This evening of entertainment with Guy Lombardo features the whole wide and wonderful expanse of Lombardo music—favorite songs, the vocals of Kenny Gardner, Carmen Lombardo, Cliff Grass and Bill Flannigan and the Lombardo Trio, plus the Twin Pianos and the always sweet sound and the dancing beat.

Also featured on this album are several of the newest additions to the vast Lombardo repertoire—Love, Look Away, the lovely Rodgers-Hammerstein hit from "Flower Drum Song"; Return to Me, one of prolific Carmen Lombardo's recent successes; and Mack the Knife, a not-so-new song but a latter-day smash. Guy also plays his original trademark arrangement of Boo-Hoo, his million-selling Humoresque, the ever-popular Frankie and Johnny, a swinging version of When the Saints Go Marching In, and his famous theme song Auld

Lang Syne, the song and sound that for a few minutes each year supplants "The Star Spangled Banner" as America's national anthem.

There are other songs, too, and, of course, there's a Lombardo medley. No evening would be complete without that. In this case, it's a "sing along" medley, and the audience enthusiastically joins right in, just as listeners to this album are sure to do.

As Louis Armstrong, a loyal Lombardo fan, once said, "They play music, good music. They can play anything, and everything they play is just about perfect." Maybe Louis didn't know it, but he was speaking for millions, millions who have spent "very special" evenings with Guy Lombardo and the band that has been one of America's favorites for more than twenty-five years.

This monophonic microgroove recording is playable on monophonic and stereo phonographs. It cannot become obsolete. It will continue to be a source of outstanding sound reproduction, providing the finest monophonic performance from any phonograph.
