, Minnesota, 1876-77 and 1879.

Removed to Minneapolis in 1880; alternate delegate to Republican National Convention 1880; the first attorney City Park Commission, 1883-7; also attorney State Park Commission; attorney of Court House and City Hall Commission during its existence; counsel and trust officer of Minnesota Title Insurance and Trust Company, 1889-94; appointed court receiver of the Northern Trust Company, 1897; commissioner to revise and codify the general laws of Minnesota, April 16, 1901; chairman of Commission after March, 1904; Report of Commission adopted and went into effect March 1, 1906; city attorney of Minneapolis, January 2, 1911, and on May 20, 1914, he resigned to accept the appointment of judge of the 4th Judicial District of Minnesota; was elected to same for the term ending January, 1921. On the expiration of his term, he declined re-election.

He was a Republican in politics; author of the Bibliog-

raphy of Lincoln Literature, 1906; also various addresses and magazine articles.

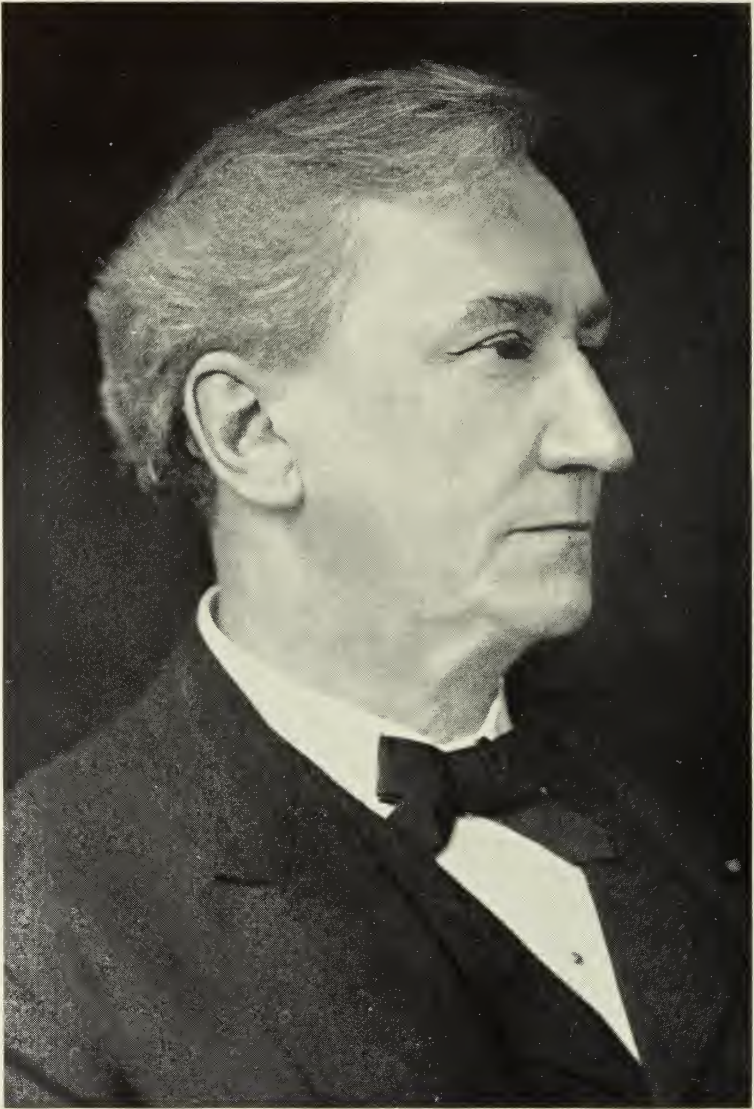
This publication contains a list of items of which he is the author. The collectors of *Lincolniana* are indebted to Mr. Fish for having compiled the *Fish Bibliography of Lincoln Literature* in 1900, the items of which are included in the publication of 1906.

The passing of Judge Fish was a personal loss to the compiler, who expected to have him pass upon the manuscript of the bibliography before it went to press and to get the benefit of his just criticism.

At the time of his death, he resided at No. 3301 First Avenue South, Minneapolis, Minnesota, with offices in the New York Life Building.

Judge Fish was survived by his wife and five children, Mrs. Charles Graves, Hartford, Connecticut; Mrs. E. J. Huenekens, Elizabeth, Florence, and Horace P. Fish, all of Minneapolis.

At the time of this writing it has not been decided what disposition is to be made of the very large and complete collection of Lincoln literature and mementoes which Judge Fish owned at the time of his death, but it is the hope and wish of the compiler that someone will come forward and arrange for its purchase by the City of Minneapolis, and that it may be known as the "Fish Memorial Library."

On the opposite page, we have the portrait of Major Lambert. He was born May 9, 1842, at Reading, Pennsylvania, which was his home until his death.

It was his intention to make law his profession and he entered upon that study, which he abandoned to serve his country, on August 22, 1862, enlisting as a private in the Fifteenth Pennsylvania Cavalry and participating in the battle of Antietam. On November 27, 1862, he became First Lieutenant and Adjutant of the Twenty-seventh New Jersey Infantry, and held the same rank in the Twenty-third New Jersey Infantry from July 25, 1863. On January 16, 1864, he was made Captain and was appointed on the staff of General Geary. He was with Sherman on the March to the Sea and was one of the veteran army which passed before the President in the Grand Review. On March 13, 1865, Captain Lambert was breveted Major in the United States Volunteers for gallant and meritorious conduct during the war; was honorably mustered out of the service July 17, 1865, and later, under resolution of Congress, the Medal of Honor was awarded to him.

In 1866 he entered the employment of the Mutual Life Insurance Company and continued with it until his death. He was elected one of the Trustees of the Company in 1907.

On January 14, 1880, he was elected to the Commandery of the Loyal Legion of the State of Pennsylvania, and was a representative from the Commandery to the Fifth, Sixth, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, and Eleventh Quadrennial Congresses of the Order. He was elected Junior Vice-Commander on March 4, 1887, and Commander on May 3, 1911.

Major Lambert never sought an office, but was repeatedly honored by appointments to positions of trust in the government of Philadelphia. In 1899, he was appointed to the Board of City Trusts, which manages a property of enormous value, largely the result of bequests by Stephen

Girard, but embracing forty-five separate trusts. He served in that position until his death.

A friend, after his death, made the remark: "I had not been long acquainted with Major Lambert, when I found that he had three heroes whose names and words and works he cherished above all others. He surrounded himself with mementoes of these men and lived in the atmosphere of their lives. They were Gen. George H. Thomas, William M. Thackeray, and Abraham Lincoln — the great soldier, the great writer, and the great statesman."

Turning through the pages of this bibliography, the reader will find that Major Lambert contributed liberally to Lincoln literature. The compiler of this work had the pleasure of meeting Major Lambert on two different occasions: the first time at his summer home at Germantown, and next at the first meeting of the Lincoln Fellowship, and, in the words of Harry Lauder, will say, "One only had to know him, to love him." His collection of Lincoln literature, Lincoln manuscripts, and mementoes concerning the immortal Lincoln was unsurpassed, and his collection of Thackerayana was equally great.

On October 15, 1874, Major Lambert married Miss Herminia Van Haagen, who, with one son and three married daughters, survived him; one of the daughters passed away shortly after his death.

Major Lambert was missed by the compiler, as well as by the other three of the "Big Five," for he was such a help to us, trying to follow in his footsteps in collecting Lincoln literature. It was the hope of all the Lincoln collectors that some public spirited citizen would come forward and buy the collection of *Lincolniana* which was owned by Major Lambert at the time of his death, and donate it to some public institution, but the family felt that they complied with the wishes of Major Lambert when it was sold at auction so that other people might have an opportunity to secure such items as they desired. Major Lambert, at one time, told the writer that he had had as much pleasure in pursuing the objects of his quest as in the possession

thereof, and he wanted to give others an opportunity to do likewise. Accordingly, on January 14, 1914, at The Anderson Galleries in New York City, at 2:30 o'clock p.m., the sale opened, and the collection of Major Lambert was scattered throughout the United States. Every collector became the owner of a pleasing item, which he had long desired, but the bulk of the more costly items and manuscripts were purchased for the Huntington Art Gallery, where they may be seen at San Gabriel, California.

Daniel Fish said of him: "The Major had more than one hobby, but only one character; that of a Christian gentleman."

JUDD STEWART

The portrait on the opposite page is that of Judd Stewart. Judd Stewart was born near Lawrence, Kansas, on May 14, 1867, son of Lewis N. and Julia (Kreigh) Stewart.

He was educated in the public schools of Kansas City, Missouri. He married Frances Bell of Omaha, Nebraska, on September 18, 1884, and three children were born to them, Roger, Chauncey, and Douglas, who, together with his wife, survive him.

In 1883, Mr. Stewart became office boy in the offices of the Kansas City Smelting and Refining Company, and subsequently moved to New York. He became assistant to the president and general auditor and director of the American Smelting and Refining Company and American Metal Company; member of the American Institute Mining Engineers; life member of the Kansas Historical Society; honor member of the Chicago Historical Society and Illinois Historical Society; was a Thirty-second Degree Mason; belonged to the Park Club of Plainfield, New Jersey; Cranford Golf Club; Plainfield Golf Club, of Plainfield, New Jersey; Sons of the American Revolution; was the author of pamphlets on Abraham Lincoln and "The Power of Wealth." A short time before Mr. Stewart's death, the degree of Doctor of Laws was conferred on him by the Lincoln Memorial University.

At an early age, he became interested in Lincolniana and was an ardent collector. His collection of Lincolniana was only exceeded by that of the late Major Lambert of Philadelphia.

In the spring of 1920, his health began to fail, and he sought rest and recreation on his farm near Ghent, New York. During the period that he was recuperating, he "Put his house in order." He went through his collection of Lincolniana, carefully labeled and catalogued it and boxed and stored it.

Mr. Stewart passed away on the 3rd day of July, 1920, in the very prime of life, and was laid to rest in Forest

Hills Cemetery, Kansas City, Missouri. The compiler has had the pleasure of several visits with Mr. Stewart. He was a whole-souled, genial companion; quick and alert in all his activities.

Those interested in Lincolniana sustained a great loss when Mr. Stewart died, and the compiler of this work felt the loss keenly, for he had hoped to have the benefit of Mr. Stewart's advice and counsel during the progress of this undertaking.

Henry E. Huntington of Los Angeles, California, became the owner of the superb collection of Lincolniana owned by Mr. Stewart. This collection is at the Huntington Library and Art Galleries of San Gabriel, California.

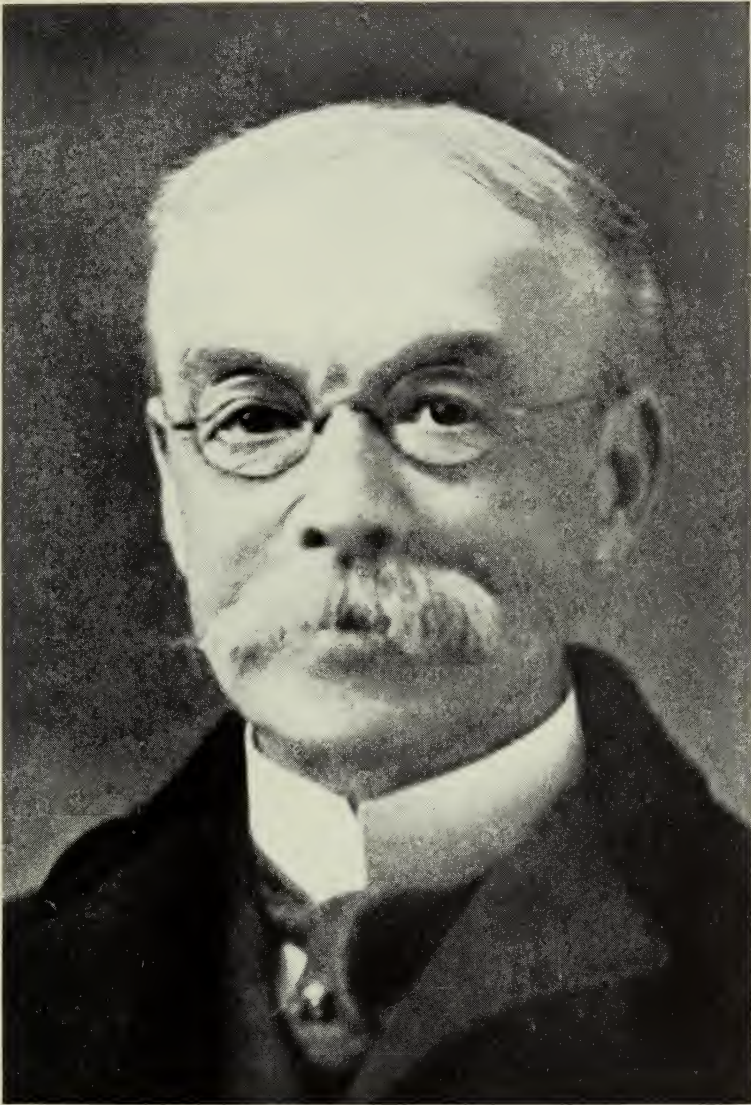
CHARLES W. McLELLAN

The portrait on the opposite page is that of Charles Woodberry McLellan who was born at Beverly, Massachusetts, on November 25, 1836. He attended the public schools of Beverly until he was eight years of age, when his parents moved to Boston, and his education was completed in the "English High School."

In 1853, he began his business career with Emerson, Cochrane & Co., wholesale shoe and leather merchants of Boston, and remained with them until May, 1856, when he accepted an offer of \$500.00 a year in the general store of Charles R. Hurst at Springfield, Illinois. He remained with Mr. Hurst only a few months when a better position was obtained with John Williams & Co., general store and private bank. In January, 1857, he entered the banking house of N. H. Ridgely & Co., as bookkeeper, at a salary of \$800.00 a year. This bank, known as the Ridgely National, is one of the principal banks in Springfield. He frequently met Mr. Lincoln at the bank.

Mr. McLellan was a member of the Springfield Grays, a military company commanded by Captain John Cook. This company, having been perfected in the tactics of the French Zouaves by Colonel Elmer E. Ellsworth, became the Zouave Grays and, at the outbreak of the Civil War, formed a part of the famous Seventh Illinois.

It is a reflection on the uncertainty of those days that in 1860, at the instance of his friend, John McGinnis, Jr., cashier of the Bank of Quincy, Mr. McLellan accepted a position with Richards, McGinnis & Co., wholesale grocers of Mobile, Alabama. Mr. McLellan has remarked frequently that when they left Springfield, they were assured that the future held great possibilities for them. For a year after Mr. McLellan arrived in Mobile matters were very quiet and, although the war had begun in April, 1861, it was felt but little, public opinion being nearly equally divided on the question of secession. It was only when Mr. McLellan made preparations to go North that he awoke to

the seriousness of the situation. He had corresponded with Robert Lincoln and with friends in the North, and it was intimated by his Southern friends that he had better not make the attempt. But, as he had joined the Mobile Cadets, a military organization for the defense of the state which, later, was mustered into the Confederate Army, he served during the war in the Twenty-first Alabama, Colonel James Crawford, and, as quartermaster-sergeant, in the Seventeenth Alabama, Colonel Virgil S. Murphy. Mr. McLellan had no leaning toward the Confederacy, having left Springfield solely for business reasons, without seeing the conflict looming on the horizon. He often intimated, in later life, that he should have had the foresight to have grasped the meaning of Mr. Lincoln's remark to him when he called at the State House to bid him good-bye: "I am sorry to hear it, for I would much rather have two Southern men come North, than have one Northern man go South."

At the close of the War, Mr. McLellan returned North, and engaged with Dean & McGinnis, cotton brokers and bankers, in New York City. From 1871 to 1879, he was a partner in the banking house of A. M. Kidder & Co. In 1879, he formed a co-partnership under the firm name and style of Boody, McLellan & Co., bankers, New York City.

In 1870 Mr. McLellan married Elizabeth M. Nye, of Champlain, New York, whom he survived and by whom he had three children: Donald, Hugh, and Malcolm N., the latter two surviving him.

In November, 1906, at the age of seventy, Mr. McLellan retired from business and made his home in Champlain, New York. He resided in the house which had been his summer residence since 1883. This house was built in 1801 by Mrs. McLellan's great-grandfather, Judge Pliny Moore, the first settler of the town, and here Mr. McLellan departed this life on the 11th day of March, 1918.

Mr. McLellan's years of retirement were actively spent in the management of several large farms and other property in the neighborhood of Champlain and in the accumulation and arrangement of his collection of Lincolniana. Although

Mr. McLellan had been denied the privilege of supporting Mr. Lincoln's administration during the troublesome days of '61-'65, he had been deeply impressed by his simplicity and greatness, his truly religious nature and his love for all mankind and began the collection of Lincoln literature in 1901 as a tribute to the memory of Abraham Lincoln. The friendly rivalry and real fellowship with other collectors, especially with William H. Lambert, the dean of collectors, Honorable Daniel Fish, Mr. Judd Stewart and the compiler, gave him great pleasure during his later years.

After Mr. McLellan's death, his collection was acquired by Brown University through the generosity of John D. Rockefeller, Jr.; it is there housed in the John Hay Memorial Library.

The compiler of this work met Mr. McLellan at a meeting of the Lincoln Fellowship in New York, February 12, 1908, at a banquet held at Delmonico's; there being present, among others, the following well-known people: Major William H. Lambert, Hon. Samuel R. Thayer, Mr. Horace White, Gen. James Grant Wilson, Gen. Stewart L. Woodford, and Mr. Frederick Hill Meserve.

ABRAHAM LINCOLN'S RELIGION

He never professed any creed. Mrs. Lincoln being a Presbyterian, he was a constant attendant at church services and did his share towards the support of the church.

He was a Bible student, and his public addresses, state papers, and letters show frequent quotations from the Bible. At one time he wrote to his friend, Speed: "I am profitably engaged in reading the Bible. Take all of this Book you can on reason and the balance on faith, and you live and die a better man."

He stated, one time, in reply to the question why he had not joined a church that he could not subscribe to all of the creed of any one church. "Any church that requires as its sole qualification for membership, 'Thou shalt love the Lord, thy God, with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and thy neighbor as thyself,' such church I will join with all my heart and soul."

Many volumes, as this Bibliography discloses, have been published concerning the religion of Abraham Lincoln, and the compiler has made a contribution on that subject, yet it is the belief of the compiler that the "Confession of Faith," as given by John Stuart Blackie in the following lines, meets the requirements as announced frequently by Mr. Lincoln:

Creeds and confessions? High Church or the Low?

I cannot say; but you would vastly please us

If with some pointed Scripture you could show

To which of these belonged the Saviour, Jesus.

I think to all or none. Not curious creeds

Or ordered forms of churchly rule he taught,

But soul of love that blossomed into deeds,

With human good and human blessing fraught

On me nor priest nor presbyter nor pope,

Bishop nor dean, may stamp a party name;

But Jesus with His largely human scope

The service of my human life may claim.

Let prideful priests do battle about creeds,

The church is mine that does most Christ-like deeds.

TOLSTOI'S TRIBUTE TO LINCOLN

Of all the great national heroes and statesmen of history, Lincoln is the only real giant. Alexander, Frederick the Great, Caesar, Napoleon, Gladstone and even Washington stand in greatness of character, in depth of feeling and in a certain moral power far behind Lincoln. Lincoln was a man of whom a nation has a right to be proud; he was a Christ in miniature, a saint of humanity, whose name will live thousands of years in the legends of future generations.

Now, why was Lincoln so great that he overshadows all other national heroes? He really was not a great general, like Napoleon or Washington; he was not such a skilful statesman as Gladstone or Frederick the Great; but his supremacy expresses itself altogether in his peculiar moral power and in the greatness of his character. It is natural that before he reached his goal he had to walk the highway of mistakes. But we find him, nevertheless, in every tendency true to one main motive, and that was to benefit mankind. He was one who wanted to be great through his smallness. If he had failed to become president, he would be, no doubt, just as great as he is now, but only God could appreciate it.

Washington was a typical American, Napoleon was a typical Frenchman, but Lincoln was a humanitarian as broad as the world. He was bigger than his country — bigger than all the presidents together. Why? Because he loved his enemies as himself, and because he was a universal individualist who wanted to see himself in the world — not the world in himself. He was great through his simplicity and was noble through his charity.

Lincoln is a strong type of those who make for truth and justice, for brotherhood and freedom. Love is the foundation of his life. That is what makes him immortal and that is the quality of a giant. I hope that his centenary birthday will create an impulse toward righteousness among the nations. Lincoln lived and died a hero, and as a great character he will live as long as the world lives. May his life long bless humanity.

ESTIMATE OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN BY JOHN HAY

The following estimate of Lincoln was found among the papers of the late John Hay; as it does not appear elsewhere in print, the compiler considered it worthy of insertion in the Bibliography, on a page by itself:

Turned his defeat for the Senate into a success for the Presidency;

Took into the cabinet his rivals, and made them his ministers and servants;

Conquered the rebellion;

Liberated the slaves;

Outwitted all the intrigues against him in cabinet and camp;

Gave his implacable rival the chief justiceship;

Disarmed all criticism by shouldering all faults;

Consolidated his party and increased his majorities;

Held the people in their great task;

Made the strongest argument for peace and the best defense of war;

Gave, in his Springfield prayer, his Gettysburg Address, and his second inaugural, the most pathetic and eloquent utterances of his time;

Forcible in speech and faultless in logic, he enriched the language with new thoughts, new definitions, new maxims, new parables, and new proverbs;

Was a true type and exemplar of his country, his race, and his government;

Wore honor without pride, and wielded power without oppression;

Lived like a peasant by necessity of birth and fortune, reigned like a monarch by right of representative instinct, native intellect, the wisdom of humanity, and love of his fellow men;

Died a martyr and was wept by the civilized world.

LINCOLN'S SADDEST PUBLIC UTTERANCE

Farewell Speech of Abraham Lincoln, from the rear Platform of the train at Springfield, Illinois, on Monday morning, February 11th, 1861 :

MY FRIENDS: No one, not in my situation, can appreciate my feeling of sadness at this parting. To this place and the kindness of these people, I owe everything. Here I have lived a quarter of a century, and have passed from a young to an old man. Here my children have been born, and one is buried. I now leave, not knowing when or whether ever I may return, with a task before me greater than that which rested upon Washington. Without the assistance of the Divine Being who ever attended him, I cannot succeed. With that assistance, I cannot fail. Trusting in Him, who can go with me, and remain with you, and be everywhere for good, let us confidently hope that all will yet be well. To His care commending you, as I hope in your prayers you will commend me, I bid you an affectionate farewell.

THE DEATH OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN

The best editorial written on his death

Slavery and Treason have demanded of the American Republic a great and final sacrifice. For four mournful years, on the battle-field and in the hospital, she has poured out the noble blood of her brave children and offered up the precious lives of her patriot citizens. But a sacrifice of blood still more noble, of a life still more precious, was needed to make the oblation complete. This last, this fearful offering has now been laid upon the Nation's reeking altar. Abraham Lincoln is dead!

The shaper of the Republic's destiny, he was murdered on the day when that destiny was finally moulded in the matrix of truth and justice. The savior of the Republic's life, he yielded up his own just as the Republic's existence was forever secured. The Commander-in-Chief of our long-battling armies, he sank in death at the very moment when those armies had achieved a lasting triumph.

In him was typified, more than ever before in any single individual, the cause of Human Liberty, and he perished in the hour which saw that cause victorious. He so guided the course of events that out of the bitterness of Slavery a whole race entered into the blessedness of Freedom, and he passed out of the world while the clanking echoes of the chains which he had broken had not yet died away. Through a night of storm and terror he steered the trembling ship of state, and when the morning dawned upon the vessel sailing, with its costly freight, through a placid sea, the hand that had saved it became powerless. Who shall say that, since that other Good Friday, eighteen hundred years ago, when murderous men struck at the existence of Divinity itself, a riper life has been ended by a fouler blow?

The universal signs of sorrow attest the depth and breadth of the People's grief. The saddened Nation clothes itself in black. The church bells toll a requiem which makes the sorrow-laden air still heavier. Sable festoons adorn, with gloomy decoration, our streets and squares. The minds of men are filled with a woe which the death of a father or brother could not have evoked. But there is a mourning still more appropriate to the occasion than these outer signs or inner feelings. Let us mourn the dead President by being worthy of his greatness. Let us resolve that the liberty which he saved shall never again be lost, that the fetters which he sundered shall never again be joined, that the Union which he restored shall never again be broken. Let us live for Human Rights as he lived; let us die for them, if need be, as he died.

The Great Republic's head is gone; the Great Republic's heart is broken. God help the Great Republic!

FIRST LINCOLN BOOK OWNED BY
DANIEL FISH

The following is taken from the address of Daniel Fish, before the Bibliographical Society of America, in June, 1908:

On my way home from the war in the summer of '65, while yet in the first half of my eighteenth year, I bought my first book, the very first that was paid for out of my personal earnings, not a school book or else a dime novel. It was "The President's Words," compiled from Lincoln's writings and speeches by Edward Everett Hale, now venerable and beloved. If that volume had not been lost prior to 1892, it would have constituted, at the beginning of that year, my entire stock of Lincolniana.

CHRONOLOGICAL HISTORY OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN

Born in Hardin, now La Rue, County, Kentucky, February 12, 1809.

Died at Washington, D.C., April 15, 1865.

He was descended from a family of English origin, residing in Berks County, Pennsylvania, the middle of the eighteenth century. His grandfather emigrated from Virginia to Kentucky about 1780.

His father, Thomas Lincoln, settled with his family in Indiana in 1816, and in Illinois in 1830. His mother was Nancy Hanks.

He left his father's house soon after settling in Illinois, and after following many occupations was admitted to the bar in 1836, and began the practice of law at Springfield in 1837.

He served first as captain, and afterward as a private in the Black Hawk War, in 1832.

He was a member of the Illinois State Legislature, 1834-42, and a member of Congress from Illinois, 1847-49.

In 1858, as Republican candidate for United States senator, he held a series of joint discussions throughout Illinois with his Democratic opponent, Stephen A. Douglas, in which he took a pronounced stand against the institution of slavery. These debates attracted the attention of the whole country, and made him one of the leaders in opposition to slavery. He received a majority of the popular vote but was defeated by the legislature, by reason of the gerrymandered conditions of the state. In 1860, he was nominated by the Republican party as a candidate for President.

He received 180 electoral votes, and was inaugurated on March 4, 1861. He was the sixteenth President. His

election was the signal for the secession of the slave States of the South, and for the reorganization of the Confederate States.

Hostilities began with an attack by the Secessionists of South Carolina on the Federal troops at Fort Sumter, April 12, 1861. On the 15th, a call was issued by President Lincoln for 75,000 volunteers.

He proclaimed a blockade of the southern ports, April 19, 1861.

On September 22, 1862, he issued a proclamation emancipating all slaves in States which were in rebellion on January 1, 1863.

He was re-elected President by the Republican party in 1864, receiving 212 electoral votes. He began his second term of office, March 4, 1865.

He entered Richmond with the Federal army April 4, 1865.

He was occupied with plans for the reconstruction of the South when he was shot by John Wilkes Booth, at Ford's Theatre, Washington, April 14, 1865, and died on the following day.

It was Abraham Lincoln who said: "I believe this government cannot endure permanently, half slave and half free."

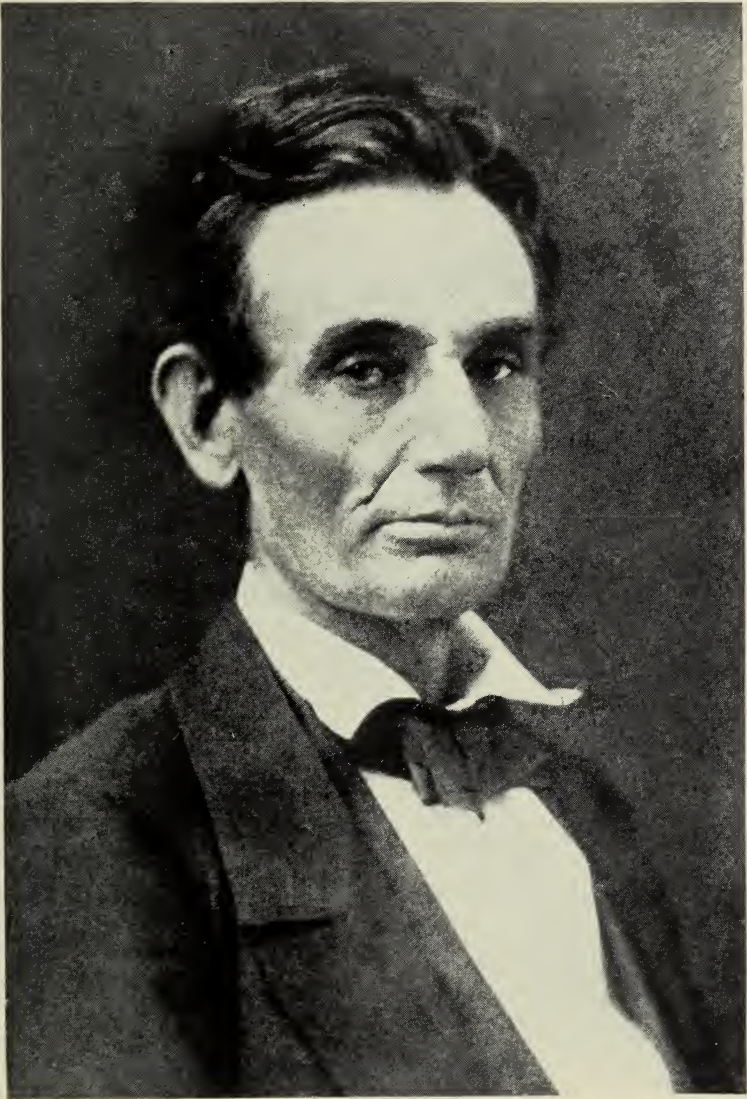

MESERVE TEXT

The portrait on the opposite page is reproduced from a photograph of a carte-de-visite photograph. It is one of the few portraits made during the year Lincoln began wearing a beard and shows his appearance at the time of the Cooper Institute speech in New York in February, 1860.

The other so-called Cooper Institute portrait is made by Brady of New York, February 27th, 1860.

Similar photographs are owned by Mr. Herbert Scott Sylvester, of Boston, and Mr. Truman H. Bartlett, of Boston.

This and the portrait (No. 19) in the Meserve book, had a very wide circulation at the time, and Nos. 19 and 20 are probably the first portraits of Abraham Lincoln by Brady. These are shown as the Cooper Institute portraits, having been taken on the day he delivered his famous speech in Cooper Institute, under the auspices of the Young Men's Central Republican Union of New York City. Both photographs are in the Meserve collection.

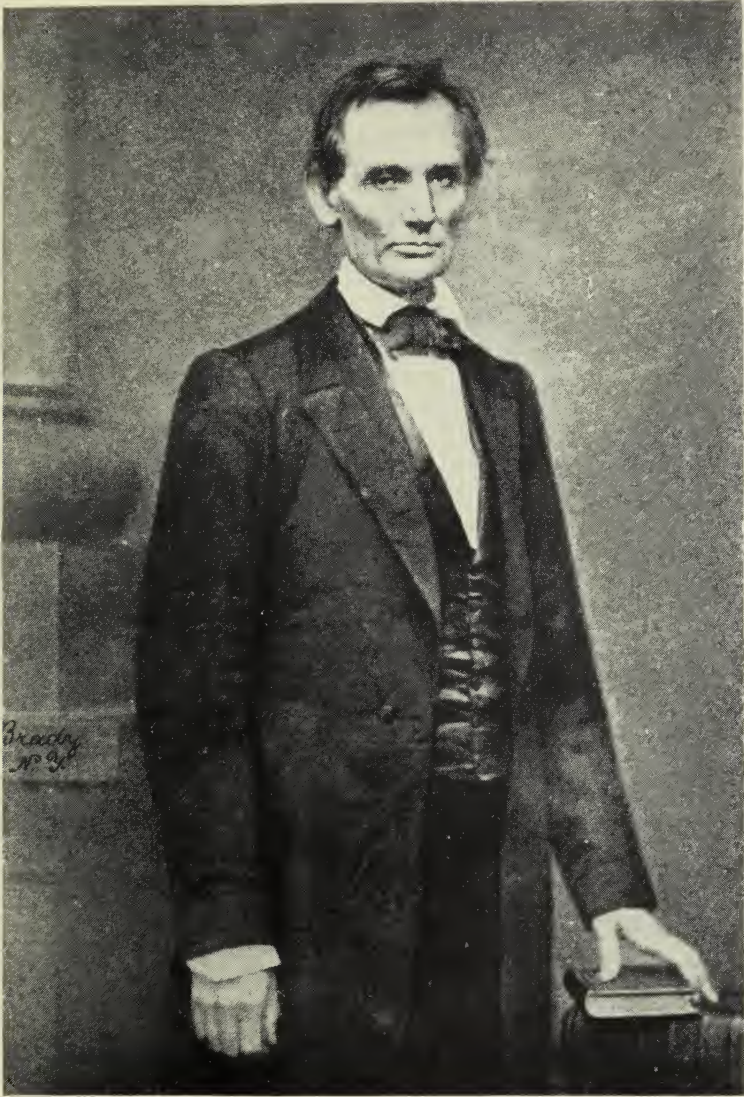
This photograph is No. 20 in the Meserve book of "The Photographs of Abraham Lincoln. Privately Printed New York 1911."

This picture and two others (Nos. 18 and 19 in the Meserve book), were the first pictures made by Mr. Brady.

The difference between Nos. 19 and 20 is that No. 19 shows bust and head only and is larger, but the position is the same as in No. 20.

After Lincoln was nominated, this picture was widely circulated in the East. It is the picture seen by the little girl, Grace Bedell of Westfield, New York, who wrote Mr. Lincoln that he would improve his appearance if he wore a beard.

From an 8x10 photograph made by C. S. Germon in Springfield, Illinois, January 26, 1861. It is in the collection of Mr. O. H. Oldroyd, of Washington, D.C. Mr. Oldroyd says that Mr. Germon, whom he knew well, gave him the photograph and stated that it was made by him. A similar print was copyrighted in 1893, by F. M. McNulty. Mr. Herbert Wells Fay, of DeKalb, Illinois, states that the original negative, of cabinet size, is in his portrait collection, the copyright having been assigned to him; that this portrait was regarded by Mr. Lincoln's neighbors as his best likeness, and was used as the basis for the painting in the Springfield Capitol. The portrait for the original ten-dollar green-back was engraved from this photograph.

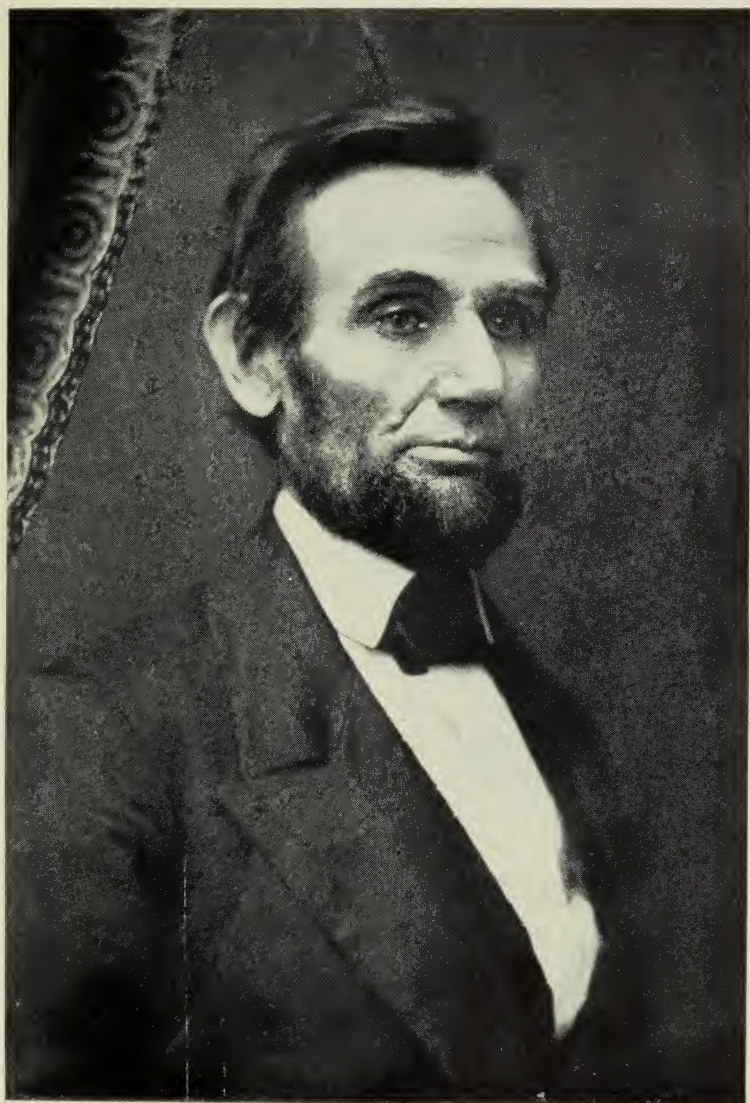
This photograph is No. 34 in the Meserve book of "The photographs of Abraham Lincoln. Privately Printed New York 1911"

The portrait on the opposite page was made in Springfield, late in January, 1861, just before Mr. Lincoln left for Washington.

Three men claim to have made the sitting: Mr. C. S. Germon, Mr. Butler, and Mr. F. M. McNulty, but the consensus of opinion is that Mr. Germon made the sitting.

In 1894, this negative, the only one west of the Alleghany Mountains, passed into the hands of Herbert Wells Fay, of DeKalb, Illinois, now custodian of the Lincoln Tomb at Springfield, Illinois. It was used as a basis for the painting in the Capitol at Springfield, Illinois, and is No. 34 in the Meserve collection.

The Herbert Wells Fay collection of more than 20,000 portraits contains 300 sittings of Lincoln.

The original negative of cabinet size is owned by Mr. M. P. Rice, of Washington, D.C., who copyrighted a print of it in 1891.

A photograph from this negative, published by Philip & Solomon, of Washington, D.C., in 1863, or 1864, upon which the President placed his autograph, is in the collection of Mr. O. H. Oldroyd, of Washington, D.C.

Full front view photographs of Abraham Lincoln are very rare, for he was seldom photographed in that way.

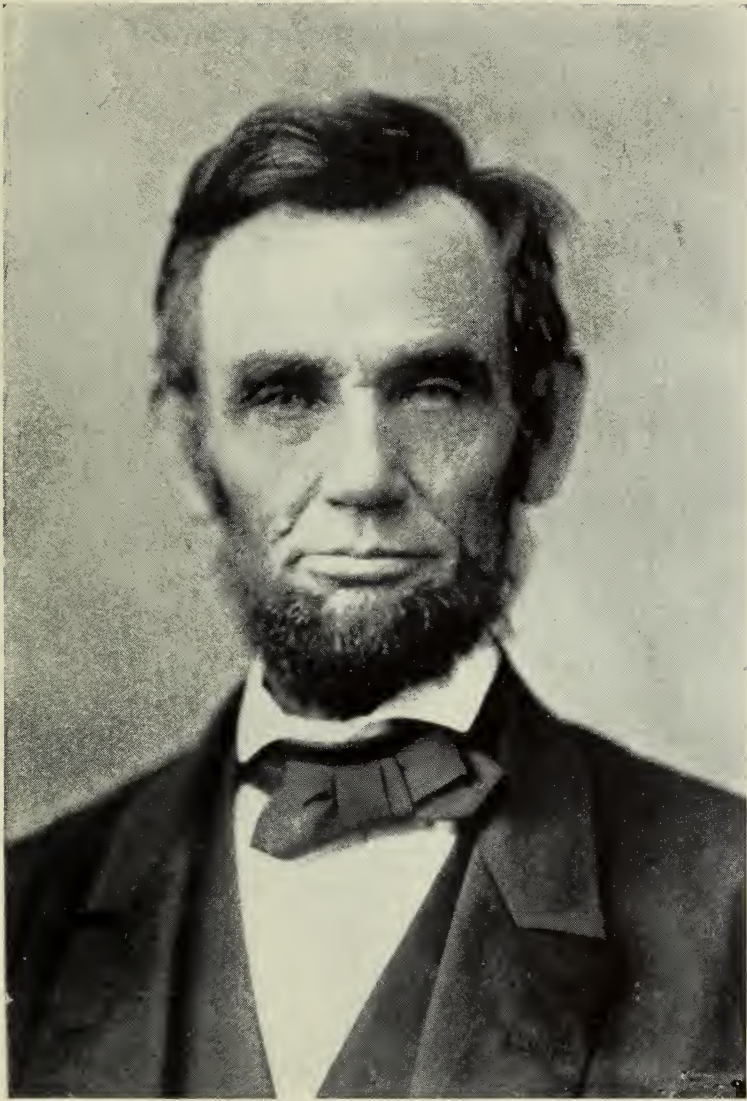
This photograph is No. 59 in the Meserve book of "The Photographs of Abraham Lincoln. Privately Printed New York 1911."

After General Grant received his commission as Lieutenant-General of all the armies, Mr. Lincoln and the General went to the Gardner Studio and sat for their pictures, and this picture of Mr. Lincoln was taken on that occasion.

Both of the pictures are in the collection of Mr. H. W. Fay, custodian of the Lincoln Tomb at Springfield, Illinois.

It is said to have been made for Mr. William H. Seward at his request.

Mr. F. B. Carpenter, the artist, was present at the sitting.

This is said by Mr. Robert T. Lincoln to be the best portrait of his father.

A life sized enlargement of this portrait made by Brady and displayed in the government building at the Centennial Exposition in Philadelphia in 1876 was in the collection of Major William H. Lambert, of Philadelphia.

This portrait is used on the one dollar bill and on several postage stamps and is in the Meserve collection, New York.

A print was copyrighted by Mr. George Prince in 1902. This portrait is a frontispiece in "The Photographs of Abraham Lincoln. By Frederick Hill Meserve. Privately Printed New York. 1911." Robert T. Lincoln wrote the following letter to Mr. Meserve:

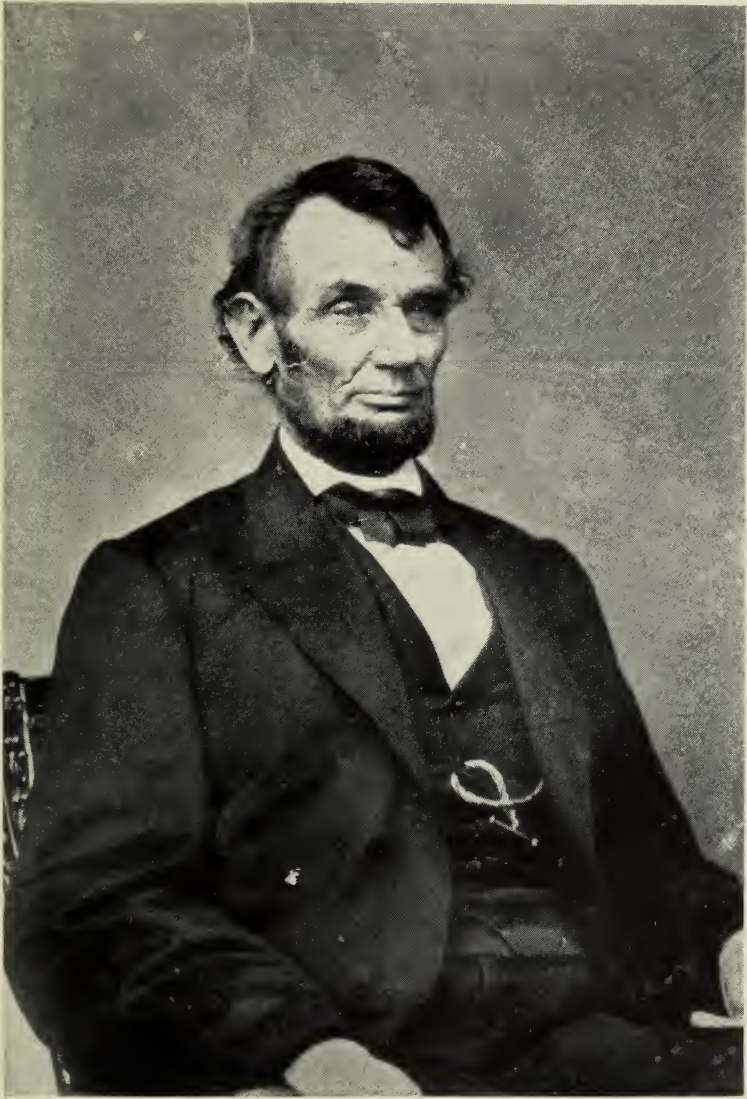

It is a very popular picture of President Lincoln. This photograph is No. 85 in the Meserve book of "The Photographs of Abraham Lincoln. Privately printed New York 1911."

Over three hundred reproductions have been made, including original photographs, china plates, medallions, but-



tons, coins, stationery, steel plates, copper etchings, lithographs, chromo lithographs, half-tones, tri-color half-tones, zinc etchings, etc.

It is used in illustrating books, pamphlets, documents, folders, cards, cover pages, labels, book plates, programmes, invitations, proclamations, calendars, postage stamps, bank notes, bonds, post cards, letter-heads, envelopes, bank checks, etc.

No other picture of Mr. Lincoln shows him with his hair combed V-shaped on the forehead. Some artists have used the hair combination of other pictures, in order to eliminate the V-shaped appearance. Robert T. Lincoln told Mr. H. W. Fay, custodian of the Lincoln Tomb at Springfield, Illinois, that it was his mother's favorite picture.

FIRST LINCOLN MEMORIAL

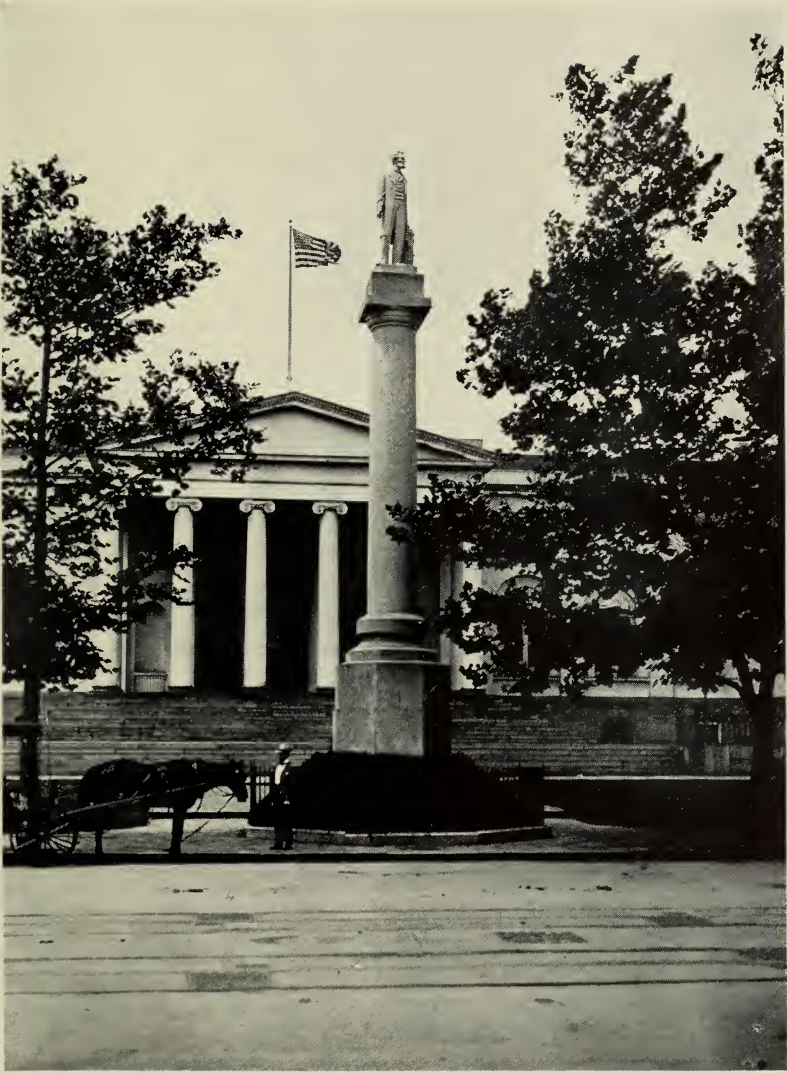
The cut on the opposite page is that of the first Memorial erected to the memory of Abraham Lincoln as a tribute by the citizens of Washington. It was erected in front of the City Hall and was dedicated on the 15th day of April, 1868. The ceremonies at the unveiling and dedication were very elaborate.

The monument is about forty feet in height, to the top of the statue, and rests on a solid foundation of blue rock, six feet in depth. The base of the column rests upon an octagon, six feet in height and about seven feet in diameter. The lower part corresponds with the base and other part with the shaft, being circular and moulded. The shaft is eighteen feet in height, with an average diameter of three feet (tapering), and surmounted by a moulded cap, four feet square and two feet thick, on which rests the base of the statue. The statue itself, which at this height appears to be about life-size, faces south. It represents Lincoln standing with his left hand resting on the emblem of the Union; the Roman Facii, with head erect and with a slight inclination forward and the right hand partially open, as in the attitude he was wont to take in addressing an audience.

Less than two weeks after Abraham Lincoln died an association was formed, called the "Lincoln National Monument Association," to carry out the objects proposed by the formation of the committee.

The dedication services, by the Masonic fraternity, Benjamin B. French, Grand Master, were in accordance with the ritual of that order. B. B. French was the orator of the day, and delivered the dedication address. It is estimated that there were from fifteen to twenty thousand people present.

A few years ago, the commissioners who had charge of the beautifying of the city concluded that the statue in that location interfered with the plans that had been arranged, so it was removed and stored in a building. The commission had intimated that any city that desired the

monument, providing a proper place for it and paying for its removal, would be welcome to it. The compiler of this work enlisted some of his friends in Moline, Illinois, to make an application for the monument, and had the Hon. William J. Graham, member of Congress from the 14th Congressional District of Illinois, to introduce a bill in Congress for that purpose. Congressmen from four other places introduced similar bills.

The citizens of Washington demurred, and the monument has been re-erected (April 15, 1923, by act of Congress of June 21, 1922). Anyone interested in the subject may refer to items No. 1319 to No. 1329, inclusive, in this work, which shows what the compiler of this work stirred up when he asked his Congressman to introduce a bill for the removal of the monument to Moline, Illinois.

RE-ERECTED

FIRST LINCOLN MEMORIAL

The cut on the opposite page is that of the First Lincoln Memorial, as re-erected on the 15th day of April, 1923, under act of Congress of June 21, 1922, and rededicated on June 21, 1923.

The original Memorial is shown opposite page 288, and the reader is referred to the text on pages 288 and 289. The reader will note that the only part of the old Memorial that is in the new, as re-erected, is the statue of Lincoln, the facies upon which his left hand rests, and the octagon block which supports the statue.

We quote the following from *Washington Evening Star* of May 22, 1923:

The wanderings of the Lot Flannery statue of Abraham Lincoln, the gift of the people of Washington to the city, appear to be ended. Workmen are today engaged in transferring the statue from a temporary wooden base to a pedestal of granite, where it is expected to remain. The rededication of the statue is scheduled for June 21, the anniversary of the act of Congress directing its replacement.

When the courthouse was remodeled the statue, which for years had stood on a high column in front of the building, was, for esthetic reasons, considered out of harmony with the new building. The statue was taken down and kept in storage until the attention of Congress was called to its removal and a number of citizens requested its return.
