



## CHRISTIAN ENDEAVOR.

How significant the name! how bright and good! and I hope each one of you will honor it, by endeavoring to be Christlike.

To "endeavor" means more than making one trial or many attempts; it means continued effort,—in joy or sorrow; health or sickness; business or repose; alone or in company; Sundays or weekdays; it means "forgetting the things which are behind" and reaching forward toward Christ and His service continually until the end of life.

Read Joshua xxiv. 1, also verses 14-25, and 2 Kings xxiii. 1-3 and see if you do not think they held Endeavor meetings hundreds of years ago!

And may God's Spirit witness with yours that you are endeavoring to "stand" to your pledge.

The heart is the very inmost self, the deepest depth of our being; hidden from our fellows, little known to ourselves, yet "naked and opened unto the eyes of Him with whom we have to do."

If His searching eye finds there hatred of sin, true love to Himself, and a disposition to do His will, then we are truly Christians.

Set my affections on things above.






The source of this upspringing well is always full; why then should we go away thirsty, when we are bidden to take freely?



. . . In whom though now ye see Him not, yet believing, ye rejoice with joy unspeakable, and full of glory.


